## Who Doesn't Support Two Grand Monthly?

One-time survival checks are not nearly enough.

The money runs out, but the bills don't stop coming — from rent, utilities, and student debt payments, to food, diapers, and life-saving medication. In the midst of a deadly pandemic and deep economic crisis, no one should be forced to choose between remaining in their home, putting food on the table, or paying for basic necessities.

So, U.S. Rep. Ayanna Pressley has co-sponsored Rep. Rashida Tlaib's Automatic Boost to Communities (ABC) Act legislation to deliver monthly **\$2,000 payments to everyone in the United States** — regardless of their immigration status.

Why stop at two thousand a month? This indeed might be a good question for Pressley to answer.

#### Congress Must Reassert Its Legislative Authority

According to a March 18<sup>th</sup> commentary in the *Washington Examiner*, we are facing the greatest challenge in a generation, which exposed our dysfunctional government and outdated policies. The 117<sup>th</sup> Congress has a choice to make in reasserting its legal authority, or let the executive branch do their job for them.

Our legislative branch (Congress) has two important functions; one is to write laws, and the other to check the executive branch through oversight and the power of the purse.

In a matter of days of assuming office, Biden issued 40 executive actions, 25 of which were executive orders and 10 presidential memos. Government by phone and pen unless challenged in the courts would further weaken the appropriate role of the legislative branch in our federal system. Congress must reassert its legal authority.

# Stirpe Nostra

#### THE EARLY CHRISTIAN CATACOMBS

Christianity was born in Judea and carried to Rome by St. Peter, St. Paul and others. Their religion grew out of the teachings of Jesus Christ and his twelve Apostles. The shortest and most simple explanation of these teachings is that they are composed of three parts: 1. Rules of Christian conduct; 2. Duties of Christian leaders; and 3. Baptism.

During the height of power in ancient Rome, Christian bands started forming. They refused to serve in the Roman Army, and because they worshipped a God of their own, they refused to honor the emperor as one. They were also accused of starting a fire, which burned for about 6 days, left more than a 100,000 people homeless, and destroyed more than half of the city. Emperor Nero consequently banned Christianity and started the persecutions that lasted for 250 years.

composed of a soft rock of combs were constructed at

volcanic origin, which is called "tufa." The pre-Christian Romans had very adequately developed the technique of excavating deep into this tufa to form their "Caemetaria" (underground cemeteries) which contained "Columbaria" (pigeonhole niches for the cremated remains).

The Christians who came later were in quite a dilemma. They could not bury their deceased within the city walls because the law did not permit it, and any kind of funeral service either within or without the walls would expose them to arrest and persecution. The excavation work for the catacombs was a necessary function brought about by the geology of the area, their religious beliefs, and the social attitudes of the party in power at that time.

Outside the walls of ancient Rome, there were about 15 main roads radiating out from The hills of Rome are mainly the city. About 25 great catavarious locations near these roads. It is estimated that the combined length of the tunnels in all of these catacombs was 350, and that they contained about 6,000,000, deceased. Corridors were generally about 30 inches wide, with "loculi" (shelves) in tiers on both sides. These underground cities of the dead were built from one to five stories deep. The depth never exceeded 75 because this would bring them below the volcanic crust and into the humid clay. The stratum chosen for these underground labyrinths was sufficiently hard to support the weight from above, yet soft enough to excavate the seemingly endless tunnels. The secrecy of their location was maximized by taking the excavated material from the newly formed tunnels and packing it into the old and fully occupied ones. The difficult chore of raising the debris to the surface and undoubtedly revealing their location was thus eliminated. Stairs, airshafts, and some light shafts were built as the advantages of the terrain presented themselves.

The countryside around pagan Rome was literally undermined by these tunnels. During the height of the Christian persecutions, the catacombs, which were not backfilled, housed as many of the living (in hiding) as they contained of the dead. The Catacombs of St. Callistus (Calixtus) and those of St. Sebastian on the Appian Way are probably the most popular tourist attractions today. The bodies of St. Peter and St. Paul were originally buried close to the spot where they were martyred. Later they were exhumed and hidden temporarily in the Catacombs of St. Sebastian.

# Appointment Hours to Customers 65 or Older in April

The Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles (RMV) is pleased to announce that it is expanding designated Wednesday in-person appointment hours for seniors from those 75 years of age or older to those 65 years of age or older. Beginning March 24, 2021, customers who are 65 years of age or older will be able to book in-person transaction appointments in April during designated Wednesday senior hours online at *Mass.Gov/RMV*. Services that are available for customers during designated senior hours include driver's license and ID renewals and registration and title transactions.

Senior appointment hours for license or ID renewals, and registration and title services appointments are offered on Wednesdays at the following 17 RMV Service Center locations (hours vary by location): Brockton, Danvers, Fall River, Greenfield, Lawrence, Leominster, Martha's Vineyard, Nantucket, New Bedford, North Adams, Pittsfield, Plymouth, Revere, South Yarmouth, Springfield, Watertown, and Worcester.

Below are the options for anyone 65 years of age or older to schedule in-person appointments during designated service hours:

- If you are a AAA member, you may make a reservation now to renew your driver's license/ID or conduct certain other transactions at a AAA location. Visit: *aaa.com/appointments* to schedule your visit.
- If you are not a AAA member, visit: Mass.Gov/RMV to make a reservation to renew or conduct most other transactions at an RMV Service Center. Visit the Make/Cancel a Reservation transaction tab in the myRMV Service Center and select "Senior Transaction" for all available RMV transactions. Reservations can be booked two weeks in advance.
- Email the RMV for assistance: MassDOTRMVSeniors@dot. state.ma.us.
- Call the RMV at 857-368-8005.

General appointments for license and ID renewals or registration and title transactions, as well as other essential in-person needs including drop-off registration and title services, are available to all customers at select locations throughout the business week.

Additional information on RMV service offerings and appointments can be found at: <code>www.Mass.Gov/RMV</code>, including more than 40 transactions that can be conducted online, by mail, or by phone. The RMV recommends that all customers get ready online before their appointment.

Anyone conducting in-person business at an RMV customer service location must wear a face-covering and will continue to be served by appointment only. Appointments for many RMV transactions can also be made at AAA customer locations if the customer is a member of AAA.

# L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Italy's Holy Week, Sacred and Festive

Obviously, advice on gatherings and reunions contained within are not applicable to this current time when social distancing (and mask wearing!) is the best practice. Please read these articles as a testament to the joy and love that imbues Italian celebrations — and as suggestions for ways to spend time in the future once this pandemic is finally over.



cold early spring fogs, in which every raindrop feels like the pinprick of an ice crystal, I look forward to the promise of Easter, around me as surely as the first purple tulips spring from the rich soil. Marshmallow Peeps wink playfully at me as they line shop selves in brilliant hues ranging from robin's egg blue to bright tutu pink. Baskets and wreaths boast eggs dyed with bold solid colors or glittery patinas. At the mall, costumed Easter Bunnies pose for family photos with children in frilly dresses and crooked bowties. However, as much as the coming Easter fills me with pleasant anticipation, I am reminded that the week preceding the holiday brims with its own unique customs and traditions. The week's very name, Holy Week, reveals its profound importance in the religious year. Italians call Holy Week la Settimana Santa and celebrate its arrival with much fanfare. The Holy Week festivities in Italy emphasize seasonal spring folklore while also paying homage to the intricate and inspiring spirituality of this period. Whether filled with displays of palm leaves or colorful eggs, Holy Week in Italy and around the world heralds the Easter holiday with the reverence, love and joy it deserves.

Jerusalem, when adoring crowds for the joy of Easter. welcomed Him by waving palm

After the damp and bitterly Sunday remains attuned to the seasonal beat of spring, symbolically falling during the time of the year when tree branches begin to blossom. My father grew the premiere holiday of the up in the mountainous region season. Signs of Easter sprout of the Abruzzi in Italy, where he would spend Palm Sunday, or Domenica delle Palme, collecting the olive branches that grew plentifully in the hills and fields near his home. This was the same country wilderness, laden with ancient orchards and thick forests, about which village elders whispered stories of sprites hiding under rocks and wolves darting among the trees. My father and his friends would then bring the branches to the local parish, where the priest would bless them. This quaint sylvan ritual embodied all the pleasures of spring, such as communal outdoor excursions and metaphorical links to the themes of rebirth and spiritual awakening. Throughout Holy Week, Italians also give their homes a thorough spring cleaning in preparation for Easter and the days of visiting to follow. Holy Week ends with Good Friday, or Venerdí Santo, the solemn remembrance of Jesus's Crucifixion. In Italy, processions of black-robed participants set the somber and pensive atmosphere of the day. Processions that focus on the Virgin Mary are known as the Addolorata, a name indicative of Mary's grief Holy Week begins this year and pain. Saturday, for decorating eggs with my brother and me. Eggs have formed an integral part of Easter celebrations since ancient times due to their rebirth symbolism: though they appear cold and sterile on the outside, they contain new life inside. I always enjoyed picking the egg dyes, and I would often choose a bright or glittery color to match the cheerful hues of the flowers growing outside my home. Easter eggs form a sweet part of Italian holiday customs as well. During Holy Week, my father would always buy a gigantic chocolate uovo di Pasqua (literally, "Easter egg") from a specialty shop in the North End, wrapped in pastel foil. We would patiently wait until Easter to ceremoniously break the egg open, eagerly anticipating the treats concealed within — usually candy. An Italian superstition decrees that everyone must wear at least one new piece of clothing on Easter, again illustrating the theme of renewal central to the holiday, and as such my mom and I would often shop for a new outfit t during Holy Week. When I was a child, this meant a lacy, flowery dress. Though I no longer seek out itchy dresses, I do pick my new clothes with bright colors or a flowered pattern to reflect the spring season. Finally, my mother and I spend much of Holy Week planning our Easter menu. On Holy Saturday, I bake my traditional Italian ricotta pie to be served at the feast the next day. Therefore, I associate Holy Week with the joy and promise of an exciting holiday to come. Its customs have instilled in me an appreciation for the blooming new season of spring, for the spirituality of Easter, and for my Italian heritage as a whole. Holy Week is a profound and

multifaceted period of the year. It revels in the springtime and the resurgence of nature all around us, from the flowers fluttering proudly in the sunlight to the bunnies munching on the fresh green grass. It grants us an opportunity to enjoy the warm spring weather and to find peace and reflection in the spiritual traditions of the pre-Easter season. In Italy, people honor Holy Week by engaging in symbolic rituals like collecting olive branches on Palm Sunday, cleaning their homes, and decorating eggs. No matter which customs we take to heart, we should celebrate them in a way that expresses gratitude toward nature and the cycle of the year. Easter, after all, is the supreme holiday of hope and rebirth, and Holy Week encapsulates that feeling. Holy Week teaches us that if we live in harmony with nature and with respect for the ways of our ancestors, we will find a strength inside us brighter than any spring sun.

This display of patriotism was sponsored by the MassGOP's anti-censorship campaign, which aims to spread awareness of the alarming trend of censoring conservative speech in the online public square. Or anywhere else for that matter!


#### **CHAPTER 43** Grandma Speaks

# Saint Jean-Gabriel Perboyre

Jean-Gabriel was born in 1802 at Le Puech, Lot, France, one of eight children born to Pierre Perboyre and Marie Rigal, who ran a farm. In 1816, his younger brother, Louis, was accepted into the Vincentian seminary recently founded in Mintauban. Jean-Gabriel was asked by their parents to accompany his brother until he had adapted to his new environment. To his surprise, Jean-Gabriel felt drawn to follow this life himself

On the feast of the Holy Innocents, 1820, Jean-Gabriel took the four vows of the Vincentians. He was



ordained on September 23, 1825, at the age of 23 and taught theology at the seminary before being appointed rector, and later master of novices in Paris because of the sanctity his superiors saw in him.

His younger brother, Louis, died on his way to preach in China at the age of 24 and Jean-Gabriel asked to carry out the mission that had been entrusted to his brother. He arrived on the island of Macao on August 29, 1835, and set out for the mainland later that year.

He carried out his evangelical labors in Ho-Nan for three years before being transferred to Hou-Pé. His missions bore much fruit in the short time he spent there.

On September 11, 1839, Jean-Gabriel became one of the first victims of the persecutions against Christians, dying in a manner, which had a striking resemblance to the passion of our Lord. He was betrayed for a sum of silver, stripped of his garments and dragged from tribunal to tribunal. At each trial, he was treated inhumanly and tortured. Finally, he was taken to Ou-Tchang-Fou, and after being tortured, was condemned to death. The sentence was ratified by an imperial edict, and on September 11, 1840, Jean-Gabriel was led to death with seven criminals. He was crucified and died on a cross.

Canonized on June 2, 1996 by Pope John Paul II, St. Jean Gabriel Perboyre is the first saint of China. The Feast of Saint Jean-Gabriel Perboyre is September 11<sup>th</sup>.



# Nanna & Babbononno

A Nostalgic Remembrance



Babbononno used to tell me that we Bostonians were a bit different than people from other cities in Massachusetts. He insisted that he had to learn Boston English and in-bred terminologies to survive as a young man whose first language was a dialect of Italian. As a child growing up in East Boston, I heard all of the clichés, expressions, and slang terms that peppered casual conversations and accepted them as standard applications for communication, that is, until I heard people from foreign locations (like New York City, Brooklyn, and northern New Jersey) speak English.

New Yorkers drink egg creams, a beverage with no eggs nor cream included. New Yorkers MAKE a right turn when driving. They never TAKE a right like we do.

They eat pizza pie, not pizza. To Boston Italians, pizza translates to pie, so pizza pie means pie-pie. New Yorkers seemed to have a fixation with sounds not heard in Boston English. Years ago, when we headed to New York to visit family, I had to accept the foreign accent used by my relatives. Even their Italian was punctuated with a New York sound and it seemed strange to me a young kid from "Eese Bostin."

Recently, my dear friend, Dick DeVito, sent me an article on New Englanders, and Bostonians in particular. We are in a category all our own. His words correspond to a lot of the things Babbononno taught me when I was still in short pants. Here is a portion of them that make us unique:

Roxbury is the geographical center of Boston. Due north is the South End. But, South Boston is directly east of the South End. North of the South End is East Boston and southwest of East Boston is the North End. There is no school on School Street, no court on Court Street, no dock at Dock Square, and no water on Water Street.

Back Bay streets are in alphabetical order, Arlington, Berkeley, Clarendon, Dartmouth, Exeter, Fairfield, Gloucester, Hereford, etc. ... South Boston streets follow a similar pattern, A, B, C, & D. If the streets are named after trees, you are on Beacon Hill, Walnut, Chestnut, Cedar, and Poplar. In East Boston's Eagle Hill district, the streets are named after battles of the Revolution, Monmouth, Eutaw, Trenton, Lexington, Princeton, Saratoga, and Bennington.

Massachusetts Ave., is Mass Ave., Commonwealth Ave., is Comm Ave., South Boston is Southie. East Boston is Eastie.

The North End is east of the former West End. The West End and Scollay Square were torn down in the 60s, but the names are still used especially by us old timers. Jamaica Plain is J.P. Roxbury is the Berry. Roslindale is Rawzzy. But, the South End is called the South End. Boston proper is down town.

There are two State Houses, two City Halls, two courthouses, two Hancock buildings, one very old and one relatively new. There are colored lights atop the old Hancock building: Solid blue, clear view ... Flashing blue, clouds due ... solid red, rain ahead ... flashing red, snow instead (in the summer flashing red means the Red Sox game was rained out).

Route 128 south is I-95 south and it is also I-93 north. The underground train, America's oldest, is not called a subway the Underground, or the Metro; it is the T, and doesn't run all night. Trains, and trolleys are color-coded: the Blue Line, the Red Line, the Green Line, the Orange line, the Silver Line and the Purple Line. Each goes in a different direction and to different locations.

If you order cold tea in Chinatown after 2:00 a.m., you will be given a teapot filled with beer or liquor. Don't tell anyone

Bostonians think that it is a God-given right to cut off someone in traffic. We also think there are only 25 letters in the alphabet (no Rs.) We think that three straight days of 90-degree temperatures constitutes a heat wave. We call six inches of snow a dusting. In traffic, we don't make a right like those New Yorkers, we bang a right, and to make a U-turn, we bang a Uey. If we do either without using our directionals, the on-coming traffic expects it. To us, using turn signals is a sign of weakness or cowardice.

Bostonians think that 63degree ocean water is warm enough to swim in. Outsiders who meet us hear our accents and often say, "Pahk your cah in Hahvid Yahd," without knowing that you cannot park in Harvard Yard. It is a series of walkways between a maze of academic buildings. Many will say, "Meffah" when they refer to Medford, but people who live there usually call it Meffid. And, Somerville is Summahvil.

Do nots: Do not try to fall asleep on Boston Common. Don't wear orange in Southie, especially on St. Patrick's Day. Oddities: The Red Sox are the Sox; Celtics are the Celts, the Bruins, the B's, and the Patriots, the Pats. Worcester is Wustah, Gloucester is Glawstah, Woburn

Frappes are made with ice cream, milk shakes are not. If it is carbonated and flavored, it is not soda pop or pop, it is tonic. When we want tonic water, we ask for tonic water.

The smallest Boston beer is a pint. Scrod is whatever they tell you it is, usually white fish. A water fountain is a bubblah. A trashcan is a barrel. A hero, grinder, or a hoagie is a sub. A shopping cart is a carriage. A purse is a pocketbook. We don't eat franks, we eat hot dawgs. Boston Police don't drive patrol cars or black and whites, they drive crewzas. A rubber band is an elastic. A traffic circle isn't a roundabout or traffic circle, it is a rotary. Going to the islands for us is going to Martha's Vineyard or Nantucket.

One last thing ... if you drive in Boston, don't ever expect to understand the street patterns. The streets were designed by cows making their way to Boston Common in the 1700s, and those pathways were later paved over.

I once asked Babbononno why he stayed in Boston if all of the above was problematic. Why didn't he move to New York, New Jersey, or some other location where there were Italians? He thought for a minute and said, "We Bostonians have something missing in most places ... We have CLASS". (I believed him, and still do.) Stay safe and:

In Italian American homes on Easter Sunday one dessert you are almost sure to find is Torta di Riso (Rice Pie). This well-loved pie is a variant of its original predecessor, Pastiera Di Grano (Wheat Pie). It is said

that Pastiera Di Grano was initially created by the nuns from the San Gregorio Armeno convent in Naples. Using ingredients that symbolically recollected the resurrection, such as eggs, ricotta, candied fruit, and wheat, these nuns became renowned for their pastiera. Every Easter they prepared it in large quantities to be given out to the affluent families of the city. The Torta di Riso is a variation that was created in the Campania region, by replacing the wheat in the recipe with rice. Due to Salerno's limited access to wheat, and abundance of excellent rice fields. This recipe spread rapidly throughout Southern Italy, and eventually became one of the most widely recognized Italian Easter pies of all times!

In my home, Easter was always spent enjoying traditional foods and desserts with family and close friends. For dessert, my Nonna would always make Cassateddi, Ricotta Pie, Sweet Tarralli, and being from Southern Italy, her much loved Pastiera di Riso (Italian Rice Pie). Though I love Pastiera di Riso, I thought I'd share a recipe that is very old and was given to my Nonna for Pastiera Di Grano (Wheat Pie) or as some refer, Pastiera Napoletana. This pie has several steps to creating it and traditionally it should be made no later than Holy Thursday or Good Friday, which allows its flavors to meld together perfectly. Encased in a golden shortcrust pastry with a sweet citrus scented ricotta wheat filling, Pastiera Di Grano is one of the oldest Neapolitan Easter desserts and not only is it absolutely beautiful to look at, it is also incredibly delicious to eat! This recipe is just perfect, I hope you enjoy it! Buona Pasqua!

#### **EASTER WHEAT PIE** Pastiera Di Grano

#### Wheat Berries (Grano)

1 cup skinless grano wheat (soaked for 3 days and well rinsed) or 1 jar (grano cotto) cooked wheat

1 cup milk

Zest of one organic lemon 2 tablespoons butter

## Filling

2 cups ricotta

1 cup granulated sugar

4 eggs, separated

1 ½ tablespoons vanilla extract

1 teaspoon orange zest

1/4 cup candied orange peel, finally chopped (optional)

1 teaspoon lemon zest (optional) ½ teaspoon cinnamon (optional)

# (sweet shortcrust pastry)

2 cups all-purpose flour 3/4 cup plus 2 tablespoons

confectioners' sugar

1 stick unsalted butter, softened 1 egg

1 egg yolk

Pasta Frolla

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 teaspoon orange zest 1 ½ teaspoons vanilla extract

½ teaspoon cinnamon

(optional) 1 to 2 tablespoons milk, as needed

#### Egg Wash

1 egg beaten with 2 tablespoons water

#### To make wheat berries and filling:

If using fresh wheat, after soaking and rinsing it for 3 days, rinse well and drain. Place wheat in a saucepan, cover with water and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for about an hour to an hour and a half, periodically stirring. Drain and set aside.

In a medium saucepan place cooked wheat (either fresh, jarred or canned) and add milk, lemon zest, butter and mix well. Simmer over medium heat for about 25 minutes, until wheat thickens and liquid is almost absorbed, set aside to cool.

In large bowl, beat egg yolks with sugar and softened butter until combined. Add the cooked wheat mixture, extracts and spices, and combine well. Set aside.

In a small mixing bowl, beat the egg whites until stiff peaks form. Using a spatula, gently fold into the ricotta wheat mixture. Refrigerate while making crust.

## To make shortcrust pastry:

In a medium bowl, sift together flour and confectioners' sugar. Add orange zest, spices and salt and blend together. Cut in butter with a pastry blender or hands and mix until mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Mix in beaten egg and egg yolk and vanilla extract. Knead together and add milk as needed. Divide dough into 2 balls, one using 3/4 of the dough and the other using 1/4. Wrap in plastic, and chill for at least 30 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 350°. Grease and flour a 9-inch springform pan. Line the bottom and sides of the prepared pan with ¾ of the dough mixture. Take the remaining 1/4 of the dough, roll out and cut with a lattice cutter into narrow strips for the top of the crust.

Gently add the ricotta wheat filling and spread evenly into the prepared dough lined springform pan. Top pie with strips of dough. Brush top of pie crust with egg wash. Bake in a 350° oven for 1 hour or until slightly firm. Do not overcook. Allow pie to cool in the oven with the door open. Refrigerate and let it stay overnight before serving.

#### Dog - Gone- Found: 13 Years Later

The Fox family of Nashville, TN never forgot the day someone in a red Dodge pickup stopped in front of their home and snatched their Yorkshire Terrier from the front yard. They searched for weeks but were never able to find the red pickup truck or their little dog.

More than 13 years had passed when Karen Fox received a voicemail on March 4th from the company that owned the microchip she had put in the dog named Connor. A second call came from Nashville's Animal Control office telling her someone had brought the dog in after she saw it wandering the streets.

Better still when Karen Fox arrived at the shelter, Connor, now 16, walked up to her and licked her face.

#### Anti-Asian Violence Growing in America?

On Tuesday night (March 16<sup>th</sup>), eight lives were violently stolen in Georgia — six of whom were Asian women.

These murders are a jarring reminder of the grave threat posed by white supremacy, misogyny, and racism directed at AAPI people in all of our communities. In the face of this persistent racism and violence, we stand in solidarity and deep compassion with our AAPI family in Georgia and across the

the trauma has only deepened as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which has led to an increase in anti-Asian rhetoric and violence.

While the above storyline is now being questioned as new facts come in by law enforcement indicating that the killing spree may not have been racial motivated. Biden and Democrats signed into law a \$1.9 trillion relief package, while also admitting it was too soon to say if these murders were anti-Asian in nature. After all, why let a murderer not be a racist if it is good for the narrative out there. It turns out according to multiple news sources, the suspect may have simply killed because massage parlors and not the race of those inside were his targets.

# Post Winter Care for Your Lawn

by Melinda Myers

As winter gives way to spring take a walk around the yard. Check the lawn for damage and provide a bit of early season care to help it recover from

Use a leaf rake to lightly lift and separate the matted grass blades. This helps speed drying, increase airflow, and reduce the risk of pink and gray snow mold developing and damaging your lawn.

These fungal diseases are most common when heavy snowfalls or ice covers nonfrozen turf or after late winter snowstorms. The damage is usually seen where snow lingers late in the season.

Symptoms appear as circular areas of matted brown grass. You may even see a gray or pink cobweb-like growth over these areas. Fortunately, lawns eventually recover. Reduce the risk of future problems with proper timing of lawn fertilization.

Remove any leaves or debris that ended up on the lawn. Large leaves on the grass capture moisture and prevent sunlight from reaching the plants below. Use leaves you collect as mulch in the garden or add to the compost pile.

Look for vole trails in the lawn. These small rodents travel beneath the snow and over the grass in search of food all winter long. Their travels create trails of bare or dead grass. The surrounding grass will eventually fill in the damaged areas. Speed recovery by sprinkling grass seed over the trails. Just mix a handful of grass seed in a mop bucket of topsoil to make a lawn patch. Sprinkle the mixture in the trails, gently tamp and

Check areas along walks, drives and the street for deicing salt damage. Even if you don't apply deicing salts, passing cars can spray it onto your lawn. Your car also brings home salt as it travels along salted roadways, depositing salty snow onto the drive.

Make sure these areas receive sufficient water this spring. Regular spring showers often do the job. Thoroughly water these areas during dry springtime weather to help wash the salt past the grass roots into the soil below. Consider shoveling first and using plant-friendly deicing salts in the future. This will

reduce the need for deicing salts and reduce the time and money spent repairing salt-damaged plants.

Use this time to sharpen your mower blades. Using sharp blades to cut the grass results in a healthier and better-looking lawn. The clean cut made by a sharp blade closes quickly, reducing the risk of disease problems. Sharp blades also save time as you can cut the grass more efficiently. And speaking of savings, your mower will consume 22% less fuel and the lawn will use up to 30% less water when using sharp blades.

Soon it will be time to mow the lawn. Mow high and often, leaving grass clippings on the lawn to add organic matter, moisture, and nutrients to the soil. Always sweep clippings off walks and the drive to keep this

And to top it all off it went into overtime. You just can't get much better than that. That was the marvelous matchup between Northeastern University and the University

the best day of winter. The UW Badgers had entered the title contest as defending national champions — already owning five national titles. Indeed, they had captured national laurels in 2006, 2007, 2009, 2011, and 2019. Their chance to try for a sixth was delayed until this month since the 2020 event was not held due to COVID-19 protocols.

But even their coach, Mark Johnson, who was behind the bench for all of those championships, could go one better than that cluster of laurels. For he had been fortunate enough to experience hockey's glory of glories earlier in his life. Some four decades earlier he had been a member of the 1980 USA "Miracle on Ice" Olympic Team that had won the game of games, defeating the super powerful Soviet Union in the semifinals at Lake Placid, N.Y. and then going on to win the gold medal with another come-from-behind victory over Finland two days later.

In contrast, it was all on the line for the Huskies as they were attempting to earn the first national championship in any sport over the course of Northeastern's lengthy institutional history. NU makes its home at the oldest facility still in use for hockey (Matthews Arena, opened in 1910 as Boston Arena), but now the story line had been distilled into one memorable three-hour experience on a late March evening more than a century later.

To be sure the Huskies had certainly earned their right to be at center stage for this event.

They entered the contest as the top ranked team in the nation as selected by the two national polls that follow women's college hockey. In addition, they owned a 22-game unbeaten streak and had won their last 18 straight games. They had won a national best 54 games over the past two seasons. Coming into the title contest the Huskies led the NCAA in winning percentage (.938), shutouts (10), goals (108) and power play goals (18).

Credit must be given to head coach Dave Flint, who came aboard on Huntington Avenue back in 2008. Over the course of the years that followed, one could certainly envision the coming of this moment.

Most recently there had been four consecutive appearances in the NCCA tournament (2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019). The Huskies also earned a bid to the 2020 tournament that was not played in addition to a berth in this year's event. Last year, before COVID-19 put the brakes on everything, NU went a stunning 32-4-2, winning the Beanpot, Hockey East regular season and Hockey East tournament titles in the process. He was named the 2021 Women's Division Coach of the Year by the American Hockey Coaches Association. He has won the Hockey East Coach of the Year honors three consecutive years (2019, 2020, and 2021).

For more than two and a half periods these two powerful teams dueled to a scoreless tie. Then within the space of a mere 39 seconds both teams scored and the deadlock resumed.

A key moment came with just over five minutes remaining when Wisconsin was called for a penalty, giving a player advantage to NU for the next two minutes. But UW managed to kill it off and the third period ended in a tie. It would take more than the normal three periods to determine the national champion of the 2020-2021 season in women's college hockey.

As befitting a contest of this magnitude, it was a goal by one of the nation's best players that brought the game to its conclusion. It came with just 3:16 having gone by in the overtime session. Wisconsin's Daryl Watts, the leading scorer in women's college hockey this season, got possession of the puck behind the NU goal, then intentionally banked a shot off the back of Northeastern defender Megan Carter, a shot that wound up crossing the crease and giving UW a 2-1 victory.

Watts said in the postgame press conference that she saw an opportunity to create the bank shot and went for it. The win brought a momentous mountain of joy to Madison, the hometown of UW as the community celebrated the Badgers' sixth national title.

Not so up along Huntington Avenue where NU was experiencing a disappointing end to a terrific season (22-1-1). No need to hang their heads, however. Just instead look straight ahead and remember all the victories that brought them to the title game in a season that was, in so many ways, unlike any other.

NAMED AFTER A TIME-PIECE, HE BECAME ONE OF THE GREATEST OF ALL **TIME** — That's certainly a way to think of NBA superstar Elgin Baylor, who died on March 22 at age 86. Named for his father's favorite watch (an Elgin), Baylor went on to become an All-American at Seattle University before embarking on his storied 14-year NBA career with the Lakers. He was the first player to score over 70 points in a game (December 11, 1960). He played in eight NBA Finals with the Lakers, losing to the Bill Russell-led Celtics seven times and the Knicks once. He played in 11 All-Star Games, was voted one of the top 50 players in NBA history back in 1996, and had career averages of 27.4 points and 13.5 rebounds per game. He was elected to the Basketball Hall of Fame in 1977. Named for a watch, he was certainly worth watching because Elgin was excellent.
