Boston Parks Department Lauded for

Langone Park & Puopolo Playground Improvements

The Boston Parks and Recreation Department was recently recognized by Boston Harbor Now at their annual Onboard Awards event for the redesign and development of Langone Park and Puopolo Playground on the North End waterfront.

"By taking this new approach we put newly adopted resilient design standards into practice for the first time at a Boston park or open space property and served as a pilot project for others to follow," noted Boston Parks Commissioner Ryan Woods. "Every element was designed both for functionality and resiliency for now and in the future."

Langone Park and Puopolo Playground is one of the city's oldest parks, as well as the site of the Great Molasses Flood of 1919. In March 2018, the park was inundated by flooding due to sea level rise after a nor'easter storm event where high tides breached the park's seawalls. This particular storm, in addition to an increased frequency in similar weather events, pushed climate resilience to the forefront.

"We are impressed by the community-informed design process, and the climate resilient landscaping and architectural features at the Park and are so glad to be recognizing the City and these waterfront spaces,"

Boston Harbor Now President and CEO Kathy Abbott said at the February 9th event.

The Parks Department was recognized for features that have already successfully protected the space from high tide and storm surge events since the project's completion. The climate-resilient design includes its incorporated inland secondary seawalls, elevated Harborwalk, and upgraded storm water systems. Today, Langone and Puopolo serve as crucial flood protection for the surrounding area.

The design team created a

plan for a multifunctional, stepped secondary seawall that improves protection from damaging storms while offering seating, to raising important park amenities, cantilevering the Harborwalk path over the water on stabilized micropiles, including LED lighting with raised utilities at high points onsite to maintain electrical resilience during flooding events.

Other park improvements and amenities include a high-performance natural turf Little League baseball field, a multisport synthetic turf field, a universal access playground, a memorial garden, basketball and expanded bocce courts, and plaza spaces allowing for expansive harbor views, access to the water's edge, and an open and inviting connection to the neighborhood.

The reconstruction of Langone Park and Puopolo Park was also recognized in 2022 with the Public Works Project of the Year (Historical Restoration/Preservation \$5m - \$25m) from the New England Chapter of the American Public Works Association, the Silver Award from the American Council of Engineering Companies of Massachusetts, and the Climate Change Project of the Year from the Environmental Business Council of New England.

Upping Ante on Reparations

A reparations task force in California (always a non-slave state) has increased the amount of money it wants taxpayers to hand over in compensation for racial discrimination and slavery. After first proposing \$220,000 payments last year, the task force now has proposed that eligible black citizens in the state receive \$360,000.

This project could cost as much as \$360 billion but no one has yet proposed how these payments would be funded

Daylight Savings Time All Year Long?

No time to waste here as U.S. Senator Marco Rubio, R-FL, has reintroduced bipartisan legislation that would make daylight savings time permanent and ending the twice-a-year changing of the clocks.

Rubio stated, "This ritual of changing time twice a year is stupid. Locking the clock has overwhelming bipartisan and popular support. This Congress, I hope that we can finally get it done."

If the Sunshine Protection Act passes and eventually gets signed into law, daylight savings time would begin in March as it now does and would become permanent, meaning longer winter days and later summer sunrises.

"No White Kids" in High School Play: Parents' Suit

The conservative non-profit Parents Defending Education says in a complaint filed in October that Newton North High School's production of *Lost and Found Our Stories as People of Color* was open only to theatre students who were black, indigenous, or people of color.

In its complaint, the parents' group said the performance violated Federal Civil-Rights Laws by discriminating against white students barred from participating.

What is happening?

The Massachusetts Department of Transportation is hosting two virtual public information meetings to discuss changes to Phase 2 of the Sumner Tunnel Restoration Project. The previous version of Phase 2 included a fourmonth full closure of the tunnel beginning in May of 2023. Phase 2 will now consist of two separate two-month full closures during the summers of 2023 and 2024.

How will this affect you?

This tunnel restoration project will impact abutters and regional traffic. All residents, abutters, local business owners, and interested commuters are invited to attend. Meeting attendees will have the opportunity to ask questions and offer comments. Both meetings will provide the same information. Holding two meetings is an effort by MassDOT to accommodate everyone's schedules as best possible. Spanish and Arabic interpretation will be available at the meeting.

Stirpe Nostra

DOMITIAN

The Fly-Stabber

Titus Flavius Domitianus, popularly known as Domitian, was born on October 24, 51 A.D., in Rome. He lived in great poverty during his boyhood and early youth. During the war with Vitellius in 69 A.D., although he was eighteen years of age, Domitian took refuge in the Capital. When the enemy forced an entrance and the place was set on fire, he went into hiding for the entire night. At daybreak, he escaped, using the disguise of a priest, and continued to remain in hiding until the forces of Vitellius were overcome. After the death of his father (Vespasian), he never had any reservations about making claims of partnership in the

imperial will and that it had been tampered with. From the time of Vespasian's death, Domitian never ceased to plot against his brother, Titus, both secretly and openly. After the death of Titus, Domitian often ridiculed his memory.

During the early months of his reign, Domitian spent hours in seclusion every day doing nothing more than catching flies and then stabbing them with a pin. Consequently, when anyone asked if the emperor had visitors, the witty reply was "No, not even a fly." His administration of the government was inconsistent and showed an equal number of virtues and vices. Finally, his virtues were turned into vices, and it was explained that he became rapacious through need and cruel through fear. He constantly gave very costly entertainment in the amphitheater as well as in the circus. These shows were in the form of chariot races and mock wars between infantry and cavalry. At one time, he flooded the lower section of the amphitheater and gave a mock naval battle. Other entertainment took the form of wild beast hunts, gladiatorial shows by torchlight, fights between two men or, at times, between two women. He also shortened the number of laps in the chariot

races from seven to five in order to run one hundred races in one day. He felt that a good racing day started at sunrise and continued until sunset. He also established a quinquennial contest in honor of Jupiter, with competitions in music, riding, and gymnastics.

Domitian restored many splendid buildings that had been destroyed by fire and made innovations in the common customs. He eliminated the distribution of food to the people and revived an older custom of giving them formal dinners instead. Actors were forbidden to appear on any stage but were permitted to practice their art in private houses. He prohibited the castration of males and regulated the price of the few remaining eunuchs that were still in the hands of the slave dealers. Justice was scrupulously and conscientiously administered and special sessions in the courts were held when appropriate. He rescinded decisions of judges that were influenced by personal motives or gain and degraded jurors and their associates who accepted bribes. It is said that at no other time in history were the officials more honest and

He put an end to a practice in the theaters where the general public was permitted to occupy seats that were reserved for the knights. He also stopped the publication of vulgar or abusive lampooning in which famous people of the times were attacked and imposed humiliating penalties on their authors. A former magistrate who became a senator was discharged because he liked to sing and dance. Notorious women were denied the use of litters or carrying chairs and were denied the right to receive inheritances and legacies. One Roman knight was denied the right to act as a juror because he had taken his wife back into the household after she had been divorced and charged with adultery.

Any form of incest committed against the Vestal virgins was punished by normal forms of execution; but later the offenders were put to death in the ancient fashion, which was to be beaten to death with rods. Vestal virgins that were found guilty of violating their vow of chastity were permitted to choose the manner of their death, but later the penalty was changed and they were buried alive. In the early part of his reign, he shrank from any form of bloodshed, but this did not continue for long. He eventually turned to cruelty as well as to avarice.

It is with a very heavy heart that I share the passing of my father, Dr. Michael Salvatore Annunziata. He left us at Brigham and Women's Hospital on February 28, 2023 surrounded by family, and in the thoughts of those who loved him.

Born on September 27, 1941, my father grew up in the North End of Boston. He graduated from Christopher Columbus High School and Boston College, and completed medical school at Boston University - which led to a long and active career in psychiatry. In addition to his private practice, he worked with the Massachusetts mental health system with a specialization in the area of forensic psychiatry. He was an active member of the Massachusetts Medical Society House of Delegates where he served as Trustee, was the former Massachusetts Medical Society Suffolk District President and Secretary, and served on the society's committees on Legislation, Professional Ethics and Grievances, and Administration and Management.

My father brought a blend of sharp wit and exceptional intellect to all that he did. He recognized that single decisions and seemingly small moments can leave critical imprints on our paths in life, and acknowledged the opportunities that were gifted to subsequent generations by the sacrifices and hard work of the first members of his family to make their lives in this country.

My father was preceded in death by his grandparents Pasquale and Angiolina (Capodilupo) Fabiano, and Lazzaro and Filomena (Prisco) Annunziata; his mother Anita (Fabiano) Annunziata, his father Michael Anthony Annunziata, and his brother Albert Leonard Annunziata. He leaves his sister, Phyllis (Annunziata) Marks; his children Laura Anne and Michael Peter Annunziata, my son and his beloved grandson Lukas Michael Borja, my mother Anne-Reet Ilves Annunziata, his loving partner Kathleen DiMasi, and many special godchildren, nieces, nephews, cousins, lifelong friends and colleagues.

We invite you to join us to remember him and celebrate his life at 10 am on Thursday, March 16 for a mass at St. Leonard's Church in Boston, to be followed at 11:30 am by a graveside ceremony and gathering at Newton Cemetery and Arboretum.





L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Reflections on a Reflective Lent

We find ourselves at the start of the changeable month of March, and spring seems palpably in our grasp. Sparkling shamrocks and mischievous leprechauns adorn doorways and windows across my town, reminding me of the upcoming St. Patrick's Day festivities. Robins herald the arrival of a new season with their blazing red breasts as they hop about on the slowly budding tree branches. Crocuses and daffodils begin to wink from newlychurned dirt. However, though the signs of spring prove plentiful, other aspects of nature tell us that we are still in a period of transition, when the weather remains as unpredictable as the March winds. Clumps of old snow, stubborn to melt. may cling to the ground under trees or on the edges of parking lots, while an occasional slategray sky threatens additional wintry weather. Bursts of frigid air still send us scrambling for heavy coats, scarves and gloves. In supermarkets, agricultural produce comes to a virtual standstill, as the lemons and oranges of winter dwindle before they can be replaced by the tender greens and herbs of spring. During this time of the year, when winter reluctantly yields its hold on spring, folk customs around the world honor the changing of the seasons. For example, we are now in the period of Lent, an interval which boasts profound religious significance but also cultural and seasonal importance. Lent mirrors the changes occurring in the natural world and guides us towards spring with a sense of promise, hope and renewal.

This year, Lent began on Lent shares the same root with February 22^{nd} , Ash Wednesday. Lent shares the same root with the word *lengthen*, referring to

It covers a 40-day period prior to Easter, the most important feast in the Christian calendar. These days serve to prepare the faithful for Easter through purification rituals such as prayer, fasting, charity and self-reflection. The timing of Lent is highly symbolic, as it occurs during a seemingly barren season in which nature also purifies herself after a long winter, emerging ready for the rebirth of spring. In order to appreciate the glory of Easter and spring, we need to embrace the seasonal transition with contemplation and introspection, an opportunity which Lent generously affords us. When my father was a child in Italy, Lent, or la Quaresima, functioned as a somber and austere period, matching the chill sterility of nature. Though the rules have relaxed since then, the rite of purification remains the crux of Lenten customs in Italy and beyond. This explains the popular practice of giving up a bad habit or an indulgence for Lent, a tradition which is not mentioned in the Bible but nevertheless fits seamlessly with the folkloric cleansing rituals of the season. The purpose of this Lenten abstinence should not be deprivation, but rather a chance to examine our values or priorities and improve ourselves. Last Lent, for example, I gave up my browsing some of my favorite websites, in order that I may break my smartphone habit and spend more mindful time with my family. The promise of Lent, however, stands in the fact that all of our hard work will be rewarded with a beautiful springtime. After all, the English term for Lent shares the same root with

the growth of daylight in the spring sky!

Lent means more than saying goodbye to your favorite treat, though. In Italy, this meditative time inspired the creation of unique folk traditions and customs that would come to define the tapestry of pre-Easter celebrations. The most famous Lenten rule involves the forbidding of meat on Fridays; as such, ingenious Italian cooks devised many fish and vegetable dishes for these days. A visitor to Italy during Lent will notice farmers' markets bursting with fresh fish and baccalá (dried cod), along with the first spring vegetables, from which can be crafted a nourishing minestrone. Italians also snack on quaresimali, or almond biscuits, which, as the name suggests, are made especially for Lent. According to the author Helen Barolini in her book Festa, a simple and customary Italian Lenten dessert is pizza fritta, fried dough sprinkled with sugar. My mother and grandmother would frequently whip up this dessert when I was younger, much to my pleasure, though I only recently learned of its Lenten connotations. The people in Italy also celebrate the fourth Sunday of Lent as Mezza Ouaresima, or mid-Lent. These festivities mark the halfway point of Lent and honor the imminent arrival of Easter, and many Italian towns and cities hold parties and processions reminiscent of Carnival. Of course, due to the self-reflection and sacrifice that accompanies Lent, it is important to remember that giving is just as powerful as abstaining. People in Italy and around the world commemorate Lent with charity and community service, and truly there is no better way to spread the light of spring than by helping others. Though the checkered March

weather makes it appear as if winter will never quite lose its grasp on spring, holidays like Lent skillfully guide us in managing this transition and welcoming a new season. Now that the luxurious chocolates of St. Valentine's Day and the raucous Mardi Gras decorations are swept away, the time proves right for purification and introspection. The rites of Lent, replete with their emphasis on self-improvement and reflection, echo the regeneration of nature as the vernal equinox, and later Easter, approach. Lent is a time to do good deeds, to ruminate on the successes and challenges of the past year, and to cleanse yourself of negative emotions and distractions prior to triumph and rejuvenation of spring. Significantly, Lent is a season of hope — hope for the promise of Easter, hope for the return of the spring sun. Nature will reawaken, the sun will resplendently shine, and the wheel of the year will roll on, carrying with us through life's treasures.

If you ask most folks their opinion of the political class, you never find much positivity. Opinion poll after opinion poll over decades show the overwhelming disdain most of us have for those who represent us in the halls of government. The further away our voices legislate from, the less we like 'em. The Ohio train derailment is that rare news story that is getting more media attention in its fourth week than it received in the first week. The media tried very hard to not make the derailment and the decision to nuke the town of East Palestine a story. Elected and appointed officials at both the state and federal levels kept acting as if it was no big deal, nothing to see here where residents in this little town next to a rail line ended up in the wrong place at the wrong time.



Saint Bosa of York

Bosa was a Northumbrian, educated at Whitby Abbey under the abbess Hilda. He subsequently joined the monastery as a monk, and became one of five men educated at Whitby who went on to become bishops.

In 678, after Wilfrid was removed from the bishopric of York and banished from Northumbria, the diocese of York was divided into three. Bosa was appointed to the greatly reduced diocese of York, which included the sub-kingdom of Deira, thanks to the support of King Ecgfrith of Northumbria and Theodore of Tarsus, the Archbishop of Canterbury. Bosa was consecrated in his cathedral at York in 678 by Theodore, but Wilfrid declared that he was unable to work with Bosa because he did not consider him to be a member of the Catholic Church.



Bosa's episcopate lasted nine years, but with Wilfrid back in favor, in 687 Bosa was removed just as his predecessor had been. He returned to York in 691, after Wilfrid was once again expelled. Bishop Bosa, thus, returned once more to the see of York in 691. Boss introduced a communal life for the clergy of the cathedral, and set up a continuous liturgy in the cathedral.

The date of Bosa's death is unknown; he was still alive

in 704 but must have died before 706, when his successor was named. His successor at York was John of Beverley, the Bishop of Hexham. A contemporary writer, the Venerable I Bede, praised Bosa as a man of "singular merit and sanctity." Bede also praised Bosa's humility. Bosa was also responsible for the early education of Acca, later Bishop of Hexham, who grew up in his household.

Bosa appears as a saint in an 8th-century liturgical calendar from York, the only sign that he was venerated as a saint before the Norman Conquest of England. The 16th-century English antiquary John Leland included Bosa in his list of saint's resting places in England, giving it as York. The feast day of Saint Bosa of York is March 9th.


As we mark this tenth year, the City of

Elevate Your Garden's Beauty with Jewel-tone Plants

Bring the beauty of your favorite gemstones into the garden and your outdoor living space with the help of jeweltoned plants. Even a pot of these beauties placed on the balcony can provide bold color, vibrancy, and lushness to any space.

Select plants with leaves, flowers, or both in the saturated colors of gemstones like rubies, amethyst, topaz, sapphire, and turquoise. Select plants with colors that complement your home and landscape and will thrive in the growing conditions in your gardening space.

Look for opportunities to include these rich colors throughout the growing season. Jewel-toned pansies, ornamental cabbage and kale, and calendula are a few plants that thrive in cooler weather, providing welcome color before other plants appear or have faded in the summer heat.

As temperatures rise, include rich yellows and oranges of Rudbeckias and sunflowers. Add a showy and exotic look to the garden with Crocosmia. Plant Lucifer for bright red flowers, Prince of Orange for its red-orange blooms and George Davidson for an added touch of yellow. Check out the many colorful varieties of dahlias and gladiolus that grow well in the garden and containers and make great additions to your garden bouquets. Canna's bold and colorful foliage is impressive all season long and is sure to command attention when topped with flowers.

Add colorful zinnias for season-long color. You can start them from seed right in the garden or buy transplants for earlier bloom. Look for diseaseresistant varieties and those with bold colors like Benary's giant deep red, Profusion red, and Double Zahara Fire's orange-red blooms. These sunny loving annuals are also heat and drought-tolerant,

making them perfect for lowmaintenance gardens.

Plant some tall Mexican sunflowers in the back of the garden. Consider Fiesta Del Sol, a more compact variety, if you want something shorter and more compact. No matter which you grow, you and the pollinators will enjoy the orange blooms.

Keep the color going with summer to fall blooming Helenium which is hardy in zones three to eight. Hot Lava is topped with fire engine red flowers while Butterpat has vibrant yellow blossoms.

Coral bells come in a wide variety of leaf colors, making it easy to include jewel tones all season long. Many shadetolerant hostas have deep green foliage that provides the perfect backdrop for other flowers.

Combining complementary colors that appear opposite of each other on the artist's color wheel creates an eye-catching display. Dark colors can easily disappear in the background or shade. Teaming them with a complementary colored plant or light background can help them pop. A combination of purpleleaved bugbane and the fine chartreuse foliage of Hakone grass, for example, allows both plants to shine while creating a splendid display.

Make sure the plants you combine are equally bold, so each adds to the overall design. Mix in some green foliage to provide a bit of color relief. Too much of a good thing, including vibrant colors, can overpower the landscape and create a somewhat chaotic feel.

Make notes on the plants and combinations you want to repeat next year. Note those that didn't perform to your expectations and don't need to be repeated. If you decide to expand upon this theme, be sure to add some jewel-toned. spring-flowering bulbs like tulips and hyacinths to the landscape this fall.





DAVE ASKREN & JEFF BENEDICT -**DENVER SESSIONS** (CD) **Tapestry Records**

Guitarist Dave Askren and

saxophonist Jeff Benedict have

enjoyed a musical relationship stretching back three decades and spanning a dozen recording projects as well as countless performances throughout the Los Angeles area. Sometimes there's nothing better to freshen up a longstanding collaboration than a change of scenery, so for their fourth album as co-leaders the duo embarked for the Mile High city. Denver Sessions is the welcome result, a lively, eclectic collection that draws inspiration from throughout the jazz continuum while sounding utterly modern. The aim was to create a thrilling sax-guitar-vibes frontline with vibist Ted Piltzecker, along with Patrick McDevitt and drummer Paul Romaine. The sax-guitar-vibes frontline led Askren and Benedict to delve into that unique formation's history for inspiration as they conceived new music for the date. Perhaps the most famous example, the Benny Goodman Sextet with guitarist Charlie Christian and Lionel Hampton, led to the inclusion of the album's sole cover, a dynamic rendition of the classic "Stompin' at the Savoy." For the opener, Askren's "Jackie's Idea," he chose a bass line intro, recorded at Rudy Van Geldner's studio in New Jersey, and then Askren tips his hat to the site and its legacy on the briskly swinging "Englewood Cliffs." The guitarist's airy ballad "Memories" is dedicated in part by the late guitar great Pat Martino. Benedict's stately, elegant "Marie Adele" is an ode to his late mother, while the pendulum swings to the far extreme for the blistering "Orange Express." The rollicking "Ennui Anyone?" takes its title from illustrator Edward Gorey's macabre ABC book The Gashlycrumb Tinies, where N stands for "Neville, who died from ennui. Piltzecker takes the album in a Latin direction with his three contributions. The Cuban-inspired "Rhumba Liam" pays tribute to a beloved family pet, while "Poised" is a sinuous samba. The gently buoyant "Resilience" remembers the unsung heroes who guided the country through the recent pandemic.

A Nostalgic Remembrance



It was the end of February 1949, and radio ads abounded with Washington's birthday sales at car agencies. Dad was in the market for a new car. He had been driving a 1937 Plymouth since 1938. He had bought it from the mailman about the time I was born and it had served him through World War II and for 3½ post war years. By the late winter of '49, it was all beat up. The rear bumper had rusted off, all four fenders had been dented, the upholstery was worn out, the trunk lid didn't lock and when Dad hit a bump, that lid would wave at the vehicle behind. In other words, it was time.

Dad dragged Babbononno

and me with him to search for something new. He had never purchased a new car in his life. The Plymouth and every other car he ever bought in his life had been previously owned. Music had been good to Dad and he could now afford (within reason) a new car. We ventured to just about every Ford, Plymouth and Chevrolet dealer within the Boston area to hunt. The first stop was on Commonwealth Avenue. Beginning with Fuller's Cadillac/Oldsmobile building, which was diagonally across from BU Bridge (Cottage Farm Bridge back then), both sides of the street were lined with car dealerships. Dad checked the prices of the low priced three, the name that was given to Plymouth, Chevy and Ford back then, but wasn't satisfied with any of them. As we headed to where Commonwealth Ave. splits to the left and Brighton Ave. begins, there was a showroom with cars in the window that I liked. Dad informed me that it was a Packard agency and he couldn't afford anything they had to sell. When Babbononno asked the price of cars, Dad quoted him numbers from high to low, depending on the make. Babbononno thought he was crazy. He thought a minute and told Dad that if he bought a house, the next day it would be worth more than he paid for it, but if he bought a car, the next day it would be worth less. Dad agreed, but told my grandfather that he needed a car for work. Babbononno just shrugged and said under his breath, "Questo generazione e pazzo." (This generation is crazy)

Not finding anything in downtown Boston, we headed to agencies Dad knew of in other parts of the city. Again, nothing turned him on price wise, so we headed home. Just as we pulled up in front of the house on Eutaw Street, Dad notices a brand new 1949 black Chevy fast back sitting across the street. Once out of the car, Dad walked across to look at it. I could tell by the look on his face that he loved it. He called Babbononno and me over to look at it, and just then, the owner came out of the house where the car was parked. His name was Tony Patti. He was the manager of the Savarese Cheese Company in the North

End and a friendly neighbor. Immediately, Dad started asking him questions about the car and he told us where he bought it and how much he paid for it. When Babbononno heard that the price was over \$1,000, he mumbled, Un' altro pazzo americano." (Another crazy American)

Dad looked under the hood, in the trunk, and checked out the interior of the car and loved it. Tony had to leave, but gave Dad the name of the agency and the salesman's name. The agency was five minutes away, Reese Chevrolet in the Day Square neighborhood of East Boston. The three of us climbed back in Dad's '37 Plymouth and headed to Day Square. Once there, we entered the showroom and Dad asked for the salesman whose name was given to him. When the man arrived, Dad introduced himself and told the man that he had seen his friend Tony's new car and was interested in one for himself. The man had an identical model and we all jumped in to road test it. Dad headed back to Eutaw Street and stopped at the house, telling the salesman that he had to fit a bass violin in the car. If it fit, they would talk about price. Dad went in the house and came out with his bass.

Now, basses come in several sizes. Most bass violins made today are what they call 3/4 size. Dad's was very old and full size, bigger than most. Due to the fast back design of the car, it didn't fit. Dad was upset until the salesman told him that regular two- or four-door designs might work as they had more headroom in the back than the fastback. We headed back to Reese Chevrolet and Dad looked at a two-door coupe that was black, with all the extras, full sized hub caps, white walls, radio, heater and a tan marbleized steering wheel, plus, the hood ornament was part red plastic and lit up when the lights were turned on. His eyes lit up and the dealer's plate was taken off the fastback, placed on the coupe and off we went back to Eutaw Street. We all got out in front of the house and Dad again went in to get his bass and tried it in the car. This time, it fit, with room to spare. Next, it was back in the house with the bass ... back in the car for a return trip to the agency, and at that point, Dad and the salesman began talking money.

The two men bargained back and forth with no one agreeing on a price. Dad thanked the salesman for his time and we began to exit the agency. We were half way out the door and were called back. Dad's last offer would be accepted and we went back in for Dad to sigh the paperwork. Part of the deal was that they didn't want Dad's car in trade. The salesman told him that it was just this side of junk (which it was) and they couldn't get rid of it unless they called a junkyard. We drove home in the old Plymouth with Dad now owning two cars. The next day, I went with him as a neighbor drove him to pick up the new Chevy. Talk about luck ... once we were back on Eutaw Street and out of the new car, a young man walking by asked Dad if he knew who owned the Plymouth with-out any plates on it. Dad told him that he did. The young man told him that he was a professional racer and was interested in the car for a demolition derby. That's the type of event where participants drive old beat up cars and bang them into each other. The last on running is the winner.

Dad and the young man talked for a few minutes and Dad sold the Plymouth for \$75.00. He then asked me to clean out anything of value from the old car and put it in the trunk of the new Chevy and handed the keys to the young man. The next day, the Plymouth was gone. At dinner that night, Babbononno asked Dad how much he paid for the new car and Dad told him it was \$1,200.00. Babbononno shook his head and mumbled something again about crazy Americans. Mom tried to tell him about the price of cars but she couldn't change his mind about crazy people.

That car lasted us until 1954, a point in time that Dad fell in love with the new Chevy line and bought a four-door powder blue and white Bel Air. I think this was the point in time when I fell in love with cars, a feeling I still have today. An acquaintance has several old cars. Among them are a '49 and a '54 Chevy. Every time I see them, I think back to those cars of old and all the fun we had with them.

In Italy, La Festa San Giuseppe or The Feast of St. Joseph is celebrated annually on March 19th. Father's Day is also observed throughout the country on this day. Celebrations vary throughout the regions with the most lavish taking place in Sicily. During the Middle Ages, legend states St. Joseph saved the Sicilian people from one of their most dangerous droughts. It appears the Sicilians prayed to him for rain and promised St. Joseph a feast day in his name if their prayers were answered. Rain came, their crops were saved, and a life-threatening famine was prevented. As a thank you to their patron saint, each year Sicilians prepare a traditional "alter" or "St. Joseph's Table". A statue of St. Joseph is placed at the head of the table and surrounded by gifts of symbolic foods, sentiment, and elegantly created bread sculptures. Friends and family gather on the feast day and celebrate by eating the gifts on the table. The St. Joseph's table is still in existence in Italy and many of the older Italians celebrate it here in the states as well!

St. Joseph's Day is celebrated with a variety of customary dishes and desserts. There's *Pasta Con Sarde*, *Pane Mafalda*, Fava beans, and *Sfinge* just to name a few. Yet none are more popular and sought-after than the Zeppole. Traditional Zeppole are a pastry resembling a cream puff, filled with *Crema Pasticceria*, topped with an Amarena Cherry, and dusted with confectioners sugar. They are available in most Italian bakeries throughout Italy as well as here in the states. Homemade always seemed best in my family and my Nonna made them several different ways. Today, I am sharing her recipe for what she referred to as "Cream Puff *Zeppole*". They are almost identical to those that are piped in a circle and garnished with a cherry, just smaller, easier to create, and just the right size to bite into without having to worry about the cream oozing out everywhere. In honor of *San Giuseppe*, I hope you enjoy my Nonna's Cream Puff-Style *Zeppole*!

NONNA'S CREAM PUFF STYLE ZEPPOLE Zeppole Stile Bigne Della Nonna



For the Crema Pasticceria:

6 egg yolks 3/4 cup granulated sugar 1/4 cup and 2 tablespoons allpurpose flour 2 ¾ cups whole milk peel of ½ organic lemon, whole 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

In a large bowl, beat egg yolks and sugar for 15 minutes, until light and fluffy. In a medium saucepan slowly simmer the milk and lemon peel until just before the boiling point, do not boil. Let cool slightly and when the egg/sugar mixture is done mixing, remove the lemon peel and slowly add the milk to this mixture while mixing. Add the vanilla and pour this mixture back into the saucepan. Cook over medium-low heat, whisking continuously until this starts to thicken. Switch to a wooden spoon and continue stirring until the mixture is thick and just starts to come to a boil. Remove from heat, stir for an additional minute and let cool slightly. Transfer to a heatproof bowl, place plastic wrap directly on the surface of the filling to eliminate a skin from forming. Refrigerate at least 4 to 5 hours or overnight allowing to firm completely.

For the Pastry Dough:

1 cup water ½ cup butter ¼ teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon sugar 1 cup all-purpose flour

poon salt 4 large eggs

Preheat oven to 400° Line a baking sheet with parchment paper, set aside.

In a medium saucepan, over medium heat, combine the water, butter, salt and sugar and allow to come to a boil, melting the butter completely. Lower the heat to medium-low and while stirring with a wooden spoon, add the flour to this mixture. Cook until mixture forms a ball, continue stirring and cooking for another 2 to 3 minutes. Remove from heat and cool. Transfer mixture back to the mixing bowl and add the eggs, one at a time, making sure to beat well after each addition, until the dough is silky and smooth.

Drop by rounded tablespoons $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches apart onto the prepared baking sheet. Bake at 400° for 20 minutes, lower to 350° for 15 minutes or until golden. Shut oven, remove Zeppole, puncture each with a skewer to let the air out and place back in the oven (that is already off) leaving the door slightly open for 15 minutes.

Just before serving, cut the Zeppole and fill with cream. Sift a generous amount of confectioners' sugar over the top of each and enjoy!

Dostoevsky's

Hidden Particle of Genius

Art, especially masterpieces, are remembered in pieces. For greatness does not lie only in the moments of grandeur but also in the particles, in the understated expressions. Masterworks are remembered almost universally as a whole but subjectively in pieces of brilliance. It could be argued that the parts make the whole a masterpiece and which speak strong individually will vary from responder.

Fyodor Dostoevsky's Crime and Punishment was the first of his two works which would come to stand head and shoulder above the rest. Many consider The Brothers Karamazov to be the peak of Dostoevsky's genius but few literary works feel as complete a foray into despair as Crime and Punishment, achieving in its look into the dark recesses of the human mind a near perfection.

There are many aspects of the novel that linger in the mind, from the description of the decaying edifice where Alyona Ivanovna lives in paranoid hesitancy to the dives into the mind of her killer, Raskolnikov who may be inspired as much by the inevitability with which he's come to accept violence than the philosophical questions behind it.

One obscure bit that nonetheless showcases Dostoevsky's gift for the understated expression has stood out for years. Virtually nothing is explained about it in the text, we understand all there is to it by the powerplay that has been built between Raskolnikov and his interrogator Porfiry Petrovich, the investigator convinced he is the killer he seeks.

The moment comes shortly after Raskolnikov has murdered Alyona, his pawnbroker, in her flat. At this time the novel is working as a thriller at its finest. Raskolnikov has visited her the previous day to conduct business and, knowing he was known to frequent her residence on that given day of the week, returned the following day to commit murder to reduce suspicion. Unfortunately for him, two painters who were not there the previous day are


in the building Taking care to hide and blend in, he makes his way out.

We have learned at this point that Raskolnikov is, in part by virtue of adaptation to his surroundings often in control and manipulative, but is susceptible to streaks of panic. Once Porfiry has determined that he is the murderer he figures Raskolnikov's weakness

Shortly after the murder Porfiry pays Raskolnikov a visit and an interrogation begins. Raskolnikov maintains throughout that he was at Alyona's apartment on the day he would normally go to conduct business but was not there on the day she was found dead. Casually and without an explicit clue from Dostoevsky about what is happening in Porfiry's mind or his ploy, the detective asks the suspect if he happened to see two painters on the day he claimed (and the only day he claimed) to have been at the victim's apartment. Dostoevsky offers not direct insight into why the detective is asking this simply because it would be superfluous information. So concise was his development of the minds of the two characters, so vivid his rendition of the powerplay in the works and the strategies of each opponent that we know exactly why Porfiry is asking what he is asking and the trap he is setting. An affirmative answer from Raskolnikov is as good as an admission of guilt.

There is little doubt despite his starting to break under pressure that Raskolnikov knows why Porfiry asked about the painters and sees the trap. He knows the right answer and delivers it. Porfiry's mistake, and the reason his trap fails, is not assuming that Raskolnikov had been there both days.

In its understated, quiet and almost unnoticed way this brief moment reaches a height of literary mastery seldom seen Simply by observing their behavior we are compelled by the mind games of two characters we understand like we understand real people.



HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

AN IMPRESSIVE DEBUT — That is what it was as newly acquired defenseman Dmitry Orlov was awarded the National Hockey League's First Star of the Week for his outstanding performance in the four games through March 5th.

The former member of the Washington Capitals put up 3-6-9 stats during a span that saw the Bruins go 4-0-0 as they continued their first place drive toward the upcoming Stanley Cup Playoffs.

And what can Bruins faithful add to Orlov's new-to-the-team performance? Well, some of them have taken to spelling his name in an alternative way, adding an additional "r" so that it comes out "Orrlov" — a reference to Hall of Fame defenseman Bobby Orr who patrolled the back end of the Causeway Street ice sheet a half century ago.

After being acquired from the Caps through a three-team trade on February 25th, Orlov had two assists against Edmonton, then two goals and an assist against Calgary followed by one goal and two assists against Buffalo. He then added an assist against the New York Rangers.

Thus Orlov had a combined total (Washington and Boston) of six goals and 22 assists for 28 points through March 5th. That meant that Orlov had scored half his goals and nearly a third of his points in just those four games with the Bruins.

It would appear that Orlov was the right acquisition at just the right time as the Bruins continue their first place domination of the NHL down the stretch toward the Stanley Cup Playoffs.

BEFORE THE BRUINS HE WAS ALSO A BEAR — Yes, Jeremy Swayman is certainly an outstanding goalie for the Bruins, even though it comes in a backup capacity to league-leader and teammate Linus Ullmark. Through games of March 5th, Swayman was ranked as the fourth best goalie In the NHL, having played in 26 games, producing a 16-4-0 mark to go with an impressive goals against average and a.918 save percentage.

But before there was Boston and the Big Bruins of Causeway Street there was another group of ursine players that Swayman backstopped for three years.

They would be the University of Maine Black Bears based in Orono, the lone Division 1 playing institution in the Pine Tree State. Although not that many people visit in the winter, numerous hockey fans are familiar with Maine since both the men's and women's teams are members of Hockey East and thus play numerous road games throughout southern New England.

One could say that Swayman has come a long way in his hockey career — but that can be said about many players in the NHL. He did come came a long way to play for Maine, traveling from the opposite end of America (Anchorage, Alaska), leaving a state that was created in 1959 to live in one that began its statehood identity when it separated from Massachusetts in 1820.

He had already been drafted by the Bruins in the fourth round (111th overall) in the 2017 NHL Draft. But coming off a career in juniors, he decided to

go to college instead, playing for a top quality program.

Indeed, current B's head coach Jim Montgomery also played for the Black Bears and was captain of the team that won the 1993 Frozen Four national championship. That included a hat trick in the come-from-behind 5-4 victory over Lake Superior State in the title game.

Swayman was somewhat of a late bloomer in Orono. His 15-13-3 record in his freshman season belies the fact that he made the Hockey East All-Rookie team and had the most victories of any freshman goalie since Ben Bishop led Maine to the 2006 Frozen Four semifinals.

Like wise his sophomore season could have been better than 14-17-4 in 35 games. But he did make 79 saves in a two-game series against Boston University and 53 in a 4-3 upset win over highly regarded UMass-Amherst.

His junior season made the difference. He finished with an 18-11-5 record and led all NCAA Division One goaltenders in saves that season with a total of 1,099. He won the Walter Brown Award as the best Americanborn college hockey player in New England, was named a Hockey East First Team All-Star, won the Mike Richter Award as the top Division goalie in the nation and finished second in the voting for the Hobey Baker Award (best college player in the nation).

With that armful of accolades he decided it was time to take the Bruins up as that pick in the 2017 draft. He left Maine as the all-time leader in saves with 3,130 and minutes played (5,906) — even though he only played three seasons.

Swayman's pro debut was delayed because of Covid-19 protocols but when the 2020-2021 campaign finally did get going, he won his first seven games of the truncated season with Providence and finished with an 8-1-0 mark and a fine 1.89 goals against average.

Absences create opportunities and during that same spring of 2021 with Tuukka Rask and Jaroslav Halak both sidelined, Swayman got the call in Boston and posted a shutout against the New York Islanders. Overall, he played 10 NHL games that spring, going 7-3-0 with a noticeme 1.50 goals against average. When the playoffs began it was Swayman, not Halak, who served as Rask's backup.

Over the course of the 2021 offseason Rask had surgery and Halak left for Vancouver. Ullmark was brought in and the two split duties. Swayman played 40 games during the 2021-2022 campaign, leading NHL rookie goaltenders with a 2.37 goals against average. He also won the coveted Seventh Player Award.

Thus far this season, it has been more of the same. Ullmark leads all NHL goalies while Swayman is ranked fourth in the league. That is a nice thought to have for B's President Cam Neely as he descends in the elevator from his ninth floor location to ice level after every home game, stoically silent in the contemplation of the most pleasant of situations at his doorstep.
