# North Washington Street Bridge Replacement Project Update

# Temporary Bridge Being Added to Construction Project

The Massachusetts Department of Transportation (MassDOT) has announced that it is finalizing plans for the construction of a temporary bridge structure which will carry all modes of travel during work on its \$177 million project to replace the City of Bostonowned North Washington Street Bridge, which provides access for traffic over the Boston Inner Harbor between the North End and Charlestown.


Details are being finalized regarding the temporary bridge, which will likely be constructed beginning in 2019, and will help optimize the schedule of work and reduce the project duration by several months. The addition of the temporary bridge is not expected to impact the overall project budget.

The temporary bridge will be located next to the current bridge structure and will help promote reliable travel and minimize impacts to MBTA bus service. This will ensure that motorists have a minimum of three total travel lanes throughout the duration of the project, while providing access for bicyclists and pedestrians and reducing the need to rely on the existing bridge structure to carry traffic.

"We are committed to carrying out this major project and replacing this bridge structure in ways that minimize the impact on the traveling public and local communities," said Highway Administrator Gulliver. "By adding a temporary bridge to our construction process, we will ensure that

there are always at least three total lanes of travel available for vehicles as well as bicycle and pedestrian access, and we will help optimize the construction operations to reduce the overall duration of work."

"The City of Boston is pleased to join with our local, state and federal partners on this comprehensive plan that will expedite the rebuilding of the North Washington Street Bridge," said Boston Chief of Streets Chris Osgood. "With any construction project, we place a premium on ensuring residents are able to travel safely and efficiently around our city. We look forward to exchanging dialogue with our West End, Charlestown, and North End neighbors for the duration of the project."



The addition of this temporary bridge structure will help improve bridge demolition and construction operations, and eliminate the need to reduce traffic to one lane in each direction during demolition of the main span. Pedestrian and bicycle access will be maintained on

the temporary bridge, which will also mark and carry the historic Freedom Trail.

The existing playground in Paul Revere Park will need to be relocated prior to the addition of the temporary bridge.

# In Fourteen Hundred and Ninety-Two ...

As we pass one of the various milestones in our secular calendar and observe it with a presidential proclamation, I am frequently inclined to use the proclamation in my column. On Columbus Day, we commemorate the achievements of this skilled Italian explorer and recognize his courage, will power, and ambition — all values we cherish as Americans."

Notice how Mr. Trump acknowledges the great Italian navigator's role in (1) bringing two worlds, formerly unaware of the other's existence, into contact, (2) sparking humankind's greatest age of terrestrial discovery, and (3) displaying the courage, will power, and ambition which would come to characterize America.

"Columbus's spirit of determination and adventure has provided inspiration to generations of Americans. On Columbus Day, we honor his remarkable accomplishments as a navigator, and celebrate his voyage into the unknown expanse of the Atlantic Ocean. His expedition formed the initial bond between Europe and the Americas, and changed the world forever. Today, in that spirit, we continue to seek new horizons for greater opportunity and further discovery on land, in sea, and in space."

Mr. Trump draws the direct connection between Columbus' great voyage of discovery and (1) our subsequent exploration of every inch of soil of our home planet, (2) our amazing exploration of the deepest ocean, and (3) our Columbuslike boundless need to explore, which put man on the moon, men and women into space, and unmanned exploratory craft

millions of miles beyond where our frail bodies can go.

"Although Spain sponsored his voyage, Columbus was, in fact, a proud citizen of the Italian City of Genoa. As we celebrate the tremendous strides our Nation has made since his arrival, we acknowledge the important contributions of Italian Americans to our country's culture, business, and civic life. We are also thankful for our relationship with Italy, a great ally that shares our strong, unwavering commitment to peace and prosperity."

Next the President reminds us that (1) Columbus is widely celebrated in Colombia, the rest of South American, and in Central America, as opening the way for Spanish culture to enter the New World, which, when blended with native culture and other influences, grew into today's Hispanic culture which is celebrated September 15<sup>th</sup> - October 15<sup>th</sup> as National Hispanic Heritage Month. Mr. Trump (2) reminds of the many contributions the Italian Americans have made to our culture and he swears (3) "strong, unwavering commitment to peace and prosperity between the U.S. and the Italian Republic."

Not just the United States, but all of the Americas own a great deal to Columbus. That's why he is just one of three mortals honored with a federal holiday. The others are George Washington and Martin Luther King, Jr.

Left out of President Trump's Columbus Day Proclamation is anything remotely like what Barack Obama had to say in his final, 2016, Columbus Day Proclamation, which disparaged Columbus in these words ~ ~



### **POLITICAL AMBITION**

During these modern times, we think of ambition in connection with a strong desire for success, without giving too much thought to the origin of that word and its appropriateness when used in reference to politics. The Latin word "ambitio" or "ambitionis" means to go around, or to campaign by lawful means. "Ambitus" is probably more literally expressed in Latin as "a going about" and was generally associated with canvassing.

There was a time in ancient Rome when the "plebs" or com-

mon people established a distinct class of citizen. Because of the great increase in the number of plebs, it was necessary for political candidates to expend a considerable amount of time and effort to secure votes. Solicitation of votes, secret influence, and even bribery were resorted to in order that a candidate might secure his election to office and history reports evidence of some vague ground rules regarding lawful or unlawful means that might be used to secure those

A person seeking office was called a "pefitor" and he referred to his opponent as a "compeditor." These candidates "canditaoria" often appeared in public places dressed in white clothing "candor" which stood for sincerity and frankness. During these times, the candidate was accompanied by his friends, well-wishers, and financial supporters. One or more of others who assisted the candidate were called "nomenclators." The nomenclator's job was to identify those persons who were encountered so that the candidate could address them by name. This was considered a compliment, and never failed to impress the voter.

The usual handshake was called "prensatio," while treating the voter with feasts or entertainment was called "benignitas" or "benignum." Any money paid for votes was arranged under strict secrecy by persons called "interpretes," the loot was handled and/or held by "sequestres." and it was eventually distributed by "divisores."

# **Mayor Walsh Hosted Rally Supporting Immigrant Families**



On Monday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, Mayor Martin J. Walsh hosted a press conference with advocates, community members, partner organizations and elected officials to speak against the Trump Administration's change to the "public charge" provision, which would increase the number of government programs that count against an immigrant when applying for a visa or green card. The "public charge" provision, many believe, will put families' immigra-

tion status at risk if they use safety net public programs.

Boston has more than 194,000 foreign-born residents, accounting for 29 percent of the City's population. Naturalized citizens make up 46 percent of Boston's immigrant community.

The new public charge provision was recently published in the Federal Register and the comment period is open until Monday, December 10, 2018.

# **Boston Public Library Launches Wifi Hotspot Lending Program**

Boston Public Library announced today the launch of its mobile WiFi hotspot lending initiative, expanding free internet access to patrons beyond its 26 public service locations. Hotspots will be available to borrow at the Central Library and branches throughout the city; if all hotspots are checked out, adult patrons (18+) may place a hold via the online catalog for 21-day loan periods, just like a regular book.

Each WiFi hotspot kit contains a hotspot device, Micro USB cable, adapter, and instructions in English, Spanish, Chinese, Vietnamese, and Haitian Creole.

"Increasing the availability of high-speed internet, not only in public spaces but throughout the whole City, is a big part of our digital equity strategy," said Patricia Boyle-McKenna, Interim Chief Information Officer for the City of Boston. "We look forward to seeing the results of this one-year pilot program that will expand connectivity options throughout our neighborhoods and communities."

In April 2016, Mayor Martin J. Walsh announced a new partnership with Verizon that includes a state-of-the-art fiber-optic network platform across the city. Verizon included a \$100,000 Digital Equity contribution to the city to support a mobile hotspot-lending program.

T-Mobile is the provider of hotspot devices, and will provide technical support for the devices, and library staff will be available to assist patrons who need help placing a hold. Additional information for patrons is available on the WiFi FAQ page.

Magic! That word resonates like a sizzling charm on my lips. Everything involving magic fascinates me. I adore the Harry Potter books. One of my supreme guilty pleasures is the Hallmark film series The Good Witch, about a mysterious woman that moves to a quaint little town and improves the lives of the residents through her good-natured charms. My favorite Halloween costume is a witch's hat, sleek and mystical and classic. I think that works concerning magic so inspire me because it is a traditionally female-centric discipline. Moreover, my grandmothers brimmed with the stories, anecdotes and proverbs that can only derive from many years of hard-earned experience and wisdom. Nonna Luisa, my mother's mother, had a dog-eared and faded notebook

that. I always marveled at her ability to create traditional delicacies from memory, her hand trained by years in the embrace of family members cooking up their own recipes in their ancestral kitchens. In European villages of yore, including those in Italy, older women like my grandmothers were often looked upon as purveyors of folk remedies and magical cures. In Italy, this kind of folk practice sometimes goes under the name Benedicaria, a loose term for blessings and cures that combine Catholic tradition with older pre-Christian lore. Most Italians who know of folk remedies, however, would not call them by any particular name but rather acknowledge them as family tradition passed down through the ages. Yes, it seems that along with delicious recipes and holiday customs, magic is spread among many Italian families as well!

Many of the superstitions, charms and practices rooted in Italian folk history still leave an indelible mark on the culture today. My grandmother often spoke of malocchio, or evil eye — the old Mediterranean belief that a gaze of jealousy or anger can magically impart real harm on someone. A folkloric test to verify if you are indeed under the spell of malocchio involves dropping a dollop of olive oil into a plate of water. If the oil molds into one large circle in the middle of the water, it is a sure sign that you are cursed, though fortunately special rituals will cause the drop of oil to disperse and relieve the curse! Another amulet against the evil eye still sold in many Italian shops is the corno, or a charm made out of lucky red coral shaped like a horn. My grandmother full of loose-leaf recipes - not was always quick to remind well-defined guidelines, but me of a plethora of other Italian rather recipes depending on superstitions and customs that pinches of this and a little bit of reflect this folk tradition. Birds in the home are bad luck, for they symbolize death. Never spill olive oil, as it is a precious and unsurpassed staple of the Italian kitchen. Always bless bread by making a Cross on the dough before placing it in the oven. These customs offer a fascinating glimpse into the importance on nourishment, health and community amongst Italians. As symbols of Italian heritage and history, these nuggets of folklore further represent the ingenuity and values of our ancestors.

This time of the year, it is easy to think upon the supernatural. Halloween decorations like eerie glowing jack-o-lanterns and white-sheeted ghosts beckon at us from storefronts and doorways. Yellow and brown leaves swirl against a cloudy sky, and the howl of the wind calls to mind wailing spirits or mournful werewolves. Yet when we think of the most famous Halloween symbol of all, the witch, we should know that she is rooted in a complex history of folklore, feminine power, and cross-cultural traditions. In Italy as elsewhere in Europe, the people later maligned as witches were actually the folk healers and wise women of ancient villages. Many of the lore and practices surrounding these age-old traditions continue to be recognized and seen in Italy today. Therefore, with Halloween quickly upon us, it is right to think of the magical side of Italy as well. No wonder it has been called such a bewitching country!



# **The First Baptist Church**

### **Boston, Massachusetts**

Originating in Charlestown, Boston and Noddle Island more than a century before the singing of the Declaration of Independence, The First Baptist Church of Boston can trace its origins. The First Baptist community was indeed worshipping in Boston a mere 35 years after the founding of Boston in 1630, and eventually establishing its meeting house on what was then Back Street (now Stillman Street) in the city's North End — a site that would serve the religious community until 1679.

Only a few years later in 1771, First Baptist constructed a larger meeting house — a structure that would also house a British barracks and hospital as well as serve as the location of the founding of

the Massachusetts Missionary Society along with The Newton Theological School.

In 1829, yet another meeting house was constructed near Faneuil Hall (across form the Haymarket MBTA station,) serving the congregation until 1854, when a larger edifice was erected — a Gothic Revival building on Beacon Hill. This lasted for about a quarter of a century until the property was absorbed by expansion of the Massachusetts State House.

Then, in 1877, First Baptist located to another section of the city — this time on Shawmut Avenue, staying until 1882, where it finally moved to its present site — on the corner of Clarendon Street and Commonwealth Avenue in a stately and imposing structure designed by H.H. (Henry Hobson) Richardson. This building is built in the Romanesque Revival Style and is considered a "first" in fact, a prototype really due to its employment of varied architectural elements; as a result, one can refer to this structure as "fully" Richardson Romanesque!

Also significant in terms of architecture are the bell tower's



friezes, the sculptures that adorn the exterior of towards top of the Italianate structure. Earl Norman, a member of the congregation and a historian of the church explained that the friezes were designed by Frederic Auguste Bartholdi (whose claim to fame is sculpture of the Statue of Liberty.) The composition that adorns the top of the majestic tower is referred to as "Bartholdi" Angels." These "angels" may be familiar as they are personified from those of the world of politics, letters, and the arts, such as Abraham Lincoln, Guiseppe Garibaldi, Henry W. Longfellow, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Ralph Waldo Emerson, John LaFarge, and Bartholdi himself, respectively.

The First Baptist Church community has embarked on a program that will allow the church to continue serving those who find its sanctuary a place of worship on Sundays (as well as Wednesday night Bible Study.) Not only for those congregants who make First Baptist their spiritual home, but indeed, transients who often find themselves visiting the city and are looking for Sundays Services. The location is especially convenient for visitors, as the church is located just several feet from bustling Copley Square and Newbury Street.

As with any structure, and especially for one going back approximately 140 years, upkeep and maintenance is essential for its preservation. The church is currently involved in programs to continue to preserve such a historic and welcoming venue for its current and future congregation as well as for the myriad of visitors that come to historic Boston.

# Saint Mary Frances of the Five Wounds of Jesus

Saint Mary Frances was born Anna Maria Gallo, the daughter of Francesco Gallo and Barbara Basinsin, in the Quartieri Spagnoli (Spanish Quarter) of Naples. Her father, a weaver of gold lace, was a very violent man, who regularly abused his family physically, often severely.

When Anna Maria was sixteen years old, her father sought to force her into a marriage with a young man of means but she firmly refused, and instead asked permission to enter the Third Order of St. Francis. This request was at length granted her through the influence of Father Theophilus, a Friar Minor.

Anna Maria was received into the Order on September 8, 1731 and began wearing the religious habit of the Order, which was an uncommon practice by that era. She also adopted the use of the religious name Mary Frances. She continued to live in the family home to serve God as a consecrated virgin, as was customary in those days.

Mary Frances became known among her neighbors for her charitable work among the poor. She was a person of deep prayer, often spending long hours in meditation. She imposed upon herself voluntary penances, strict fasts, hair-shirts, and disciplines. Her prayers and advice saved many souls. Priests and religious went to her for counsel. Her charity and compassion, especially toward the afflicted and poor knew no bounds.

In 1753, she joined with another Franciscan tertiary, known only as Maria Felice, and they moved into a small house owned by a priest, Giovanni Pessiri, who became their spiritual director. She is said to have received the wounds of the stigmata while living there and suffered patiently many physical afflictions and spiritual trials. She would wear gloves to cover the marks on her hands, while she did her work. She is also said to have had visions of Saint Raphael the Archangel. Mary Frances resided at that house for 38 years till she passed away. She was buried in the church of the Lucia del Monte, at Naples, which contains the tomb of St. John Joseph of the Cross. She was canonized by Pope Pius IX on June 29, 1867. The feast of Saint Mary Frances of the Five Wounds of Jesus is celebrated on October 6th.

# Nicolina "Nellie" Martignetti

Celebrates 100th Birthday

Nicolina "Nellie" Martignetti was born to Italian parents in Portsmouth, Virginia on October 10, 1918. She is the oldest child, and had nine younger brothers and sisters (one of whom — a sister, Gloria — passed away from diphtheria as an infant). Very soon after she was born, Nellie's family relocated to Charter Street in the North End of Boston. When they first arrived, neither parent had a job lined up, but her father was eventually able to secure work in the city. Nellie's family moved to Endicott Street and became devoted parishioners of St. Mary's church; she attended St. Mary's School, and graduated from eighth grade there. Due to her family's frequent trips back and forth to Italy, Nellie had to repeat first grade, did not graduate eighth grade until age sixteen, and never attended high school.

In 1937, in the midst of the Great Depression when Franklin D. Roosevelt was the President of the United States, Nellie got a job sewing leather suitcases on "power sewing machines" in Charlestown. She got the job through the city of Boston as part of a program that Roosevelt began, and was extremely fortunate to have obtained it, as there were very few jobs available at the time. Her father made \$20 a week, and Nellie was responsible for making the rest to support her family.

Nellie met her husband - whose last name also happened to be Martignetti! — through her sister-in-law, who acted as matchmaker. Nellie used to shop in her future sister-in-law's grocery store in the North End, and one day, the woman asked Nellie if she had a boyfriend. When Nellie said no, her future sister-in-law then asked if she wanted to accompany her to Italy to meet her brother. Nellie and her husband, a shoemaker, were married in Italy in a double-wedding with her sister-in-law, and moved back to the North End, this time to North Bennett Street, where she would reside for forty years. They had one daughter together, Alberinda (who they called Albie), and two grandchildren, Peter and Noelle.

Nicolina now resides at the North End Rehabilitation & Healthcare Center, where she



just celebrated her 100th birthday. We love you, Nellie — here's to many more!

### Fun Facts about Nellie

Her favorite food is Italian of course. Her favorite singer is Frank Sinatra, she does not have a favorite color. Her secret to making it to 100 is taking the stairs (she lived in a fourth floor walk-up and took the stairs multiple times a day, every day, and walking a lot. Nellie got her nickname from her two Irish neighbors who did not like the name Nicolina. She's happiest when doing housework or cleaning tables at Bailey's Ice Cream Parlor!

# Nanna & Babbononno

A Nostalgic Remembrance



In two days, on the 21st, I will turn 80!!! If I had known I was going to live this long, I would have taken better care of myself. Throughout my entire life, I have heard people say the words, "Growing old gracefully." I really do not know what that means other than two possible explanations: 1. Experiencing good health, and 2. being happy.

Good health is partly within our control during our lives. Just the other night, I was sitting with a couple of friends and we were discussing old pals that are now gone. On my end, a couple of old and dear buddies left us due alcohol abuse. Another two or three left us due to not listening to their doctors and not following orders in regard to what meds to take for particular physical problems or illnesses. When the conversation switched to "being happy," we all agreed that not being happy, as a state of mind, can shorten one's life. I thought about an acquaintance, a man I once had as a student. We've remained friends throughout the years and I still see him now and then. He is never happy. In his mind, there is always an insurmountable problem that he has to deal with. There is always something wrong with his mother, his wife or his kids. I've discovered that some of his fears that make him unhappy are not real and are designed by his imagination which seems to work with negativities at the forefront almost always. As a result, my friend's health has been compromised. Worry, real or imagined can take its toll on a person. My friend is a lot younger than I, but looks and acts like an old man, an image I

refuse to accept for myself. In terms of being happy, I remember an incident that I observed when I was a kid. It was Easter and the entire family was at Nanna and Babbononno's for the traditional family dinner. After dinner, the ladies were congregated in the kitchen and the men in the living room sipping cognac and smoking cigars. We kids, my cousins and I, were playing a game and on the living room floor. For whatever reason, I looked up at Babbononno. He was sitting on his favorite easy chair, with his thumbs pushing out his suspenders as he observed his grandchildren. There was a subtle smile on his face as he muttered the following words, "Questo e il motivo per cui sono venuto in America." (This is why I came to America) I didn't know at the time what he meant and

dismissed his statement, but I remembered the words, and have discovered in my senior years what they mean.

Fast forwarding things to just a few years ago, I experienced the same phenomenon at the home of a friend, Sal DiDomenico, not the senator, his father. We had been invited to their house for dinner and afterward, the future senator and his sisters, all young kids at the time, were playing together and Sal Senior was sitting like the Cheshire cat, smiling and observing things with his hands folded on his chest. He turned to me and said, "Seeing them happy like this, makes all of the effort to get to this point in life seem worthwhile". Then I remembered a point in time about a year before my father passed away, so I guess it was around 1980. It was a holiday and Loretta and I had the family over for dinner. After dinner, both of my sons, John and Michael were on the living room floor playing with their toys and I observed my fatherin-law and my father. They both sat on the couch, hands folded across their chests watching the kids with subtle smiles on their faces. They turned to look at each other, and when they did, both nodded in the affirmative, understanding that this was the next generation and they were partly responsible for who and what they were and would become. Unfortunately, neither would live to see the finished products.

Well last Sunday, it was my turn. Son John and my daughter-in-law, Beth, decided to celebrate my granddaughter, Lina's second birthday with a party on that day, as most of Beth's family were able to come in from New York and Loretta and I were free from any obligation. Beth's parents were there as well as her father's brother and wife. Her sister and her sister's family were there as well as a couple of her childhood friends.

From our side came my brother-in-law, Mike, Loretta's brother, and his wife, Lin, several of son John's boyhood pals and their families, and of course, Loretta and yours truly. The only one not able to attend was my son, Michael. He was performing in Oregon, and not able to get back in time. The seven course sit down Italian dinner had been replaced by a buffet table set up with all sorts of American food. We socialized with Beth's family and I had lengthy conversations with the boys that grew up with my sons.

They are now men in their thirties and were there with their wives and kids. The reason I knew them so well is that my house was the catch all for my sons' friends when they were youngsters.

At one point, after the candles were blown out on the birthday cake and Beth was helping Lina open her presents with all the kids surrounding her, I sat back on the easy chair I had chosen as a vantage point to observe things. My hands were folded across my chest and I guess I developed that same Cheshire cat look on my face. No one noticed except my brother-inlaw, Mike. He was sitting near me and leaned over and whispered, "Is this your kingdom?" I looked over at him and just smiled. He understood my smile and just nodded.

A while later, I sat by myself on John's back porch, and with no one around, I lit a cigar, sipped a bit of coffee from my mug and conjured up flashback memories, the ones I described above from my generation, my folks generation and my grandparents generation. I realized, at that point, that I was now the old timer, a member of the senior generation, in that all members of both grandparents' and parents' generations are gone.

I don't know if my granddaughter, Lina, will remember this gathering that celebrated her birthday, but the essence of it will help solidify her sense of family and friends for the future. I say this because I remember my second birthday party and how happy I was with all my family members surrounding me and my cousins and friends helping me to celebrate. So, I can now look at the big picture and say, if they were to call me Babbononno, I would be as proud as my Babbononno was, oh so many years ago.

One is fiction, and is about the Boston underworld back during Prohibition and the other will be called Nanna and Babbononno, and is a takeoff on almost 28 years of this column. ### NONNA MARY'S LIVER AND ONION

1 pound calf's liver

pepper and set aside.

1 large onion 3 tablespoons olive, canola or 3 tablespoons white or red wine 1/4 cup flour

vegetable oil Salt and pepper

On a cutting board, cut up liver into one-inch portions and place in a bowl. Sprinkle flour over the liver and stir so that all portions of liver are coated with flour. Sprinkle liver with salt and

Remove outer skin from onion. Cut onion in half lengthwise.

Cut into ¼-inch strips lengthwise. Set aside in a separate bowl. Heat oil in skillet before placing liver into skillet. Stir to prevent sticking. Continue frying and stirring over medium heat until all portions of liver brown lightly. Add onion strips and stir thoroughly. Cover and fry over medium/low heat about five minutes. Check frequently to prevent sticking to skillet.

Meanwhile, in a cup, add three tablespoons of water to three tablespoons of wine of choice. When onion becomes opaque, add wine and water mixture to skillet. Stir thoroughly and cover. Allow contents to simmer slowly for a minute. Stir, cover and remove from burner.

As Halloween is approaching, let's consider the famous, albeit gruesome, case of James Allen. In the 1800s this goon robbed people on Boston highways. Spending most of his time collecting other people's possessions on horseback, he dubbed himself the Highwayman. Reportedly, thieves on horseback had more social status than thieves on foot. Who kept that social register? Anyway, the Highwayman spent a lot of time in jail. Once he was released, he went right back to his old tricks.

One day, this ruffian finally met his match. When attempting to rob John Fenno of Spring-field, the Highwayman was quite surprised when Fenno refused to hand over his wallet. Fenno clocked the Highwayman upside the head instead. The two men fell to the ground and wrestled each other. The Highwayman pulled out a gun and fired at Fenno's midsection. A buckle on Fenno's suspender deflected the bullet and he continued pummeling the Highwayman. Despite Fenno's Killer Kowalski like grappling moves, the Highwayman managed to escape. It will be relocated within the park, further west towards the North Bank Bridge. This new community asset will be rebuilt with improved amenities and will be located further from the construction zone.

A series of public meetings in Charlestown, the North End, and the West End, will be held to inform the public about the details of this construction plan. More details about these meetings will be provided as they are finalized. Members of the public are encouraged to visit the project website at https://www.mass.gov/ north-washington-street-bridgereplacement to sign up for email notices of these meetings.

This month, utility operations began through this project, and in spring 2019, MassDOT will begin the significant construction operations. The bridge is a critical link in the MBTA bus network, providing passage for several Haymarket destined bus routes from the north including the 92, 93, 111, and 426. MassDOT and the MBTA have been in close coordination and every effort is being made to minimize the travel time delays for these routes. MassDOT has also re-sequenced other projects including work to repair the Tobin Bridge to better accommodate public transit customers.

Construction is currently expected to be completed in 2023, and the full scope of work includes replacing the existing structurally deficient bridge, providing multi-modal amenities including widened sidewalks, separated bicycle lanes, and bus rapid transit lanes, increasing intersection safety and capability, and improving the navigation channel.

This project is being carried out to improve the functionality of the bridge and ensure reliable travel throughout this area. This bridge is 118 years old and carries intercity vehicles as well as local MBTA bus, shuttle, and tour bus routes. The bridge is currently safe for travel, but is nearing the end of its usable life cycle.

### Knowing When to Call it Quits

It's hard to walk away when you are on top. Ask any gambler if they wished they had quit when they were ahead and they will give you excuses. They will tell you they were going for just one more poker pot or winning race horse instead of taking their winnings and stepping away from the table or betting window.

Celebrities deal with the same affliction. Many stay way beyond their best years, and who can blame them. Living in the glow of public adoration is intoxicating. When you live your life as a public figure you give up a lot of freedom, but fame has its perks and those perks are very hard to give up. Walking away from it all, especially when on top, is almost impossible for most humans.

In the world of sports it is even more difficult as old age comes much sooner to an athlete than a thespian, and what athlete wants to admit he's getting old? It is also painful to watch a once great athlete when he his losing his abilities. Willie Mays retired after game two of the 1973 World Series when it became apparent to him that he no longer could make the great catches he was famous for. In baseball it can be embarrassing for a player to no longer be able to play at the level he once did, but at least they don't run the risk of incurring brain damage or even death. It's a different story in boxing.


For a professional prize fighter, even a slight deterioration in skill usually translates into taking more punches, and more blows means more trauma to the head. Even with the high price of continuing on past their best years, the majority of champs stayed on much too long. The greatest example of this was Muhammad Ali who ended up with severe brain damage from years fighting after his skills had greatly eroded. In interviews filmed with him before his bout against Larry Holmes you can see and hear the signs of the damage that had already been done. He is slurring his speech, a sure sign of brain damage. Yet, he continued to fight. Ali just could not walk away from the bright lights.

When it came to the heavyweight champions, very, very few quit while they were ahead. Only four have retired as champion and then not made a comeback. That's a very small percentage of men who were able to walk away from the glory. They were the smart ones. They also showed tremendous will, an attribute that is usually cited when describing a fighter's greatness in the ring. These four men managed to carry that quality into their decisions about their futures.

Gene Tunney was on top of the world after defeating Jack Dempsey for the second time in the famous Long Count fight in Chicago in 1927. Tunney received a check for a million dollars after the fight. He did want a third fight with Dempsey in order to erase any claims that he would have been counted out had Dempsey not gone to a neutral corner. A third fight would have also reaped an astronomical payday for both fighters.

Dempsey declined the fight out of concern for damage that had been done to his eyes and a fear he might cause permanent damage to his vision. While Dempsey was not walking away while on top, he was still quitting while he was ahead.

Tunney went on to have one more fight, taking on challenger Tom Heeney whom he kayoed, and then announced his retirement never to step in to the prize ring again. Tunney walked away with his brain intact and his bank account in great shape. Tunney also defeated every man he faced, avenging his only loss to Harry Greb. He was the first heavyweight champion to retire without having lost his title in the ring. Joe Louis would do the same when he retired after beating Jersey



Joe Walcott in 1948. And, like Tunney, Louis beat every man he had ever faced, knocking out Max Schmeling in a rematch against the only man who had beaten him. Unfortunately, because of financial hardships, Louis would return to the ring where he lost in an effort to regain his crown against Ezzrad Charles, and then finally was kayoed by Rocky Marciano. If it hadn't been for his money problems, Louis most likely would have been one of the lucky ones to have stayed retired.

Rocky Marciano is another fine example of a champion who was able to walk away while on top. After defeating Archie Moore in his 6<sup>th</sup> title defense, the Brockton Blockbuster hung up his gloves. He record was 49 wins against no losses. This made him the only heavyweight champion to retire having never tasted defeat in the professional ring, a record that still stands.

There are many reasons to admire Rocky Marciano. He was one of the greatest heavyweights of all time there is no doubt about that. He had an iron will, was always in incredible condition, gave his all in every fight, and carried himself with the dignity of a true champion. I would add to these attributes his ability to make the decision to walk away while on top and while still healthy. It couldn't have been easy for him, and it was just another example of his willpower. If only others had followed his example.

Two other champs who came along later also called it quits while holding the crown. Neither was in the class of greatness as Tunney and Marciano, but both displayed that ability to not overstay their time of fame. Lennox Lewis and Vitali Klitschko both left the professional prize ring after having made winning defenses of the title. Lewis joins Tunney as one who defeated every man he faced. He avenged his two losses and one draw. Of course, Marciano still stands as the only champ to have never lost.

I think back to fighters such as Muhammad Ali, Floyd Patterson, Ingemar Johansson, and Joe Louis, fighters who all would have very possibly been spared from the damage boxing inflicts on the brain had they only retired sooner. It is a shame they had not been able to do what these Tunney, Marciano, Klitschko, and Lewis did.

There are many things that go into being a great fighter, knowing when to call it quits is one.

# HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

A pair of college hockey teams expected to do well got off a slow start out of the starting gates on opening weekend as both Boston University and Boston College failed to notch a victory as action commenced of the 2018-2019 season.

Boston University opened at Minnesota State where a pair of setbacks prevented new head coach Albie O'Connell from picking up his first victory behind the Terriers bench.

In the first matchup of the two-game series Minnesota State came from behind to capture a 4-3 victory while in the second contest the next day MSU skated to a 5-3 triumph, meaning there was a long plane ride back from the Midwest to the Hub for the Terriers.

The Terriers entered the series ranked as Top 10 team nationally but dropped to number 13 following the setbacks. The high point for BU in the opening contest was its penalty kill. The Terriers were a perfect 7 for 7 on the penalty kill, keeping the Mavericks off the scoreboard for the 31 minutes in which they had the man advantage.

The next night MSU jumped out to a 3-0 lead and never looked back as it completed the sweep of the series. The game featured a complete opposite of the night before. This time it was MSU's turn to excel on the penalty kill and the Mavericks did just that, shutting out the Terriers on their five power play opportunities, including one that spanned five minutes.

While the Terriers were battling the Mavericks in Minnesota, Boston College was facing as stiff challenge in Wisconsin, facing the Badgers on their home ice.

When the two game series had concluded the results were much the same with Wisconsin claiming a 3-0 shutout victory in the opener and a 7-5 triumph in the closing contest.

David Cotton provided the highlight of the weekend for BC with a hat trick as part of a four-point night. But it was not enough so BC also enters the second weekend of the college hockey season looking for its first victory.


Both series were games against non-Hockey East opponents so the Eagles and Terriers are still 0-0 after their season opening road trips.

— Everyone associated with the Bruins continues to be amazed with the play of David Pastrnak, the young forward who showed up at the Bruins Development camp as an underweight teenager several summers ago with the stated goal of making it big in the National Hockey League.

In truth, he almost made the team right there and then but Peter Chiarelli, the Bruins GM at the time, thought the better of it, and assigned his prize find to Providence. But that was then and this is now — a time of highlight goals and "did he really do that?" performances that have caught the eyes of hockey fans throughout the National Hockey League.

In what could be taken as an understated reference, Bruins Head Coach Bruce Cassidy

stated: "Well, listen, he's growing up." But the coach meant Pasta's entire game, not just the highlight reel aspect that dazzles the crowds.

"He's trying to get everyone involved and that's part of being a good teammate. When he had a turnover, he really hustled back. Parts of his game are growing and his shot is too. Last year he had some great one-timer goals but this year he seems to be even more on with it. I like the fact that he's trying to keep everyone involved in those plays and trying to be a good team player as well as a good 200-foot (length of hockey rink) player. It shows he trying to grow his game and that's what all good players do."

As for Pastrnak himself, he says that he is enjoying every moment: "I'm glad I get to be a part of this and am enjoying every moment of playing here. I just go out, play hockey, and enjoy every moment on the ice. I try to get better with every practice and every game. I love the game and am not focusing on if I'm going to score or not. I'm just having fun. Plus, it is always better to play at our home rink."

And the man who the Bruins pay to stop goals also has some insights on Pastrnak: "He's kind of sneaky," noted B's goalie Tuukka Rask. "He just gets the puck and winds up and you don't think too much about it. But then once he picks up speed at the red line and the defensemen get stuck standing still just a little bit, then the next thing you know...He's not even in a danger area from a goaltender standpoint but then that quick backhand or forehand and it's top shelf. It's a tough shot to stop. It's fun to watch for sure."

And what about that shot? "it's crazy. I mean his shot is unbelievable," exclaimed Ryan Donato, who joined the Bruins last spring fresh out of Harvard. "He doesn't really need that much time or space. His shot was on fire in the Detroit game."

Donato added, "He's just learning new things and learning strategies of the game that help him to score more goals. Defensively, he's getting a lot better as well. He's the perfect example of a guy that listens to coaches, who has his ups and downs but finally when he's got it all figured out he's really successful. He's done a great job and he's going to continue to do a great job."
