### **Mayor Janey Announces Indoor Mask Mandate for City of Boston**

Mayor Kim Janey announced face masks will be required in all indoor public settings in the City of Boston, as part of a Five-Point Plan for the Delta Variant. The public health order, issued by the Boston Public Health Commission, is effective at 8:00 a.m. on Friday, August 27th in the City of Boston. The City is implementing this proactive public health plan to mitigate community transmission of the Delta variant, ahead of the arrival of more than 50,000 college students from across the country and a return to school for more than 50,000 Boston Public Schools students. Most of the 100,000 children who live in the City of Boston are too young to be eligible for vaccination.

"There is nothing more important than Boston's safe recovery, reopening, and renewal from the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic," said Mayor Janey.

"We know that masks work best when everyone wears one. Requiring masks indoors is a proactive public health measure to limit transmission of the Delta variant, boost the public confidence in our businesses and venues, and protect the residents of our city who are too young for vaccination."

"The Delta variant continues to create an additional challenge to stopping the spread of COVID-19 in our community," said Rita Nieves, the Interim Executive Director of the Boston Public Health Commission. "Wearing a mask indoors along with getting more people vaccinated will offer more protection to all our residents, including children under 12 and those who are not able to get vaccinated."

Through an order from the Boston Public Health Commission, the City of Boston will require all people over age two to wear a mask or face covering:

• Whenever they are indoors on the premises of a business, club, place of assembly or other place that is open to members of the public, including but not limited to retail establishments, restaurants, bars, performance venues, social clubs, event spaces, and municipal buildings.

Face coverings may be removed when actively eating or drinking. Masks must be worn for all other indoor activities, including ordering at a bar or dancing. Masks are also required in gyms. The order does not apply to gatherings in private residences when no compensation is paid, private buildings that are inaccessible to the public, places of worship, private work spaces inaccessible to the public, or performers who maintain six feet of distance from their audience.

Mayor Janey's new face covering order builds on the City's ongoing efforts to address the COVID-19 Delta Variant. The Five Point Plan for the Delta Variant includes:

- 1. Equitable vaccine and booster access
- 2. Vaccine mandate for city workers
- 3. New HVAC investments for schools
- 4. Mask mandate for schools and city buildings
- 5. New mask mandate in all public spaces

"Boston's five-point plan for the Delta variant places vaccination and prevention at the center of our COVID-19 response," said Mayor Janey. "I ask that every resident of Boston do their part to keep our city safe. Get vaccinated, wear your mask, wash your hands, and get tested, especially if you have traveled, are experiencing symptoms, or have been Boston is one of the most vaccinated large cities in the country, with over 68 percent of residents having at least one shot. In the last two weeks, nearly 8,000 residents got their first dose of the vaccine. By the end of August, all City employees, contractors, and volunteers will be required to verify their vaccination status through a secure centralized digital portal.

Mayor Janey has also committed \$30 million to improve heating, ventilation, and air conditioning in Boston Public School buildings. The wideranging HVAC installations and upgrades will be performed throughout the coming school year.

The new mask requirement was welcomed by leaders of the healthcare and arts sectors that have been among the most impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

### Biden Forcing Vax Mandate

The Biden White House has wasted no time this past Monday after the FDA gave full approval to Pfizer's COVID-19 vaccine. Biden now urges businesses, organizations, and governments to make the vaccine mandatory for workers.

Biden stated, "If you're a business leader, a state or local leader who has been waiting for full FDA approval to require vaccinations, I call on you to do that ... it makes only sense to require a vaccine to stop the spread of COVID-19."

Moderna's vaccine is expected to get full approval within weeks.

accompanied by Italian street bands, drum & bugle corps, flower girls and color guard.



#### THE MAN OF ROME

The history of ancient Rome is easily divided into three separate and distinct periods. These were known as:

- 1. **Regal Rome**, the period of seven kings starting with Romulus in 750 B.C. and ending with Lucius Tarquinius Superbus in 510 B.C.
- 2. **The Republic**, starting with the death of the above-mentioned Lucius and ending in 27 B.C. shortly after the death of Julius
- 3. **The Empire**, starting with Augustus in 27 B.C. and ending with the pitiful Romulus Augustulus in 475 A.D.

Romulus was the founder of Rome and its first king. In earlier years, people scoffed at the idea that a real Romulus did exist, but this indeed was the true name that belonged to an early builder of Rome. There may or may not have been a she-wolf, but as to the existence of Romulus, or "The Man of Rome" as some have called him, later discoveries present a great mass of evidence and most details are supported by monumental remains.

The Wall of Romulus, small parts of which are still visible at different points around the Palatine Hill, enclosed a space, which was called "Roma Quadrata" by the ancient historians because of its quadrangular shape. This enclosed space, an area of about 24-acres, is said to be where the Rome of history begins.

Contemporary with Romulus and his Palatine Hill was Tatius the Sabine, whose tribe occupied the Capital Hill.

In this location and to this period of time also belongs the story of the Sabine girls who were carried off after being invited with their parents to attend some rustic games in the long valley between the Palatine and the Aventine Hills (the site of the Circus Maximus) in an interval of peace. A second peace treaty between Romulus and Tatius was short-lived, and ended with the violent death of Tatius the Sabine, followed shortly thereafter by the death of Romulus the Roman. As startling or strange as it may seem, Romulus was the first and last Roman King of Rome. There were seven kings during this first historical period called Regal Rome. Romulus was the first. The next three were the Sabines, Numa Pompilius, Tullus Hostillus, and Ancus Marcius. The last three were Etruscans named Lucius Tarquinius Priscus, Servius Tullius, and Lucius Taraquinius Superbus.

If you were introduced to the last six at a cocktail party, how many names could you remember? As an afterthought, I might add that if you were introduced to any one of the seven at a cocktail party, I'd like to know what the h\_ \_ \_ you had to drink.

### Saint Lydia Purpuraria

Saint Lydia was born during the first century in Thyatira, a town famous for its dye works in Asia Minor. Not much is known about her life. The second part of her name "Purpuraria" was not really her name, but she is called this because it means "merchant of purple." In the Bible (Acts 16:12-30), we are told she was Saint Paul's first convert to the Christian faith in the colonial Roman city of Philippi (Acts 16:11-15), located in the district of Macedonia, making Lydia also the first documented European convert of Saint Paul.

She was so excited about Paul's message that she and her entire household were baptized and then she invited Paul and his companions to stay at her home. Lydia was a woman of hospitality, a woman of faith. As a successful merchant, she most likely had a home



spacious enough to welcome guests and to use her home as a Christian center, where others would gather for the Holy Mass and prayer. After Paul and Silas were released from prison, they went immediately to Lydia's

house to see and encourage the believers gathered there. Saint Paul and his companions in Philippi stayed with her until their departure, through Amphipolis and Apollonia, to Thessalonica. Lydia served the Lord through her gift of hospitality by welcoming others into her home.

Patron Saint of cloth dyers, the Feast Day of Saint Lydia Purpuraria is August 3rd

It took thousands of mollusks to make only an ounce of dye. Because of this, purple cloth was rare and expensive, it was worn only by royalty and rich and important people. Dealing in luxury goods, Lydia would have owned a big house and had the means to support the Christian cause. Lydia Purpuraria made a good living and she was generous with her earnings and now two thousand years later, we are still grateful for her kindness and the color purple, which helped start the spread of Christianity.

### Fitchburg State University Building a Strong Foundation

The Center for Italian Culture turns 20 this year, and celebrates a history of supporting students

Anna M. Clementi recalls the founding of the Center for Italian Culture (CIC) at Fitchburg State University with a transformative gift from Amelia V. Gallucci-Cirio. "It was not designed to be a social club," Clementi said. "It was to have an educational foundation."

And that it has. In its 20 years, the CIC has helped build and support world language programs, created opportunities for students and faculty to study abroad, and sustained a rich series of programs to entertain and enlighten residents of North Central Massachusetts.

For Clementi, one of the center's founding members and its current president, the CIC has been a tool to support the liberal arts and sciences and the critical thinking skills such study fosters.

"You need the liberal arts," said Clementi, who also served on the university's Board of Trustees. "The liberal arts teach you how to think critically and support the formation of your soul, and contribute to the humanity in a person. I feel strongly that the CIC has been instrumental in keeping that going."

CIC scholarships have brought study abroad opportunities within reach of dozens of students over the years, exposing them not only to world languages, but supporting other curricular areas. Courses on Roman history and the biology of the Mediterranean diet are among the many offerings that have been made possible thanks to its funding.

Professor Daniel Sarefield of the Economics, History and Political Science Department teaches ancient history and Latin, and has served on the CIC's board since 2007. He has seen firsthand the transformative power of the CIC's support.

"Through its scholarships directly to the students, the Center for Italian Culture has enabled many students who would otherwise be unable to do so to fly to Italy and live there for enough time to really get to know Verona in an intimate way and to develop a connection to its past and present," he said. "In this way, the CIC supports the goal of our students becoming global citizens who are able to foster understanding across peoples and cultures."

Sarefield has led students on four university-sponsored trips to Verona, Italy, where he has taught courses on life in the Roman city and reading Latin inscriptions. The voyages have animated the subject matter in powerful ways.

"The objective of my Verona courses has always been to provide my students with opportunities to probe beneath the surface of Roman life," Sarefield said. "This is definitely the case with my history course. Over our four weeks in Verona, we locate, identify and explore the city's numerous Roman remains, many of which are still visible across the modern city today. We connect what we find in the field with the

historical texts that we read and discuss in our classroom at the University of Verona. In this way, we develop an understanding of ancient Roman life that integrates evidence of a variety of sources."

"The Latin courses are similarly enriched by the inperson experience of Verona, Sarefield" said Fitchburg State's Acting Associate Vice President for Academic Affairs Franca Barricelli said the CIC has enabled study across a variety of disciplines, from history and photography to exercise science and chemistry.

"As an academic resource, the CIC is a unique distinction of Fitchburg State," said Barricelli, who also serves on the CIC board. "It makes an important contribution to the academic mission of the university by enabling faculty, students, outside national and international scholars and community members to interact in ways that enhance learning and provide opportunities for research, outreach and collaboration. By encouraging global engagement through study abroad and the study of Italian and Latin language, history and culture at home, the CIC has advanced our foundational liberal arts objectives, which equip students for academic success and purposeful lives beyond college.

The CIC's reach extends beyond campus through a partnership with Fitchburg State's Archives and Special Collections within the Amelia V. Gallucci-Cirio Library. The CIC's collection includes donated materials from individuals, families, and organizations such as oral history interviews, photographs, research materials, physical objects, and media related to the history of Italian-Americans in the New England area.

The CIC knows there are many existing Italian-American heritage materials that need to be preserved, and realize that the baby-boomers who have been saving Italian-American related materials from their parents and grandparents are not seeing as much interest for such materials from the next generation. The CIC has been successful in collecting family histories, photographs, film and videos, postcards, and personal and business documents, and social club records, among other items.

The CIC Archives offers an excellent solution for donors who are questioning what to do with items that relate to their Italian heritage.

The CIC Archives at Fitchburg State will share and preserve these materials and make them available for scholarly research. Physical items will be made available for viewing in the archives and may be displayed on the CIC website. Those interested in donating items to the CIC should contact Fitchburg State's archivist at 978.665.4470.

### L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Lost and Found Treasure in Almanacs

If you stepped into my parents' old home on any given day, you would most likely have heard the television tuned in to the Italian language channel. I no longer batted an eye, for I have been used to this since practically the day I was born. Due to my father's love for the Italian channel, practically every day of my life has consisted of some variation of a silly variety show, hour-long quiz game, soccer match, Italian soap opera, or news program. While I used to find these shows rather goofy when I was little, I now appreciate them for helping me learn the Italian language and about Italian culture — I especially love the travel and science programs, and I now subscribe to this channel myself. However, my favorite show on the Italian channel has not aired for years, though one can catch some snippets online. It is called *Almanacco di Domani*. or Tomorrow's Almanac, and like most good things in my life, it was introduced to me by my dad. This quaint little fifteenminute show provided folkloristic, astronomical, and fun fact information pertaining to the upcoming day — birthdays, history, recipes, notable quotes, you name it! Even saying the name in my mind conjures images of cozy dark evenings spent curled up on my couch at home, listening to the zany music announce the details of the next day.

I just love almanacs because they celebrate seasonal time and tradition, which anyone reading this column knows I wholeheartedly embrace. Italian almanacs, whether in the form of the aforementioned television show or quick write-ups in local newspapers, are especially useful for anyone trying to find out more about the cus-

characterize his or her heritage. In Italian almanacs, you will almost always find the following:

1) The Saint of the Day: The calendar of saints is very important to Italian culture. Until not too long ago, this calendar often determined the name of the child born on a particular day. In this month of August, for example, you could have babies named Lorenzo (St. Lawrence's Day, August 10th), Assunta or Maria (Assumption of the Virgin Mary, August 15th), Elena (St. Helen's Day, August 18th), Bartolomeo (St. Bartholomew's Day, August 24th), or, as is the case in many a family, Rocco (St. Roch's Day, August 16th). If not named after the saint on his or her birthday, an Italian might otherwise receive well wishes on their onomastico--that is, the feast day of the saint with whom the person shares their moniker. The feast days of saints are also interesting for the holiday and seasonal lore associated with them. The Assumption, for example, acquired many customs related to the start of the grain and first-fruits harvest, which, like the feast day, occurred around mid-August.

2) The Sun and Moon: Like American almanacs, Italian almanacs will also tell the rising and setting times of the sun and the moon. In olden times, farmers would have found this information very useful. Superstition parceled out various agricultural tasks to certain phases of the moon, such as planting crops during the period when the moon grows in the sky to ensure a similar result. Of course, nights with a full moon promised magic and mischief of all kinds. I like checking the rise and set of the sun in order to gauge seasonal changes. When the sun no longer sets after toms, beliefs and values that eight o'clock, as is happening

now. I know autumn is on its way. Similarly, I love watching the sunset time progressively grow longer after the winter solstice with the anticipation of the coming spring.

3) Household Hints: Trust me, Italians seem to have more practical uses for everyday household items like rubbing alcohol, baking powder, lemon juice and candle wax than I have ever heard. These little hints are cheap, environmentally sound and just like having a wise grandmother next to you dishing out advice! They definitively represent the more whimsical side of almanacs, true to the Italians' tradition of never taking themselves too seriously.

I love almanacs because they remind me that every day is special. Each day arrives laden with its own lore, history and curiosities. Almanacs teach us to always look forward, to keep hope and to always count even the smallest pleasures that a day can bestow. The staffers said they were told to head to the airport, and called their failed attempt a "brutal experience." They complained to the State Department about getting attacked. Some said they almost lost their kids while others were hospitalized after falling in a crush of panicky people all trying to flee the Taliban.

#### Taliban Still Pushing August 31st Deadline

The Taliban are warning America that extending the August 31st deadline would bring "consequences." They said, "It's a red line ... President Biden announced that on August 31st they would withdraw all their military forces. So, if they extend it, that means they are extending occupation while there is no need for that."

According to the Taliban, if the U.S. or UK were to seek additional time — "the answer is no" and would "create mistrust between us." The Taliban also reportedly have been beating and harassing folks as they pass through checkpoints en route to the airport. The airport itself is enveloped in chaos. Last week, a stampede of people crushed an Afghan toddler.

### Are There Really Cops Out There Who Like Escalating Situations?

"Many of the practices of the department in the past, such as mandated reporting of use of force incidents and an emphasis on de-escalation of potentially violent situations, will now be formally documented in the new policy."

As I reread that page one news story (Revere Advocate, August 13th) on Revere's new police policy on defusing police actions that sometimes have the capability of going sour in seconds, I wholeheartedly support Revere's new police policy in the wake of the State's Police Reform Act.

I was a police officer for the Massachusetts Department of Mental Health for 28 years (1985-2013) and I can say from first-hand experience, no police officer I have ever known or worked with believed in escalating a situation that could make matters much worse for all involved.

Hopefully, Sgt. Joseph Turner's presentation on use of force and training gave commission members an opportunity to hear just what "use of force" is and how it works. The use of force changes by the moment in some volatile situations, both up and down.

A big question always asked is how an officer determines what level of force to use. The answer to such a question is never black or white. As someone trained in the use of force, it is one thing to study the concept and quite another to put it into practice in a real situation.

The police officers I worked with and supervised sometimes found ourselves caught up in many gray areas when actually struggling with a non-compliant subject. Use of force will rise or fall depending on how an incident evolves or devolves. The object of an officer is to get compliance as easily and quickly as possible with the least bit of force.

The safest and most effective level of force is a police officer's voice and often most situations can end with just that level. However, in the real world, your voice isn't often enough, so you must start raising or lowering the level of force to the situation. Sometimes things can end quickly and without injury to all. Other times things can get messy. Sometimes things can even get toxic.

As a supervisor, I was involved in a number of takedowns over my law enforcement career and the most important thing is for an officer not to become overwhelmed by the incident. I would often have to guide the incident along. The last thing anyone wants to see happen is when a takedown starts to lose control I felt it was the job of a good supervisor to keep emotions as tame as possible before a bad stuff happens.

I remember one incident in which several officers were injured. I had no idea what it looked like until later when I saw the incident caught on video. Struggles always look bad on camera. This is the difference between watching a struggle and being in the middle of it.

As Sgt. Turner pointed out, "Whenever we use force, we are trying to stop some act or stopping some form of defiance of the law." I always supported the idea that you used force to gain compliance and not to inflict punishment.

Personally, I always liked it when I faced passive resistance over active resistance.

The quicker an incident ends the better. The last thing any police officer wants is anyone going to the hospital.

I certainly hope members of the Human Rights Commissions and police departments continue talking with one another. The object for all should be a safe place for all. Law enforcement is not the enemy. We can all learn and listen to each other.

I do agree that good policies and procedures if followed correctly will build trust that is needed for the whole community. The Revere Police Department, like all police departments, is not the enemy. We are all in this together making society safe for all. Cops don't want to escalate anything. They just want to do their job and go home safe and sound at the end of their shift.



### 14 GREATER BOSTON THEATRES UNITE

Announce Collective Commitment to Public Safety As Live, Indoor Performances Resume

Proof of Vaccination or Negative COVID-19 Test and Masks Will be Required for All Audience Members New Survey Results Show Majority of Arts Goers Support These Measures The following is a press release by the Huntington Theatre

Fourteen theatre companies in the Greater Boston area have banded together to announce a collective commitment to public safety as live, indoor performances resume in the region amid concerns around the rise in COVID-19 cases in the U.S.

These theatre companies will implement policies designed to protect the health and safety of everyone by requiring proof of vaccination or negative COVID-19 test for all artists, staff members, and audiences who attend live, indoor performances at their institutions. Masks will be required inside the theatres as well.

These policies will be in place starting immediately and valid through October 31, 2021 (in alignment with Broadway's current policies), and will be reevaluated as the situation evolves. They are based on CDC guidance and were developed in consultation with public health officials. Individual theatres will list their specific protocols and guidelines on their websites.

The organizations joining in this effort are: Actors' Shakespeare Project, American Repertory Theater, Boston Playwrights' Theatre, Central Square Theater, The Front Porch Arts Collective, The Gamm Theatre, Gloucester Stage Company, Greater Boston Stage Company, The Huntington, Martha's Vineyard Playhouse, Merrimack Repertory Theatre, Moonbox Productions, SpeakEasy Stage Company, and Wellesley Repertory Theatre. Other companies are expected to sign on in the coming weeks.

"We at The Huntington, along with our colleagues, are eager to welcome back audiences to live performances this fall, and we are prioritizing everyone's health and well-being in order to safely reopen," says **Huntington Managing Director** Michael Maso. "These measures will provide multiple layers of protection in our theatres — it's what our patrons want, and it's an essential part of our broader responsibility as public-facing institutions."

"We're committed to creating a culture of care," says Central Square Theater Executive Director Catherine Carr Kelly, who is also co-vice president of New England Area Theaters (NEAT), an association of midsize theatres. "All of our companies are fully vaccinated. Requiring proof of vaccination or a negative COVID test, along with wearing masks, increases the safety for fellow patrons and also for the artists and staff of each company."

#### AUDIENCE OUTLOOK **SURVEY DATA AND** THE DECISION-MAKING **PROCESS**

The recent announcements that theatres in New York City, Washington, DC, and Chicago



have established similar policies around requiring proof of vaccination or negative COVID test and mask wearing, combined with the latest results of ArtsBoston's Audience Outlook Monitor survey, gives Greater Boston theatres increased confidence in implementing these measures.

The Audience Outlook Monitor is a longitudinal survey sponsored locally by ArtsBoston and run nationally by independent consultant WolfBrown that has been regularly providing Greater Boston arts organizations with data about audience perceptions, concerns, and intentions during the pandemic. It has been a vital tool for arts groups in developing their plans, policies, and communications strategies.

In the most recent round of survey data collected August 9-13, 2021, 80% of respondents indicated that proof of vaccination would make them more likely to attend indoor events, and 50% said that proof of vaccination or negative COVID test is a prerequisite for their attendance. According to the survey, 98% of respondents reported being fully vaccinated or planning to do so.

The survey showed that news of the delta variant has reduced audience demand to return to indoor performances right away. In the June 2021 survey, 18% of respondents said they wouldn't't attend an indoor event that week. That figure more than doubled to 39% in the recent August round of surveys. The increase reflects the rising level of concern of audience members

"After deep consideration on this topic and following the guiding principles of our Roadmap for Recovery and Resilience for Theater, we came to this decision, recognizing that the vaccines are now widely available and free," says Mark Lunsford, ART Artistic Producer. "Along with enhanced ventilation and universal masking, vaccination and testing are critical cornerstones of our multi-layered mitigation efforts that prioritize the safety of our community of staff, audiences, and artists."

"Requiring proof of vaccination or a negative test is the best way for us as a community to reopen responsibly," says Paul Daigneault, SpeakEasy Stage Company Producing Artistic Director. "It will allow us to move forward and continue to prioritize everyone's safety

audiences, artists, and theatre staff alike."

"The health and safety of the audience, artistic team, and staff must always be the first priority," says Joseph Allen, associate professor and Director of the Healthy Buildings program at Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. "That means when we have new tools available, we need to use them. On top of enhanced ventilation and masking, the vaccines offer an additional, and excellent, layer of protection that should give everyone even more confidence as we reopen theaters."

#### PROTOCOLS FOR ATTENDING A **PERFORMANCE**

All patrons attending live, indoor performances at participating theatres must present proof of vaccination or proof of a negative COVID test before entering the venue, and must wear a mask inside the theatre.

Proof of vaccination may include showing either a vaccination card or a photo of the card, or a digital vaccine record (through an app such as Bindle at: www.joinbindle. com/people). Anyone who is unable to be vaccinated or to verify their vaccination status for any reason will be required to show proof of a recent negative COVID test before entering.

Individual theatres may have their own guidelines and instructions for patrons; please see a theatre company's website or contact them directly for further details about specific policies.

# Nanna & Babbononno

A Nostalgic Remembrance



Nanna always said that death came in threes. She was often proven right over the years, even to the extent that Babbononno agreed with her, and of course, my mother.

Within the past month, her prophecy was proven to be true. About a month ago, a good friend, Colonel Tom Finn, a member of the First Corps of Cadets, the military organization I belong to, passed due to the COVID virus. The second was another close friend, Leo Barrett. Leo's wife, Lucile, and my wife, Loretta, have been close since their childhood days in Chelsea. As a result, Leo and I had been friends for many years. Recently, Leo had a stroke, and never recovered. Both he and Tom were in their 70s, not old by today's standards.

The third passing was even closer to me. Aunt Ninna passed on earlier this month. She was Uncle Gino's wife. Uncle Gino was my mother's youngest brother who made it to 101 before cashing it in. With him, a blood relative, I think it was hereditary. Babbononno made it to 98, my mother made it to 99, Uncle Paul made it to 95 and Uncle Nick made it to 94. Aunt Ninna wasn't a blood relative, but I think her longevity was influenced by the Contini family.

She was born in New York City to Italian immigrants. With a flair for dancing, she studied Flamenco and became a professional in her teens, working theaters and nightclubs with Jose Melina and Jose Greco. Uncle Gino was on his way home from the Pacific during WWII. He was given leave and decided to spend a few days in New York before returning to Boston and the family. He just happened to drop by a Latin nightclub, and saw a young woman dancing on stage. As he approached the stage, three people sitting at a front table stood up and stopped him. They were the dancer's sister and brothers. When they discovered he was Italian, and meant no harm, they invited him to sit with them. When the show was over, the dancer that intrigued Uncle Gino came to the table and was introduced as Ninna Ravel. (Her professional name) Her real name was Filomena Romeo, as Italian as can be, but work in a Latin club would have been difficult for her if they thought she was anything except Spanish.

Well, they began dating and on his next leave, Uncle Gino brought Ninna to Boston to meet his parents, Nanna and Babbononno. Because of her New York accent, they thought she was Jewish. Ninna insisted that her parents were both from Calabria and lots of people from New York had similar accents. Regardless of her accent, Ninna was accepted, and right after the war, she and Uncle Gino were married.

Before joining the Army Air Corps. Uncle Gino worked at the Chelsea Navy Yard during the day, and played drums at night for several different bands. After he and Ninna were married and he was a civilian again, the decision was made that both of them would give up the entertainment business. He gave up playing music and Ninna gave up her dancing. They first tried living in Miami, but there was really no money to be made there so they headed back to Uncle Gino's home base, Boston. There was a post-war problem that they had to deal with ... nowhere to live. They couldn't find an apartment anywhere, so my folks invited them to stay with us until they found something. They actually slept on my bed for about a year and I slept on the living room couch. Luckily, I was small enough to fit on it comfortably and had no complaints.

Uncle Gino went into sales and stayed with one form of it or another for the rest of his working career, later on specializing in liquor sales and distribution in the greater Boston area. After about a year with us, they found a basement apartment in a three-decker on Saratoga Street near the corner of Brooks Street in East Boston. The next thing we knew was that Ninna was expecting twins. After she gave birth to Richard and Donna, the basement apartment became too small and damp for two infants and the decision was made to move to a new development in the town of Belmont, a town just west of Boston, then called the carnation growing capital of America.

While their children grew up in a suburban setting, Ninna followed a passion she was great at. She painted. Still life flowers and fruit displays were her favorite but she was not limited to just those. You name it and she painted it. As time went on, she became a fixture at the notions counter at Filene's Belmont store and stayed with them until the store closed. Daughter Donna inherited her mother's talent for the arts and attended college for design and decorating, an area she still is involved in. Richard opened his own business, remodeling homes, retiring not too long ago.

After Uncle Gino retired, he and Ninna spent their leisure time traveling, dining out, and acting as typical grandparents for both Richard and Donna's children. In June of 2017, Uncle Gino celebrated his 100th birthday, with Aunt Ninna and the family by his side. Unfortunately, he would pass away just shy of his 101st year. From that point on, Ninna went into a steady decline. Her eyes started to give out preventing her from painting. She had to give up driving as well and depended on her children for transportation.

Periodically, I would visit with Loretta, my sons John and Michael and my granddaughter, Lina. In spite of her slowing down, each time we visited, a typical Italian feast would be ready for us. Aunt Ninna was the consummate hostess each time.

After the COVID virus hit, visiting became impossible and Loretta and I headed to our Florida home where we felt it was safer for us. Even though, I would call Aunt Ninna at least once a week just to chat and check on her. We returned home at the end of June, and my aunt and I made tentative plans to get together a few times, but each time, there was a medical issue that intervened. Cousin Donna thought it best to move her mother to an apartment in Sudbury near where she lived, but recently, Ninna suffered a heart attack and we knew the end was rapidly approaching. She passed on at the end of the first week in August, a month shy of her 98th birthday, which would have been on September the 23rd.

As I write this column, I am waiting to hear from my cousin Donna as to the final arrangements. Aunt Ninna was the last of her generation in the family. I am now the oldest one in the 3<sup>rd</sup> generation of the Contini/ Christoforo family. I loved my aunt and am saddened by her passing, but I guess time marches on.

Sicily prides itself on it's amazing street foods, and one of the most popular is the sfincione (or sfinciuni in dialect) of Palermo! Taking its name from the Latin word "spongia" meaning sponge, this thick spongy crusted pizza bread is absolutely amazing. Made with caciocavallo cheese, a rich tomato, onion and anchovy sauce, seasoned with oregano, and topped off with freshly made breadcrumbs, sfincione are extremely sought after. Throughout the streets of Palermo you'll find sfinciunaros (street vendors that sell sfincione) almost everywhere. If you don't find them, you will certainly hear them as they ride by in there three-wheeled motor vehicles shouting phrases to attract patrons to their sfincione carts. Street vendors sell a significant amount of sfincione. However, it's told that some of the best tasting are made from the bakeries in Palermo or better yet, homemade.

My family came from Sicily, so growing up sfincione was the only pizza that I knew of. Thin crusted pepperoni and cheese never existed in my world. There are a few different ways to make sfincione. I'm sharing my favorite, which is almost identical to how my Nonna made hers. Though it's a bit of a process to put together, trust me, the end result will make it completely worth it. After all, how could anything possibly compare to a slice of Sicily!

### **SICILIAN SFINCIONE**

Sfincione Siciliano



#### Sauce

1/4 cup olive oil

3 ½ large sweet onions, sliced

thin

1 (2 ounce) containers of anchovies in oil

2 (6 ounce) cans tomato paste

**Dough** (or 2 pounds store bought)

3 1/4-4 cups 00 flour 1 packages of yeast

(2 1/4 teaspoons) 2 tablespoons olive oil 1 tablespoons sugar

1 ½ teaspoons salt

1½-2 teaspoons Sicilian

oregano (or oregano)

1 ½ cups warm water (not hot)

3 (28 ounce) cans san marzano

**Breadcrumbs** (or 2 cups plain seasoned with 2 teaspoons oregano and ½ - ¾ cup pecorino romano cheese)

1 loaf Italian bread

½ - ¾ cup grated pecorino

romano cheese 2 teaspoons oregano

¼ cup olive oil

3/4 pound caciocavallo cheese (or provolone), diced into small ¼ inch pieces olive oil

Sauce: In a large saucepan, warm olive oil over medium heat. Add onions, cook until soft. Add anchovies and their oil, cook for about 15 minutes, allowing them to break up ad melt into the mixture. Add tomato paste, cook 10 minutes more. Add crushed tomatoes, oregano, and cook for several hours, stirring often. Sauce should be deep red, thick, and sweet to taste, when done. Cool and place aside (can be made a day in advance).

**Dough:** Place the yeast and sugar in a medium bowl, pour the warm water over it and whisk until the yeast dissolves. Let stand for 5 to 10 minutes and stir in the salt and olive oil. Add 3 cups of the flour and stir with a wooden spoon until the dough comes together. Mix well and continue to knead by hand or using a dough hook on a mixer, adding additional flour a few tablespoons at a time, until slightly sticky, but not clinging to your hands. Knead for 7-10 minutes until dough has a silky consistency. Put dough into a greased bowl, cover and let rise about 1 ½ hours. Punch down and let rise another 30 minutes. Take the dough and stretch to fit in a generously oiled 13x9x2 pan. Cover and let rise for another 2 hours.

**Breadcrumbs:** Slice bread into 1 ½ inch slices. Place on a cookie sheet. Bake at 300° for 30 minutes to dry out. Break dried bread into pieces. Place in food processor and process until crumbly. Mix 2 cups of the crumbs with the oregano and grated cheese. Mix in the olive oil, set aside.

Assemble the Sfincione: Preheat oven to 425°. Take pan of dough, lightly brush olive oil over the top of the dough. Layer diced caciocavallo cheese evenly over dough, generously layer with sauce and finally, sprinkle breadcrumbs over the top and lightly drizzle with olive oil. Bake 25-30 minutes, or until golden brown on bottom. Slice and serve with a metal spatula.

In March of 1972, Paramount Pictures released what is still considered among the greatest films in history. That The Godfather would become a masterpiece was truly a combination of blessings. It had started life in 1969 as a novel chronicling the rise and fall of a crime family by pulp writer Mario Puzo. Paramount only invested \$2.5 million in the production cost, a low-ball even by the early '70s. But they took another gamble with a relatively low-profile director (after Sergio Leone and Costa Gavras were chopped) in Francis Ford Coppola. Coppola and Puzo, however, formed a viable partnership composing the screenplay.

Bill Freehan

Freehan, an 11-time All-Star catcher with the Tigers and a big part of the 1968 World Series Championship year has died at 79 years old.

AJ Hinch, Tigers manager and former catcher himself said of Freehan, "Longtime Tiger, arguably the best catcher in the history of the organization, and deep Michigan roots."

He played his entire career with the Tigers from 1961 through 1976. Besides All-Star appearances, including all 15 innings in the 1967 game, Freehan was awarded five Golden Gloves.

"The guy was the best catcher I ever pitched to ... Nobody did it better," said Denny McClain, who won 31 games in 1968. He was runner-up for the AL MVP award that year, and posted career highs 25 homers, 84 RBIs and 73 runs scored.

When he retired in 1976, he kept active in baseball. He coached the University of Michigan's baseball team from 1990-95, and also worked in the Tigers minor league system. The cause of his death was not disclosed, but his family did say he had Alzheimer's, and suspects it was related to the concussions from his years of playing the catcher's position. As his grandson, Blaise Salter told the Detroit Free Press, catchers never had helmets back then and how many foul balls bounced off his head. He said, "There's definitely a connection.'



### HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

**DOUGIE'S DEAL FOR DAUNTING DOLLARS** — Once he was employed by the Black and Gold as an up and coming player. Any number of people thought he might make an indelible mark through an impressive career on Causeway Street.

After all, it was easy to see why the Bruins had drafted the big defenseman in the first round (ninth overall) in the 2011 NHL Draft. At 6-6 and over 220 pounds, he was a dominating presence on the ice. Playing for the Niagara IceDogs of the Ontario Hockey League, he proved to be a prolific point producer, going 12-46-58 for the 2010-2011 season.

Based on those stats, the B's impression of Hamilton soared even higher and Dougie found himself being called to the stage during the NHL Draft a couple of months later, donning a spoked B cap and sweater for all to see.

Then, just to allay any doubts the B's may have had concerning his selection, he put up more impressive stats with Niagara in the 2011-2012 season with 17 goals and 55 assists for 77 points across 50 games. It sounds odd now but some observers, even way back then, thought that Hamilton might be the replacement for Zdeno Chara as the star's career supposedly was winding down.

The 2012-2013 season had a lockout delayed start so Hamilton did not take the ice for the B's until January. Thus his numbers were not as high (5-11-16) over 42 games. But there was only modest improvement in 2013-2014 (7-18-25) in 64 games followed by 10-32-42 in 2014-2015, the final year of his entry-level contract. A possible bright spot: seven points in 19 Stanley Cup games.

Dougie wanted a significant increase in compensation. The Bruins made an offer. He declined it.

By this time there was a new man in charge, GM Don Sweeney having assumed the Big Chair just a month earlier.

Transactions are common occurrences in the NHL during the summer months. And thus it was that one Douglas Jonathan Hamilton found himself on the way to Calgary, traded to a Western Conference team in a move that meant he would play only one game in the Garden annually for the next several years. But Dougie got what he wanted — a six-year, \$34.5 million contract that averaged out to \$5.75 million annually. The pay per day rate: \$15,753 year round.

The Calgary front office got several good solid years from Hamilton. In the three years he was with the Flames, he missed only one regular season game, thus proving to be a durable, reliable performer while patrolling the back end. Statistically, his best year was the middle one (2016-2017) when he posted 13-37-50 numbers, with the other two seasons not far behind.

However, during that third season in Canada, a somewhat familiar scenario would play out some 2,400 miles away in the Carolina front office. A new owner (Tom Dundon) took over, GM Ron Francis was removed and replaced by Don Waddell and assistant Rod Brind'Amour was promoted to head coach.

You had a new regime wanting to make changes in Carolina. Plus, there was the feeling in Calgary that a shakeup was needed there as well, the Flames having failed to make the playoffs in two of the three years Hamilton was with them. The other resulted in a first round exit.

Thus, two teams that were open to changes met and finalized their plans at the 2018 NHL Draft. When all the talking was done, Dougie Hamilton, a native of Toronto, found himself back in the states, playing for a team that was seeking a fresh start after having last won the Stanley Cup in 2006. He would play three years for Carolina — all of them productive. The Hurricanes advanced to the playoffs every spring he was with them, making it once to the Eastern Conference Finals in 2019 where they were swept by the Bruins.

As happens every year, there are teams in the NHL that are looking to rejuvenate after long periods of decline. One of them is New Jersey, which has missed the playoffs for eight of the last nine seasons.

This summer was a good time for Hamilton, a quality NHL defenseman, to be an unrestricted free agent. Thus, he met with Devils GM Tom Fitzgerald, a man who was not afraid to spend money to advance his goal of improving the team. The result: Dougie recently signed a new seven-year, \$63 million contract with the Devils, a pact that averages out to \$9 million a year or \$24,657 a day year round. That's just over \$1,000 an hour (about \$250 every 15 minutes) for the next seven years. That's a darn good deal, wouldn't you say?

But while his bank account is bulging, his trophy case is barren. Dougie has played nine years in the NHL without winning a Stanley Cup. At age 28, he still has a good number of years left. But seven years from now, when his impressive contract expires at age 35, will he still be without his name on hockey's holiest hardware? Only time will tell.

It was a different era but the same place that is making headlines today. It was December 9, 1959, and the festive celebration was for Dwight D. Eisenhower, the 34<sup>th</sup> president of the United States, who was visiting the city of Kabul, Afghanistan. How times have changed.
