## **New Waste Disposal Ban Regulations**

Focus on Reducing Trash Disposal and Fostering Business Growth

tion announced that new waste ban regulations that promote recycling and re-use, reduce trash disposal, and foster recycling business growth took effect on, November 1, 2022. The new regulations will ban the disposal of mattresses and textiles in the trash, as well as decrease food waste from businesses and institutions. Massachusetts currently has a food waste ban on businesses disposing one ton or more per week, and these regulations lower that threshold to a halfton per week.

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) established a ban on disposal of food waste from businesses and institutions disposing of one ton or more per week in 2014, which increased food waste diversion from 100,000 tons per year to more than 300,000

The Baker-Polito Administra- tons per year, while also creat- Affairs Secretary Beth Card. ing hundreds of new jobs and increasing the gross state product by \$77 million. Despite this progress, food waste still represents more than one-fifth of the trash we dispose of. Lowering the threshold from one ton to a half-ton per week aims to continue Massachusetts' progress in this area. An estimated 4,000 businesses will be subject to the new threshold. Fortunately, Massachusetts businesses are well on their way to compliance as more than 3,500 businesses already participated in a food waste collection program in

"In order to meet the important goals outlined in the 2030 Solid Waste Master Plan, the Baker-Polito Administration has focused on reducing waste disposal, while also increasing recycling, diversion, reuse, and composting measures," said Energy and Environmental

"These regulations and the supporting strategies that are being implemented today will continue our nation-leading efforts and jump-start waste diversion work that is occurring across the Commonwealth."

MassDEP has supported the food waste ban by providing grants to businesses establishing or expanding capacity to manage food waste, including anaerobic digestion and composting operations. MassDEP also recently announced a new grant offering to invest in expanding the infrastructure for collecting food waste, mattresses, and textiles. Additionally, MassDEP supports business waste reduction, recycling, and composting initiatives through the RecyclingWorks in Massachusetts program. This program, which is fully

## Stirpe Nostra

#### **NERO'S FIASCO**



Chariot racing, Sport in ancient Rome, Sport in antiquity, chariot races Sala della Biga, Vatican.

Nero always thought that he possessed a God-given voice. The only thing that he didn't know was that God had scheduled it to be given to a man named Pavarotti about 1.900 vears later. Nevertheless, he made his debut in a theater at Naples, and the performance was disrupted by a sudden earthquake shock, indicating that even God was displeased. During all of his later performances in Naples, the house was packed with persons who were paid to applaud. He also toured some of the singing contests in the Greek provinces. His performances were greeted with great applause in burlesque fashion. This caused him to declare that the Greeks were the only ones who had an ear for music and that they, alone, were worthy of his efforts.

When he was singing, no one was allowed to leave the theater for any reason. It is said that some women even gave birth there. The gates were closed and guarded. Consequently, those who were more athletically inclined leaped from the walls to escape, while others faked death and had to be carried out as if to be buried. In an effort to erase the memory of some of the great singers of

that day, he had their statues or busts thrown down, dragged off with hooks, and cast into the public privies.

Nero also had visions of becoming an Olympic champion. He appeared at the 211th Olympiad with 5,000 attendants. The main purpose of the attendants was to cheer him on to victory in the chariot race. No one dared to oppose him, but even as the sole entry, he fell off his chariot, had to be assisted back on board, and still couldn't finish the race.

It should come as no surprise that he was declared the winner by a jury that would not have voted any other way. Upon his departure, he presented the entire province with their freedom and conferred Roman citizenship on the judges along with a large sum of money. He returned from his Olympic fiasco by first entering Naples through a breach in the wall in the manner of returning Olympic champions in ancient Greece. He then entered Rome in like manner, except that he rode in the chariot that Augustus had used in his triumphs of bygone days. He wore a purple robe with gold stars, and on his head he wore the Olympic crown — a wreath of sacred olive leaves. A massive parade led through the Circus Maximus, then through the "Porta Triumphalis," and on through the Forum Magnum Romanum to the Temple of Apollo, where our great hero laid a wreath at the foot of the temple and gave thanks to his gods once again, exactly as it was done by the Olympic champions in ancient Greece. All along the route, prisoners were slain as human sacrifices to this champion of champions. The path of his triumphal parade was sprinkled with perfume, while applause and honors were showered upon him. It follows then, that the shame and the sham of Nero, one of the most pathetic fiascoes that the sports world has ever known, was honored by probably the greatest victory parade that this same world will ever see.

funded by MassDEP, is run under contract by the Center for Eco Technology. Through RecyclingWorks, Massachusetts businesses receive free assistance to manage any waste they generate, including the new banned materials.

Textiles represent another important opportunity for Massachusetts to reduce the waste stream and capture valuable resources. Each year, the Commonwealth throws out more than 200,000 tons of textiles in the trash. This includes old clothing, as well as other things like towels, linens, and even bags, belts, and shoes. Fortunately, Massachusetts has an extensive collection infrastructure of both non-profit and for-profit textile recovery organizations that can find a new use for these materials, either through selling or donating for reuse, or recycling into products such as carpet padding, insulation, or wiping rags.

"Recovering textiles is an excellent opportunity for our cities and towns to reduce trash disposal from their residents at the same time as they get paid for the valuable textiles that they recover," said MassDEP Commissioner Martin Suuberg. "We are pleased to partner with this burgeoning industry to remove these valuable materials from the waste stream and put them back to work."

Mattresses are a difficult material to manage at solid waste facilities and take up a large amount of space in landfills. More than 75 percent of mattresses can be effectively separated and recycled, including metal, wood, fabric, and padding. Massachusetts has established a statewide mattress recycling contract that includes five recycling companies that can serve Massachusetts municipalities that establish mattress recycling programs to serve their residents. MassDEP has provided grants to several of those companies, as well as other Massachusetts-based mattress recyclers, to increase the capacity to manage mattresses, as well as to create new job opportunities. Massachusetts generates approximately 600,000 unwanted mattresses per year, about 200,000 of them from residents, with the rest coming from businesses and institutions. MassDEP has provided grants to help establish mattress recycling programs in 137 municipalities.

A U.S. Senate race in New Hampshire is now being seen as a toss up in the GOP quest to regain control of the U.S. Senate. Recently, though, it has been reported by CNN that the Senate Leadership Fund announced it would pull back over \$5 million in ad buys from the Senate race between General Don Bolduc, R-NH, and U.S. Senator Maggie Hassan, D-NH. The biggest issue up in the Granite State is Social

Security and Medicare, and both candidates are getting hot and heavy over this issue,

The news about the GOP pulling ad monies in this race has not stopped the Boldoc campaign from pressing forward with its campaign strategy right up until November 8th. "General Bolduc has defied the naysayers from the beginning and that's the same approach he is going to take through the finish line to victory," Kate Constantini, a Bolduc for Senate spokesperson, told media sources recently.

#### Affordable Housing for Chelsea

A local nonprofit is transforming the site of an old industrial building in the downtown area of Chelsea into homes for local families. The Neighborhood Developers recently began construction of the new 5-story building at 25 Sixth Street near Bellingham Square. When done, it will yield 62 mixed-income rentals and ownership units, all of them at affordable prices.

The \$3.5 million project, which is being undertaken with significant State and Federal financing. It is right next door to the Silver Line Station and steps from City Hall. Chelsea City Manager Tom Ambrosio said the development is "an exceptionally beneficial project for the city."

#### L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

November, A Month Like No Other

I first noticed the commercials a few days before Halloween. Ads for layaway deals in bigbox stores began to pepper my television viewing experiences, replete with images of smiling Santa's, rolling ornaments and the sound of chattering jingle bells. Whenever one of these commercials caught my eve, a familiar, tingling sense of anticipation crept over me as I thought of the pleasures of the holiday season: swirling snowflakes, cookies baking in the oven, Christmas carols on the radio, potato latkes on sale for Hanukkah, trees illuminated with dozens of twinkling lights. However, I soon brought myself back to reality. I looked outside at the last yellow leaves drifting down from bare branches, the cornstalks and pumpkins decorating neighborhood homes. Halloween may be over, but we still have the whole month of November to enjoy! It is very tempting to dive into the pleasures of the holiday season early on, but the pulsating rhythms of the seasons and their unique feast days are meant to be experienced slowly, spiced with the trifecta of time, nature and mindfulness. This desire to live the seasons to their fullest proves especially palpable in November. Rather than a mere segue to the frenzied month of December, November boasts its own fascinating customs and traditions. As a month which signaled the end of the harvest and ushered in the beginning of winter, Italians honor the many faces of November, and their insights can help us appreciate this time for its singular delights.



At times, November can appear to be a somber month. sober and silent. Its skies are thick gray blankets outlined by bare, black branches. Dead leaves collect in clumps across the wet ground. Night wraps its dark cloak around the Earth early in the evening, uninterrupted by the colorful holiday lights that start to appear much later in the month. Winter feels imminent as the first bewildered snowflakes spiral down from the slate-colored sky. This is the month when nature settles into a nap, slumbering until its rebirth in the spring. Old Italian proverbs, hailing from the days of a primarily agricultural society, speak of the month's chilly, bleak characteristics. A dictum stating "Per Ognissanti, mantello e quante" reminds Italians to start putting on their coats and gloves on All Saints' Day, or November 1st. Another maxim, "Per Santa Caterina, la neve si avvicina," warns that snow looms close around the time of November 25th, the feast day of St. Catherine. Some may find this transitional state of November, caught between the harvest of the autumn and the desolation of winter, downright dreary. However, I believe it perfectly fits the nature of the month. November was the month of Samhain for the ancient Celts, a month to honor

the dead. It is befitting that the weather should match ponderous ruminations on mortality and life. I find November the perfect time to devote myself to solitude and tranquility, to recharge my energy before the hectic holiday season.

However, November also contains another side, one of warmth, family and festivity. In Italy, November marked the end of the harvest. To celebrate this occasion, villages across the country held communal feasts in order to enjoy the results of Earth's bounty. Oftentimes, these feasts became attached to particular saints' days. St. Martin's Day, or San Martino in Italian, occurs on November 11th and features banquets of goose, chestnuts, and the year's new wine. In fact, these foods feature in a notable Italian St. Martin's Day proverb: "Oca, castagne e vino per festeggiare San Martino!" Another feast, St. Andrew's Day, or Sant'Andrea, on November 30th, traditionally contained feasts of pork, commemorated in an Italian aphorism which states: "Da Sant'Andrea del maiale venticinque giorni a Natale." This proverb not only reminds Italians of the customary pork dishes on St. Andrew's Day, but also speaks of the fact that Christmas is twenty-five days away! Here in the United States, Thanksgiving beckons us into the comforts of family and friends, of heartwarming reunions and copious food to share. The stores brimming with boughs of holly and jolly elves tease the goodwill and

## Saint Clarus of Vienn by Bennett Molinari and Richard Molinari

The date and place of Saint Clarus' birth is uncertain but thought to be in the early ninth century somewhere in the United Kingdom or near Vienne in the Dauphiné area of Gaul (France). 



A Nostalgic Remembrance



Now that Halloween is over it's time to think of Thanksgiving. But, before I start writing stories about that American holiday, I have to tell you the first time I ever experienced a hurricane. It was late August in 1954. My folks, Nanna, Babbononno and a childhood chum, Carl Sinatra, were at the family cottage in Winthrop, Maine. It was the tail end of the summer and Carl and I were doing everything we could to prolong the fun we had had all month. Being an only child, Dad often let me invite a friend to spend time with us at the Maine cottage. Carl and I worked together at the Seville Theater and we often "hung around" together. Dad knew his father from his own high school days and had no problem with me inviting Carl for the last couple of weeks of the season.

Carl was a personable type and my summer friends soon became his friends. A couple of summer residents from Lewiston, Maine had sons just a little older than we were. and to Dad's consternation, the boys taught Carl and me how to ride their motorcycles. My father was worried when we headed out on the backs of the bikes during the day, but wouldn't let us go motorcycle riding at night. What neutralized this were the two daughters of another summer family. Carl and I would walk them to town, take them to a local hangout called McNamera's ... a Maine version of Arnold's from Happy Days. We were more interested in teenage girls than Harley Davidsons. Quite often, someone would pick us as we walked back. Most of the folks on Memorial Drive, the main drag on the east side of Lake Maranacook knew who we were and would stop us at night with, "You yung folks want a ride back to the uttha end of thah lake." We usually accepted.

Around the 28th or 29th of August, Dad had heard that a storm was coming up the east coast. He told Carl and me to take the speedboat, head to the public landing at the edge of town with several empty gas cans, one or two for gasoline and the others for kerosene. He wanted to be prepared. If the electricity went out as we had old-fashioned kerosene lamps for emergencies. If trees were knocked down and we couldn't get to town by car, we would have extra gas for the boat and not be stranded.

Babbononno didn't like the speedboat and wouldn't ride in it. If he wanted to take his chances on the lake, we had a rowboat that he could use. The speedboat was exactly that. It was built for racing, held 4 people and was powered by a 50-horse power Mercury race engine, when 50-horse power was real horsepower. Carl and I took care of the chores and forgot about the storm. Well, that night at McNamera's, it was just the two of us; we met two girls around our ages. They and their families were staying at a place at the opposite end of the lake. We were invited to their cottage the next day and Dad dropped us off before taking Mom shopping. Carl and I walked down a winding road and stopped at a closed wrought iron gate. There was a call box on a pole and we buzzed and announced ourselves. Seconds later, the gate swung open. When we arrived at the cottage, it was a two level lake front mansion Carl and I looked at each other and didn't know what to do. We rang the bell and were let in by a lady who announced us to the girls. After we said hello, I innocently asked if the lady who opened the door was their mother. It was the maid. Carl and I looked at each other again, knowing we were in over our heads. The girls turned out to be the daughters of one of the owners of Montgomery Ward, a department store located in the Chicago area. We were treated to lunch by the girls and we chatted much of the afternoon. When it was time to leave, we all jumped into one of their cars and a man in a black suit, bow tie and a captain's cap got behind the wheel. Carl asked if this was their father and the girls told him that he was their father's driver. We were really in over our heads. When we were dropped off at our cottage, the girls invited us back the following day to hang out and swim at their place. We accepted.

The next day, Dad was listening to the radio about the storm. We didn't have a TV at the cottage and the only news came over one of the few central Maine stations. Carl and I didn't wait for the midday weather forecast. We jumped into the speedboat and headed in the direction of the Montgomery Ward family summer place. We got about fifty yards out from our cottage and headed to the right. The wind was rather strong and to combat it I squeezed the throttle to pick up speed. It didn't work. Again, I tried to pick up speed, but by the time I had the throttle wide open, I was going backward due to the wind.

Just then, we saw Dad on the dock waiving and we waived back. I thought he was seeing us off, but he was trying to waive us in. We eventually had to beach the boat and drag it along the shoreline back to our cottage. By then Babbononno had joined Dad on the dock and both of them were yelling at us, Dad in English and Babbononno in Italian.

It seems that the storm was a hurricane named Carol and it was hitting central Maine with full force. We didn't know and the only thing that saved us was the need to secure anything that wasn't nailed down. Dad had dragged the rowboat onto our beach and told me to do the same with the speedboat. We put the firewood in the shed, brought the axe and outdoor tools from the back of the cottage and put them into a container attached to the side of the cottage and closed the shutters to protect the windows.

The storm hit hard, but we survived. There was no damage to the cottage. But, when I looked out at the beach

area, my boats were missing. I thought the choppy surf might have carried them out into the middle of the lake. We walked onto the beach and discovered that the boats were there, just buried with sand.

After a careful examination of the cottage, we knew we were lucky; no damage what-so-ever. We didn't even loose electricity. While we waited out the storm, Nanna and Mom cooked some pasta and chicken. Dad, Babbononno, Carl, and I played whist while we listened to the radio for weather information. When the storm finally cleared, Dad said that we should take a walk and check on Old Vic.

Old Vic was around Babbononno's age and the father of Arthur Gordon, one of the locals who lived down the road on the opposite side. Arthur and Dad had become good friends and the day before, he told Dad that he had to take the family to Portland for doctor visits and asked if we could keep an eye on Old Vic. En route to the Gordon home, we climbed over broken tree branches and spotted a couple of trees that were uprooted. When we reached the Gordon home, Old Vic was sitting on the front steps.

Dad asked him if he was OK. "Yup," was the response. Then Dad asked him if there was any damage to the house. Old Vic looked up and said, "Nope." Babbononno asked, "Da animales, dey OK?" Vic replied, brought'um inta the house." Then Dad asked, "Vic, any damage to the barn?" Old Vic looked up at Dad again and said, "Dunno, John, Iye haven' found it yit!" This was Down-Maine logic for a barn that completely disappeared.



When you ask how many courses are in a traditional Italian meal, your bound to get a variety of responses. In Italy, dinner can start with an aperitivo but typically many begin with an antipasti/antipasto or starter/appetizer. The primo piato or first course follows and often includes a risotto, pasta or variety of soups or zuppa, differing from region to region. In Veneto, you'll find Zuppa di Verze e Patate or Cabbage and Potato Soup. Tuscany is famous for it's Ribollita or Stale Bread and Vegetable Soup and Southern Italy is known for it's delicious Minestra Maritata or Married Soup, referring to the marriage between the meat and vegetables in the broth!

My Nonna made many tasty Minestra Maritata's. Some were made with chicken and others with beef or veal. Many years ago, she found a recipe in the newspaper that a restaurant shared for their own beef soup. It was titled "Venus di Milo Soup" and Nonna decided she was going to try it. I was surprised because my Nonna never made anything that called for the addition of a packaged soup mix. Nonetheless, she tried it and loved it. Nonna claimed it was the "fastest and easiest beef soup" to make and tasted delicious. It seemed everyone that tried agreed. This soup is great as a primo piato but hearty enough to serve as a main course meal!

#### FAST AND EASY BEEF SOUP Zuppa di Manzo Facile e Veloce



1 ½ pound ground beef (80 to 85%, not too lean)

1 envelope Lipton's onion soup mix

1 16-ounce can diced or stewed tomatos

(fire roasted diced work well)

1 16-ounce bag of frozen mixed vegetables

(peas, carrots, corn and green bean mixture; I use Trader Joe's) 45 to 50 ounces beef stock (3 15-ounce cans or 2 boxes) 2/3 cup dry orzo pasta

In a dutch oven (or stock pot) brown the ground beef until brown and crumbled, drain any excess fat. Add the dry soup mix and blend together. Add the tomatoes, frozen vegetables and beef stock. Stir together and cook over medium until you reach a boil. Lower the heat and simmer for 10 to 15 minutes. Add the orzo and cook an additional 10 minutes or until pasta is al dente. If additional broth is needed, just add a little bit at a time. Serve and enjoy!

#### **Finding San Francisco:**

The Palace of Fine Arts


Although almost nothing of the original structure survives, the Palace of Fine Arts, even in its current form, is the only standing memory to the Panama-Pacific International Exposition of 1915 which brought San Francisco back from the ruins of the devastating earthquake almost a decade earlier.

Built by Bernard Maybeck to resemble a crumbling Roman temple, it offered spectators a quiet, cool place for reflection and observation beneath its encompassing rotunda. So popular was the place with visitors and the public that even before the end of the Exposition a committee (the Palace Preservation League) was established to ensure its survival afterwards. They were

successful. After the Exposition left town the nine other palaces (dedicated to Education, Liberal Arts, Manufactures, Agriculture, Transportation and other industries) were torn down, but the Palace of Fine Arts stood very much as it still stands today.

None, however, were built to last beyond the event and by the mid-20th century, the structural inadequacies of the Palace of Fine Arts were becoming obvious. A shaky mixture of wood, plaster, and burlap could no longer stand strong and so the exterior of the structure was torn down in 1964. Almost immediately after, however, as in testament to the beloved presence it had accrued in fifty years, restoration began and the structure was rebuilt to its former appearance this time with strong concrete and iron

The Palace of Fine Arts today is one of the most peaceful, elegant and meditative areas in San Francisco. The surrounding lagoon (built by the engineers in the style of the ancient world) has become a host to a variety of waterfowl and its banks offer the visitor a grand view of the majestic palace that remains an icon of the city and, given the spirit of the event, it was created for, a monument to its resilience. Indeed, the very way the Palace of Fine Arts was rebuilt into its former glory after demolition is a parallel to how the city rebuilt itself after it was itself brought down in 1906.







#### **Boxers and Wrestlers**

While today wrestling is seen more as caricature (boxing really isn't too far behind), years ago professional wrestlers were highly respected athletes. Names such as Ed "Strangler" Lewis, Stanislaus Zbyszko, Jim Londos, and Steve "Crusher" Casey were held in high esteem. Boxers and wrestlers also had an affinity for one another and many of the champions from both sports had close friendships.

In the earlier part of the  $20^{\rm th}$  Century wrestlers would be part of the training camp for boxers as learning to grapple was important for being good when in clinches. Some of this was a throwback to the bare knuckle days when a lot of wrestling moves were used by the fighters.

Jim Jeffries and Jack Johnson both employed wrestlers in their camps as did Jack Dempsey. The techniques they learned were very helpful when they defended their titles.

Infighting became a lost art over the years, and today it is rare to see a boxer who knows how to work during a clinch.

Many of the friendships between boxers and wrestlers lasted for a lifetime. The Cauliflower Alley Club on the West Coast was a great organization made of veterans from both sports. For years Mike Mazurki the wrestler turned actor headed the group. I believe it is still in existence.





## HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB by Richard Preiss



Nick Damore had a lengthy hockey career in the minors, including many with the Hershey Bears, but his big moment came on January 25, 1942 when he filled in for regular Bruins starting goaltender Frank Brimsek who was not able to play because of a broken nose.

Remember, this was in the era before goalies wore masks. It is frightening just to think of that today. Imagine facing slap shots from NHL players without any facial protection. Yet goalies did it every night for generations.

The Bruins defeated their arch-rivals — the Montreal Canadiens -- 7-3 with Damore playing all 60 minutes. But Brimsek returned for the next game and Damore was sent back to Hershey, where he finished the season with a 33-17-6 record and a 3.02 goalies against average. He died on April 16, 1969 at age 52.

If George Abbott were alive in contemporary times, he would never be allowed to play in an NHL game. That is because he was already blind in one eye when he took the ice for the Bruins on November 27, 1943 against the Toronto at Maple Leaf Gardens.

Abbott lost the sight in one eye when he was struck by a puck during a tryout with the Hamilton (Ontario) Tigers. Despite this, he somehow became the practice goalie for Toronto. When regular B's goaltender Bert Gardiner was held out because of injury, Toronto "loaned" Abbot to the Bruins for the night. Abbott faced 52 shots in the 7-3 loss to the Maple Leafs. One of those shots knocked him out cold but he was revived and the game continued. He died on December 31, 1996 at age 85.

Les Colvin had a minor league career that spanned the years from 1939 to 1953. His night to remember came on January 23, 1949 when the B's faced Montreal. He played all 60 minutes in the 4-2 road loss. He spent the bulk of the season with the then minor league Vancouver Canucks where he posted a 25-23-2 record and a 3.94 goals against average. He died in Canada on September 7, 2006 at age 87.

A native of New Haven, CT, Dick Bittner was a regular goalie for the Boston Olympics, a team founded by Walter Brown, which served a farm team for the Boston Bruins in the 1940s and early 1950s. Bittner got the call on February 12, 1950 when regular netminder Jack Gelineau was out with an injury. Playing the entire game, Bittner held his own in the 3-3 tie. His other big moment came the year before when he played for Team USA in the 1949 World Championships. He died on March 24, 2002 at age 80.

Don Keenan, who had played college hockey at St. Francis Xavier University in Nova Scotia, became a practice goalie with Toronto in the late 1950s. Much like George Abbott, he could be "loaned" to the visiting team in an emergency. And that is what happened when B's netminder Harry Lumley came down with a case of suspected food poisoning on the day of the game — March 7, 1959. Keenan filled in, stopping 37 of 41 shots at Maple Leaf Gardens as Toronto beat the Bruins, 4-1. He died November 29, 2005 at age 67.

Bob Ring grew up in the Boston area and graduated from Winchester High School. His night with the Bruins came on October 30, 1965 when he relieved starter Ed Johnston during an 8-2 loss to the New York Rangers. The Rangers scored their final four goals while Ring was in net.

After a brief minor league career, Ring played college hockey in Canada and later received a master's degree from Boston University. He also served as an assistant coach at the University of Vermont for three seasons. He died on June 22, 2017 at age 70 in South Carolina.

Joe Junkin got an opportunity to play in goal for the Boston Bruins back in the Bobby Orr era back on December 14, 1968 when he played the final seven minutes and 56 seconds in a game against Chicago at the Garden.

Junkin replaced Gerry Cheevers in the Boston net after the Bruins had taken a 10-5 lead over Chicago. He stopped all six shots he faced. Orr who scored three goals and also added two assists in the game. Although he never played another NHL regular season game (he did play in a preseason game in September, 1969), Junkin did go on to have a career in the World Hockey Association with the New Jersey Knights, the New York Golden Blades and the San Diego Monarchs. He died on January 11, 2014 in Harrisburg, PA at age 67.

Jordan Sigalet may have had perhaps the briefest on-ice career with the Bruins, but what he overcame to achieve his objective (playing in the NHL) had a far reaching impact.

During his college years at Bowling Green University, Sigalet was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis. In March 2004. He returned for his senior season made the finalists list for consideration as a candidate for the Hobey Baker Award (best player in college hockey).

After graduation, he signed with Boston and played in one game on January 7, 2006 when he replaced starter Andrew Raycroft for the final 43 seconds against Tampa Bay after Raycroft had sustained a sprained ankle.

In November, 2007, he collapsed on the ice during a minor league game due to multiple sclerosis. He is presently director of goaltending with the Calgary Flames.

Born in Cambridge, Jim Stewart was a local player who was looking good. He played high school hockey at St. John's in Shrewsbury and later had a solid collegiate career at Holy Cross

But his big his moment with the Bruins did not go as planned since he gave up five goals in a contest against the St. Louis Blues on January 10, 1980. The Bruins lost the game 7-4. Replaced by Marco Baron as the second period began, he never played in the NHL again.

He did, however, have a career in college coaching, serving as an assistant at New Hampshire, RPI, UMass-Amherst and at his alma mater — Holy Cross — as the years went on.
