Better Bus Project Bus Service Changes Begin on September 1st

29 Routes Will See Changes on September 1st

Beginning September 1st, the MBTA will implement a number of bus service changes as part of the Better Bus Project. of transit riders depending on the MBTA's bus service every day, these cost-neutral changes were driven by the T's need to

"The modifications to these select routes are the first wave of changes to improve service for close to one-third of MBTA customers who depend on our buses to get to work, school, and other activities," said MBTA General Manager Steve Poftak. "These modifications represent the most significant changes to our bus service in over a decade and are the results of both a comprehensive analysis of how our bus routes perform, and an unprecedented level of engagement with our customers."

As part of the MBTA's \$8 billion, five-year Capital Investment Plan, the Better Bus Project's goal is to ensure bus service lives up to the MBTA's own standards. With one-third

of transit riders depending on the MBTA's bus service every day, these cost-neutral changes were driven by the T's need to better serve the public and were informed by a year's worth of input from riders, planners, cities, and elected officials.

The MBTA's Fiscal Management and Control Board approved changes to 53 routes in April 2019. Of those changes, 29 routes will be changing on September 1st. The remainder of the changes will follow this winter or in subsequent quarters. In addition to these route changes, the MBTA is adding additional bus operators to provide better frequency on many routes during off-peak times.

These changes are being made to improve frequency, increase reliability, and reduce the complexity of service for all bus riders. However, this does require change and may mean that some riders will need to take a different bus, travel to a different bus stop, or require a transfer between different services. To ensure that all affected riders are aware of these changes, the MBTA has communicated to its customers through flyers at affected bus stops, on-bus announcements, digital and text alerts, updated web pages, social media, and more.

LIVY

This week we are continuing in our coverage of the great Latin scholars of the past. In previous issues, we divided all of the Latin literati into the Early Age, the Golden Age, the Silver Age, and the Later Empire. We further subdivided the Golden Age into the Ciceronian Period and the Augustan Period. During the last three weeks, we highlighted Vergil, Horace, and Ovid, the three great poets of the Augustan Period, and today we continue in that period with the historian Titus Livius, who is now referred to as just plain Livy.

He was born in Patavium (modern Padua) into a good and respectable family. At an early age, he moved to Rome where he became acquainted with the most distinguished men

one man traveled from Spain to Rome just to see him.

Livy eventually wrote a history of Rome in 142 books, which covered a time span from the founding of that city, to the death of Drusus (the brother of Emperor Tiberius); unfortunately, only portions of his work remain. It is said that he had no training in history writing, and only slight knowledge of Roman law, or in the Roman military system.

Livy was one of the greatest and most popular of the Roman writers of history. The importance of his work rests more on the scope of his patriotic undertaking and in his charming style, than on his ability as a scientific historian. He is regarded as a remarkably good storyteller with perfect diction and a highly developed power for graphic narrative. He attempted to awaken the dormant patriotic spirit among his fellow Romans, and to inspire them towards emulating the deeds of their ancestors. His theme is the greatness of Rome, which was written in a clear and eloquent style. His history has been given the highest praise, which in turn has earned him the title of "The Roman Herodotus."

Saint Elizabeth Hesselblad

Maria Elizabeth Hesselblad was born in Sweden on June 4, 1870, the fifth of thirteen children born to August Robert Hesselblad and Cajsa Petersdotter Dag. By 1886, she had to work to help her parents make ends meet. At first, she looked for work in Sweden, but eventually immigrated to the United States where she studied nursing at Roosevelt Hospital in New York City. She subsequently worked at Roosevelt Hospital as a nurse from 1888, and did home care for the sick and aged. Her work took her into the large Catholic population of New York; her interest in the Church grew, and she came to see it as the place closest to Christ. She converted to Catholicism, received baptism on August 15, 1902.

She made a Pilgrimage to Rome, Italy in late 1902, where she received Confirmation. She returned briefly to New York, but then sailed back to Rome to enter religious life. She settled at the Carmelite House of Saint Bridget of Sweden on March 25, 1904. In 1906, she took the habit of the Brigittines (Order of the Most Holy Saviour of Saint Bridget).

She worked to restore the Order in Sweden and Italy, especially in Rome. She returned to Sweden in 1923, ministered to the poor, and tried to revitalize the Brigittine movement there. The new congregation was established in



England in 1931 after receiving the approval of the Holy See. That same year, Hesselblad obtained the House of Saint Bridget in Rome for her new congregation. A foundation was made in India in 1937 which drew many new members. Her order received canonical approval on July 7, 1940.

Hesselblad became known as "the second Bridget." During World War II - and after - she performed many charitable works on the behalf of the poor and those that suffered due to racial laws and also promoted a movement for peace that involved Christians and non-Christians. The war also saw her save the lives of Jews who would otherwise have died in the Holocaust had it not been for her direct intervention.

Hesselblad passed away in Rome on April 24,1957. She was Canonized on June 5, 2016, by Pope Francis. The Feast of Saint Elizabeth Hesselblad is celebrated on June 4.

L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Savoring September

Lately, I have been paying special attention to the trees in my backyard. If I look at the leaves closely enough, I can detect the slightly perceptible hues of fall - crisp reds and golden yellows tickling the borders of still-green fronds. The other day, a small breeze lifted a few orange leaves and blew them gently to the ground as they swirled around like tops. These sights, both the delicate colors and the falling of the leaves, are reminders that autumn is here, the season of cooler weather and harvest and the rhythms of nature. The month of September starts this wonderful season, bringing with it the smell of juicy apples and the purring motors of big yellow school buses. The beginning of September is always a very busy time for me, as it coincides with the commencement of the school year and all of the preparations that it entails. Nevertheless, when I stop to pause and really think about September, I feel a rise of excitement bubbling inside me. This is a month chock full of rustic holidays and old-country proverbs that highlight September's prominence as a seasonal turning point.

The first September holiday to occur in America is Labor Day, falling on September 2nd this year. A festival honoring the contributions of working people, Labor Day also signifies the unofficial end of summer, as many schools return to their sessions after this long weekend. As such, Labor Day is often celebrated with a picnic or barbecue, and this year I will add to the food tradition by baking a sparkling apple

cider pound cake or an applecream cheese crisp to honor the seasonal flavors of this month. Over in Italy, September heralds a flurry of feasts and activities that will last until the holiday season in the winter. It begins in a regal fashion, with Venice's Regatta Storica occurring on the first Sunday of the month. In this renowned boat race, a parade of elegant gondolas introduces an intense competition where skilled rowers in various different categories vie for first place. This event has a royal pedigree, as it is modeled after the welcome procession given to the queen of Cyprus, Caterina Cornaro, when she returned to Venice in 1489. Later in the month, the people in Naples celebrate the feast day of Saint Gennaro on September 19th, when spectators wait to see the mysterious liquefaction of the saint's blood, and then hold an eight-day party as stalls selling trinkets and candy line the streets. This holiday has become so popular that many Italian-American communities hold their own Festa di San Gennaro. As autumn intensifies, the fall equinox arrives on the 23rd of the month, after which the balance between daylight and night tips towards the edge of darkness. Finally, the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel, or San Michele l'Arcangelo, closes out the month on September 29th. Also known as Michaelmas, this ancient feast features the autumnal themes of balance the scales of St. Michael echo the equal hours of day and night during the equinox — and harvest, as ingredients like carrots and ginger are traditional on this day.

For our Italian ancestors of vore, September meant collecting the harvest, enjoying the bounty of the Earth, and preparing food for the winter. In this deeply agricultural society, proverbs reminded farmers to pay attention to the weather and the crops in order to ensure a successful harvest. Rain in September proved a mixed blessing. One proverb bluntly states that "La pioggia di settembre è veleno per l'uva," meaning that September rain is like poison for grapes. However, another proverb happily declares "A settembre pioggia e luna, è dei funghi la fortuna," advising farmers that rain and moonlight made favorable conditions for collecting mushrooms, such as the delectable Italian truffles. Other dictums reflect the changing weather of the month, as summer turns to autumn. A delightful little ditty proclaims: "Aria settembrina fresco la sera e fresco la mattina." According to this proverb, September air is cool during both the evenings and the mornings. This axiom reminds me of the autumnal mist I often see rising above fields like lace on crisp mornings, or dark evenings huddled under a blanket and drinking a cup of apple cider. Italian truisms even mention the autumn equinox. "Di Settembre la notte col dì contende" roughly translates that night competes with day during September, a reminder of the

long winter evenings to come. From holidays to proverbs, September is a month brimming with great significance as a seasonal milestone. Whether you enjoy the changing foliage or admire the taste of a fresh apple, be sure to pause and be grateful for all that the autumn has to offer. For it is autumn that teaches us humility before the gifts of the Earth and an appreciation for the cycle of the year. Therefore, no matter how you desire to honor September, let's toast to a month full of bountiful blessings and new beginnings!





Nanna & Babbononno

A Nostalgic Remembrance



Labor Day is just a couple of days away and, for most people, the end of summer. I was reminiscing the other day about a Labor Day weekend I spent with Mom and Dad when I was 12 years old. Dad was playing one of the last "on the road" county fairs before they came to an end throughout the northeast for the season.

The fair was the in Schaghticoke (skahty coke) New York and Dad and Chet Nelson were in charge of the entertainment. When a scenery man from South Boston named Louie was involved, he would put me to work as his assistant for \$35.00 a week which wasn't bad for a twelve year old in 1950. The New York county fairs usually hired New Yorkers to do whatever work was needed and they were all based out of the New York unions. This meant that Louie wasn't there and I didn't work.

When Dad asked one of the fair managers if there was anything I could do, a member of the concession staff overheard my father and offered me a job assisting the novelty salesman. A man named Norman sold novelties: stuffed animals, Kewpie dolls, funny hats and things that looked like you won them trying you luck at a fairway game. People who didn't win anything would often stop by Norman's stand, buy something and then tell friends and family that they won the item at the fair. Sounds crazy, but that's the way it was.

The Schaghticoke Fair Began on the Friday night before Labor Day and continued throughout the weekend, coming to an end on the night of Labor Day. I was to sell novelties all day Saturday, Sunday and Monday, and was told that Norman would pay me each day with the amount dependent on the volume of sales. I agreed to the arrangement and the next morning I found Norman's novelty stand and waited for Norman to show up. He didn't arrive until around noon and all I saw was a red bulbous nose followed by a body that displayed a beer gut pointing the way. He looked just like W. C. Fields except that I knew that Fields had died in 1946, four years earlier.

The closest concession was a 20 foot by 20 foot waist high fence with tables on the inside covered with dishes, cups, saucers, glasses, serving dishes and a few pots and pans. People would pitch coins at the kitchen implements, and if their coin landed inside, they would win the article. A gambler could pitch nickels, dimes or quarters. A winning nickel got you a dish, cup or glass. A winning dime won you two of them and a winning quarter, a serving dish.

The concessioners were all brothers from Athens, Greece, and were making a fortune working the American fair circuit. I found out later that, on that Labor Day weekend, they made \$10,000, a tidy sum back in 1950. Norman, on the other hand, sold novelties with a hangover each day. This meant that after he showed up and set up his stand, I did most of the work selling his junk. He just sat on a beach chair nursing a pounding head.

Around 1:00 p.m., on that Saturday afternoon, Nanna and Babbononno showed up with my lunch. Knowing that I would be hungry, they stopped at a food stand and bought me something to eat. Babbononno asked Norman if he would like something to eat but Norman declined saying to Babbononno, "You Aye-Rabs take good care of each other."

Babbononno looked at Nanna and said, "Quello e ubriaco." (He's drunk) They handed me the bag with my lunch with Babbononno adding, "Assicurati che non ti imbroglio." (Make sure he doesn't cheat you), and

I worked all that day and into the night, with Mom and Dad arriving just before Dad's first show. They had brought me my dinner. At the end of the evening, around 10:00 p.m., Norman decided to close up and handed me a ten dollar bill. I had sold most of the novelties displayed and was hoping for a better split. Ten dollars for ten hours of work was about minimum wage under normal circumstances, but I had worked my butt off and did most of the selling

The next day was Sunday. Mom found out where the local Catholic church was located and we as a family, headed for Mass. After Mass, I headed for the novelty stand and found Norman already there and upset that I wasn't there waiting for him. I told him why I didn't arrive until I did, but he didn't care. He was just as hung over as the day before.

That night at closing, he handed me eight dollars and told me that the amount was all I was going to get. I was upset and told Dad who tried to explain to me the kind of person Norman was. It didn't matter to a twelve year old who knew he was getting cheated. But as things turned out, I'm the one who won in the end, accidently.

When I had Dad out of ear shot of everyone else, I told him the events of the day and the interplay with Norman the novelty salesman. Dad then insisted that I empty out my pockets, and when I did, Dad counted out about

He smiled and told me that, seeing all that Norman wanted was the money in the apron pockets, the rest was my commission for each novelty I sold. Just before we left the fair ground, I ran into one of the Greek brothers who operated the stand where people pitched coins. It was then that he told me that they had made \$10,000 for the weekend.

I just smiled.

History is already proving me right. My generation lived through some of the most extraordinary events in the development of Western civilization. In my short 36 years, I've seen not only the changes in my own city but I've lived to see the end of the Soviet Union, remember the Gulf War, the O.J. Simpson Trial, the Oklahoma City Bombing, the fall of apartheid, the Columbine massacre, the Clinton scandal, September 11th, Operation Iraqi Freedom, and the ongoing war on terror.

This is the idea of my next series. Each article will look at a defining event, but I will not be starting with my generation or even my parents'. No, I want to go back to the start of the century I was born in, for the events were a chain of consequences that shaped many of the experiences that defined our lives. Likewise, I will not limit my exploration to American events but also international events with global impacts, here and elsewhere.

The articles will be half a recounting of the event and half a discussion on how they brought us to where we are today. Many of these are mandatory studies (Pearl Harbor, D-Day, Lindbergh's flight, etc.), others will be more obscure (the MOVE bombing in Philadelphia). Smaller events, as Malcolm Gladwell famously pointed out, can have big consequences. From article to article I will be


All of the great fighters had natural ability. In some instances they were self taught. Marvin Hagler and Emile Griffith are two who come to mind when I think of champions who pretty much created their own styles through a combination of great boxing instincts and the ability to adapt during a fight.

Others also came with tremendous talent, but through working with a great teacher were able to push way beyond just their natural abilities. In a number of cases, the synergy between teacher and pupil was perfect. In this category I would place Joe Louis and Jack Blackburn.

Teacher and Pupil

He became champ at the same time the trans-continental railroad was completed, and that allowed him to travel across the country and be seen in person by more fans than any athlete before him. It also made it possible for more people to attend his fights, which often had to be held in out of the way places in order to avoid the law, as boxing was outlawed in most states back then.

Sullivan was also known for living a pretty hard life. He was no stranger to the bottle and almost died from overindulging on a couple of occasions. When he signed to fight Jake Kilrain in a fight to the finish, there

Some collaboration, while seemingly successful, may have been detrimental to the fighter and his career. The case of Floyd Patterson and Cus D'Amato comes to mind here. While D'Amato certainly paved the way for Patterson to become the youngest heavyweight champ in history, he also kept Patterson from fully developing by being overprotective of him. Would Patterson have become champion without D'Amato's crafty handling of him? Very possibly not! Would he have become a better and more confident fighter if D'Amato had taken more chances with him? Very possibly so.

Getting back to Blackburn and Louis, that was truly one of the best combinations of fighter and trainer in history. The two men bonded and related as father and son. Blackburn had lived a hard life and could be quite nasty when drinking. He had also been a great boxer and knew the intricacies of the game inside out. In Louis he found the perfect pupil, a gifted athlete who was also a quick learner who paid attention. While Blackburn may have been a rough character, he developed a fondness for Louis that brought out another side of the old veteran. He was basically a decent man. Louis called him Chappie.

Would Joe Louis have become heavyweight champ without having Jack Blackburn in his corner? It is very likely he would have. Would he have been as great as he was without Chappie? I don't believe so.

John L. Sullivan was the first heavyweight champ of the modern era, and really the first athlete to attain celebrity status.

were many in Sullivan's camp who were concerned about his conditioning for such a tough challenge. They managed to talk John L. into agreeing to bring on William Muldoon as his trainer to get him in shape for the fight.



James Deforest and Jack Dempsey

Muldoon was famous in the world of physical culture. He was a superb athlete who lived a very clean life. He was also a no nonsense tough guy who was not one to make compromises. It has been said he was the only man John L. Sullivan feared.

Muldoon got the champ into the best the best condition of his life. It was a good thing for Sullivan he did as the rugged Kilrain gave the champ all he could handle over 75 rounds in a fight that lasted 2 hours and 16 minutes in 100 degree heat. Sullivan prevailed and had Muldoon to thank.

Another champ with amazing natural talent was Jack Dempsey. Much like Louis, he certainly would have become champion with almost any trainer working with him. But Dempsey struck gold when he hooked up with the legendary teacher James Deforest. Deforest had worked with fighters such as James J. Jeffries, Joe Gans, Kid McCoy, and the Original Joe Walcott. He was a master teacher and the perfect match for the young Dempsey. While Jack was self taught and had learned much from his years living on the road and having to fight to stay alive, it was Deforest who was able to mold Dempsey into the amazing fighting machine he became. Dempsey's raw power and killer instinct were perfected with the boxing expertise he learned from Deforest. It was this collaboration that made Jack Dempsey one of the greatest champs of all time.

Finally, there was the combo of Angelo Dundee and Muhammad Ali. The young Cassius Clay who had won an Olympic Gold in 1960 was one of those fighters who would be classified as self taught. He was a phenomenal natural athlete with almost supernatural reflexes. After winning the Olympic title, the search began for a trainer to lead him on the road to the title. At first Cus D'Amato was considered, but Cus was much too controlling for the free thinking Clay.

Clay was then sent off to training camp with Archie Moore. That didn't last long as the young Olympian could not handle the discipline imposed by the Old Mongoose.

Finally, veteran trainer Angleo Dundee was chosen. Dundee understood that Clay was not good at taking instruction and would try to instill boxing knowledge in him by power of suggestion. This way Clay would think the idea was original with him and implement it even though it came from Dundee.

This combination worked well, and Ali went on to become a great champion. However, as great as he was he still retained some basic flaws that may have been corrected early in his career if he had had a Deforest or Blackburn working with him. I have to wonder just how much greater he may have been had he been able to take instruction. Of course, maybe he could only do it his way.

GUERIN GOES TO THE WILD

— There he was, far from his native state but in a most familiar environment, as he ascended the podium for his first press conference as an NHL General Manager.

It's welcome to the Big Chair for Bill Guerin, the former Bruin who was named the GM of the Minnesota Wild earlier this month.

It also represents a significant promotion after serving as an assistant GM with Pittsburgh for the past five seasons. The last two of those had him overseeing the Pens' Wilkes-Barre/Scranton AHL affiliate on essentially a full-time basis.

That's the same team that earlier had rejuvenated the coaching career of former Bruins mentor Mike Sullivan — who was promoted to the top job in Pittsburgh after putting in a few months at Wilkes-Barre/Scranton and promptly directed the Pens to both the 2016 and 2017 Stanley Cup Championships.

But whatever the level the game is basically the same — and that's what really counts for Bill Guerin, a hockey lifer if there ever was one.

A native of Worcester, he grew up in the Springfield suburb of Wilbraham and later played at Boston College before moving on to the NHL — and we do mean moving on to the NHL since he played for eight franchises over the course of his 18-year career.

He also represented the USA in the Winter Olympics, playing on the 1998, 2002 and 2006 teams that competed in the quadrennial games. He won a silver medal in 2002.

And let's not forget that one of the destinations early in his career was a two-year stop on Causeway Street from 2000 through 2002 where we enjoyed many a night meeting with Bill's wife and parents in the media room following games.

Bill initially played for the Springfield Olympics as a teen, then moved on to Boston College for two years before joining the New Jersey Devils organization where he played for their Utica affiliate for a couple of seasons. He then joined the big club on a full-time basis during the 1992-1993 campaign. He was a member of the New Jersey team that won the 1995 Stanley Cup.

Midway through the 1997-1998 season he was traded to Edmonton and then to Boston in November of 2000.

Midseason moves like that can take a toll on a player and his family but Bill gives all the credit to his wife Kara for making things go as smoothly as possible.

According to an article in the December, 2015 edition of Pittsburgh Magazine, Bill was in a mall in Edmonton when he learned that he had been traded to Boston. He had left his cell phone in his car and was first told of the move by a fan who recognized him.

"My wife is a saint," he told writer Shelly Anderson. "There are a lot of great things about being in the world of professional sports, but it is not always the glamorous life that everybody thinks it is."

Never was that more true than in the days that followed. While Bill got on a plane and immediately hustled to the Hub, Kara, already the mother of a threeyear-old and an 18-month-old (with another child on the way), performed in the clutch in a big-time manner, packing up the house in Alberta and moving the family to Boston in the span of 10 days.

"It's got everything to do with putting up with me," Guerin said. "Things get crazy."

Guerin would go on to have his best goal-scoring year of his career in the Hub, finding the range for 41 tallies during the 2001-2002 season. That performance, coming on the heels of the prior year when he scored 12 goals for Edmonton and 28 for the B's, brought him a lot of attention in the free agent market.

The B's wouldn't pay but the Dallas Stars opened their checkbook for the reported sum of \$45 million spread over five seasons. The Guerin family was off to Texas.

He played for the Stars for four seasons (through the 2005-2006 campaign but sustained a frightful leg injury in February, 2003 that nearly cut off blood flow to the affected limb.

From Dallas it was on to oneyear stints with the St. Louis Blues and the San Jose Sharks. Then came a two-year plus span with the New York Islanders followed by a final 15 months with Pittsburgh — and the experience of winning the 2009 Stanley Cup with the Pens. He finished with 429 goals and 427 assists for a total of 856 points over the course of his career.

When one door closes another sometimes opens and that is exactly what happened to Guerin. Liked a lot by the Pens and their fans, he was hired on June 6, 2011 as the team's player development coach.

Three years later to the day (June 6, 2014) he was promoted to assistant general manager, a position where he gained valuable experience by essentially running the ship at Wilkes-Barre/Scranton, not to mention being on hand for those two Stanley Cup wins in 2016 and 2017.

Now back in the NHL, there's no time to waste since Guerin was named Minnesota's GM on August 21—just 22 days before the start of training camp.

A scant two days later — on August 23 — Guerin pulled off his first signing — inking restricted free agent center Joel Eriksson Ek to a two-year \$2.9 million deal.

Just as the Bruins will participate in the Prospects Challenge in Buffalo the weekend following Labor Day, their Minnesota counterparts will also see action—in a Prospects Challenge event in Traverse City, Michigan where they will go up against players from Columbus, Dallas and the New York Rangers.

Then it's training camp time followed by the opening of the regular season. Minnesota will make its lone appearance at the Garden on November 23, guaranteed to be a major homecoming event for Bill and his relatives. The two teams will also meet in Minnesota on February 1.

The new job will be just the start of another adventure for Bill Guerin. From Worcester to Wilbraham to eventually the Wild, it's been a wonderful ride. A winding and wild one, you might say.
