The 105th St. Agrippina's Feast was August 1st through August 4th, starting on Thursday evening on Hanover Street and ending with a 10-hour Grand Procession on Sunday through the North End streets. On Saturday night, the Montel sang his famous "This Is How We Do It" hit, among others to a large crowd. The Sunday Grand Procession ended with

the traditional "Tug of War" (the back half won, 2 out of 3) and the "Dance of 20 Men" to cheers from the grateful crowd.

Saint Agrippina Di Mineo was a beautiful blond princess who was unmercifully tortured to death by the Emperor Valerian in 256 AD. After her death, her body was taken from Rome to Mineo, Sicily, by three holy women; Bassa, Paula and

Agatonica. The commoners were amazed by the lightweight fragranced body protected by angels and shielded by clouds. In the North End, it's 20 men that coordinate in a complex rhythm to keep the extremely heavy statue in the air. 

Stirpe Nostra

VERGIL

During the past few weeks, we have been discussing Roman scholars who were prominent during the Ciceronian portion of the Golden Age. These greats were Lucretius, Cicero, Sallust, Julius Caesar, and Varro. This week we pass into the second half of the Golden Age or Augustan Period. This is the age which boasts of the famous poets Vergil, Horace, and Ovid, the popular historian Titus Livy, and of course, Vitruvius, the author of a volume called "The Ten Books of Architecture."

Our scholarly Roman for today is Publius Vergilius Maro, the great national poet, and also the most famous of all Roman poets. He was born in 70 BC in a village in Cisalpine Gaul. There is no doubt about the spelling of his name since

inscriptions clearly spell out Vergilius and never Virgilius. He was educated at Cremona, Mediolanum (Milan), and Neapolis (Naples), and from his writings there are no doubt that he received an excellent education. His health was always quite delicate and consequently he never sought to increase his popularity through a military

Some of his early unimportant work included short poems about past national heroes, instructional poems, and a poem called "Cataleptic," which provided facts about his life that were not otherwise available. Sometime around 37 BC Vergil completed his first work of major importance. These were ten pastoral poems called "Eclogues" which carried on a dialogue between two shepherds.

The fourth of his ten Eclogues tells of the birth of a child and an ensuing period of peace and prosperity. This was regarded, of course, as a prophecy of the coming of Christ. He also wrote "The Georgics" or "Georgica." An agricultural poem in four books, on the life and occupation of farmers. It also glorified country life and told of the beauties of Italy. The Georgica is said to have exhibited a high artistic perfection in Latin poetry and is claimed to be the literary work which confirmed his position as the foremost poet of that era.

The last great work of Vergil was of course his "Aenid," an epic poem in 12 books which were composed between 29 and 19 BC. Being mythological in nature it was modeled after the Homeric poems, and told of the adventures of the hero "Aeneas" after the fall of Troy. The theme of the Aenid is founded upon an old Roman tradition that Aeneas and his Trojan warriors settled in Italy and founded Rome. This poem became the great national epic of the Roman people. Its objective was to praise the glories of Rome, and to instill a patriotic feeling along with a religious sentiment for the gods and heroes of their ancestors.

The work of Vergil, the great national poet of ancient Rome, is said to have influenced Dante Alighieri, Chaucer, Spenser, Milton, and Tennyson, to name

Saint Kilian

Kilian was born to noble parents in approximately the year 640 in Mullagh, County Cavan, Ireland. Some records state that he served as a monk in the celebrated monastery at Hy, where he might have been abbot. Hy is the early name for what was later known as Iona. He began his education in Rosscarbery, County Cork and completed it in Tuosist near Kenmare in County Kerry. Kilian traveled throughout Ireland. He then traveled with eleven companions to Gaul and then to Würzburg, Germany whose people he found to be pagan, and whom he resolved to convert. He made a pilgrimage to Rome in 686 where he received papal authority for his mission; Pope Conon ordained him as a missionary bishop. Kilian then returned to Würzburg in 687 with Saint Colman and Saint Totnan. With them, he evangelized East Franconia and East Thuringia, areas in modern Bavaria, converting Duke Gozbert with a large part of his subjects to Christianity.

Kilian told the Duke that he was in violation of sacred



scripture by being married to his brother's widow, Geilana. When Geilana, whom Kilian had failed to convert to Christianity, heard of Kilian's words against her marriage, she became enraged. In the absence of the duke, she had her soldiers sent to the main square of Würzburg, where Kilian and his colleagues were preaching, and had him beheaded. The year is thought to be 689. Feast Day of Saint Kilian is July 8th.

In Memoriam

Linda P. Tramontozzi of Brighton, 84, passed peacefully in her sleep following a long illness.

She was the beloved wife of the late Carlo Tramontozzi. Loving mother of Laura and her husband James Coelho, Marina and her husband Joseph Ruggiero, and Carl Tramontozzi. Cherished grandmother of Joseph Ruggiero, Jr., Stephen and Cristina Ruggiero, Christina Ruggiero and Giancarlo Coelho. She is also survived by many loving cousins and friends.

"Mrs. T," as she was known, was raised in Boston's North

End, where her family had emigrated from Italy when she was two. As a teenager she worked at the North End Branch of the Boston Public Library after school. She was the Salutatorian of her 1952 graduating class at Julie Billiart High School where she had been elected class President all four years. By age 18, she was Boston's youngest newspaper columnist, first, writing a weekly teen column, and then continuing into her 20s with her award-winning column, Friends, Romans and Countrymen, her reflections on the contributions of prominent Italian-American leaders. She also created the North End BPL's Youth Group, an after-school club for teenagers where she invited athletes, politicians, and other celebrities to speak and inspire "her kids." She always felt that teenagers, in their struggles toward adulthood, needed the most positive attention. Many club members credited her with getting them off the streets and inspiring their own exemplary careers, from broadcasters and lawyers, to business people and doctors.

She attended both Boston University and Boston College, focusing on public relations and journalism.

In her 20s, she, along with some close friends, began a singles club for North Enders. ISCO, the Italian Social & Cultural Organization, featured



everything from lectures to dances, resulting in many marriage proposals!

After starting her own family, Mrs. T. led many community projects, including creating OSCA, the Oak Square Civic Association, which rebuilt Hardiman Playground into a vibrant space with playground equipment, benches, shade trees, chess tables, and Little League baseball field.

In 1968, she became the Executive Chairlady of the Julie Billiart High School 25th Jubilee, a two-year project that culminated in the 1970 gala

attended by over 500 alumnae and distinguished guests.

She started the first Public Relations department for Mount St. Joseph Academy, an all-girl private high school in Brighton. She became a trusted advisor to the students, and launched many into the careers of Public Relations and Journalism with her after-school "MSJA PR Club."

A prolific writer, Mrs. T was a published poet, and a non-fiction writer whose works were published in magazines as varied as Yankee Magazine, Boston Magazine, Attenzione Magazine and The Horn Book, to name a few. She also had a recurring column in the Post-Gazette titled "From My Window on Washington Street."

Mrs. T was the epitome of a loving mother to not only her three children, but to all their friends, many of whom still called her "Ma" to this day. A devout Roman Catholic, she lived the "7 Corporal Works of Mercy," reaching out to anyone in need. She had a magical way of making everyone she came in contact with feel that they were the most important person in the world, and perhaps that was her greatest gift.

Following a funeral Mass at St. Columbkille Church in Brighton, she was laid to rest at Christ in the Garden Mausoleum at St. Michael's Cemetery in Roslindale.

Fun in the Sun During Ferragosto

There is no use hiding it anymore: autumn is coming. The signs of the changing season pulsate all around me. The evenings fall earlier, a dusky blue mantel of sky covering the Earth, and the air feels crisper as well. The earliest crop of apples has arrived at markets, and I cannot wait to enjoy this succulent fruit in cakes, breads, crisps and as a simple snack. Even Halloween decorations, smiling pumpkins and arched black cats, begin to wink from store shelves amidst all the notebooks and pencils of back-to-school sales. Although autumn is my favorite season, I am determined to hold on to the rest of the summer for as long as I can, until the school bell rings in September. After all, the days are still warm and the sun still bakes the Earth. Indeed, in Italy, summer vacation remains in full swing. The biggest summer holiday in Italy occurs on August 15th, though Italians extend the celebrations for several weeks before or after. For this feast, named Ferragosto, Italians leave the cities en masse to spend time at the beach or mountains. Caught between the heat and idleness of summer and the rhythmic nature of fall, Ferragosto provides Italy with one last joyous blast of the vacation season.

Visiting Italy during August can sometimes resemble walking through the quiet remains of an ancient civilization. Tourists abound, of course, but many Italians have already escaped the scorching heat of cities and towns once August begins, embarking on their Ferragosto vacations until the holiday culminates on August 15th. I remember the slightly eerie sensation of walking through Rome one August while on a trip years ago and noticing the boarded-up restaurants and theaters and shops. Meanwhile,

colorful beach umbrellas and chic sunbathers, the sands chockablock with impromptu volleyball games and radios blaring the latest hits. Italians even exchange holiday greeting cards emblazoned with pictures of beach picnics and grinning suns. In small Italian villages, such as my father's home outside of Sulmona in Abruzzo, people celebrate Ferragosto with shady al fresco dinners, featuring the seasonal produce of zucchinis, tomatoes, peppers and herbs. This holiday has been important to Italians since ancient times. It hearkens back to the year 18 B.C., when the Emperor Augustus established the Feriae Augustae — Festivals of Augustus — in honor of his reign. Some historians suspect that Augustus's festivals replaced older holidays like the Vinalia rustica, which marked the grape harvest. For all its modern trappings, therefore, Ferragosto remains a seasonal celebration honoring the freshair pleasures of summer and the harvest.

August 15th holds another great significance in Italian culture: it is the feast day of the Assumption, or L'Assunzione. This religious holiday observes the Virgin Mary's physical and spiritual Ascent into Heaven. Italian villages and towns combine Ferragosto and L'Assunzione festivities by holding parades and processions where the statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary is held aloft. In the medieval city of Siena, the famous Palio, or Renaissance horse race, occurs around this time. Around Europe, in fact, the Feast of the Assumption also serves as an important seasonal marker, heralding the start of the harvest. Armenian farmers bring freshly harvested grapes to church on the Sunday closest to the Assumption so that the priest may bless the the Italian coastline brims with fruit. In Poland, where the

Virgin Mary of the Assumption is also known as the Blessed Mother of the Herbs, people gather herbs and have them blessed in church and later display those herbs around their homes for protection. I honor the harvest qualities of the Assumption by baking cheesy biscuits studded with chives both the wheat and the herbs symbolize the bounty of Mother Earth. The pungent aroma and simple texture of these small breads remind me that August means far more than the end of summer; rather, it is a time to be thankful for the gifts of nature and to appreciate the cyclical changing of the seasons much as our ancestors did.

Therefore, August in Italy teaches us to live in the moment. Though we may be worried about the stress of the upcoming cold-weather months, the holiday of Ferragosto encourages us to seize the last few weeks of summer with fanfare and fun, enjoying the cool waters of the ocean or a picnic under the stars, surrounded by family and friends. Meanwhile, the Feast of the Assumption emphasizes the bountiful harvest that characterizes the late summer and fall, as well as the beauty of the changing seasons. Let us allow the lessons of these two holidays to permeate our lives and let us carry the pleasures of August with us always.

P.S. Happy Birthday to my father Rocco Di Censo, who was born the day after Ferragosto. Daddy, I love you always!



THE VERY VERY BEST OF CROWDED HOUSE (Vinyl) Capitol/UMe

Originally issued on CD in 2010, *The Very Very Best of Crowded House* makes its long-awaited vinyl debut. With 19 career-spanning tracks, the collection documents Crowded House's period with Capitol Records/EMI, which began with their self-titled 1986 debut and concluded with their 2007 reunion album, *Time On Earth.* The tracklist features all the celebrated signature hits, "Don't Dream It's Over," "Better Be Home Soon," "Weather With You," "Fall At Your Feet," and "Distant Sun," in addition to "Instinct" and "Not The Girl You Think You Are" from the 1996 compilation, *Recurring Dream*, and "Don't Stop Now" and "Pour Le Monde" from the well-received *Time On Earth.* Crowded House were inducted into Australia's ARIA Hall of Fame in November 2016, and to date have sold upwards of 10 million albums worldwide.

LINDA McCARTNEY - WIDE PRAIRIE (Vinyl) MPL/Capitol/UMe

Wide Prairie, a posthumous 1998 compilation of Linda McCartney recordings spanning the early 1970s through the late 1990s, has been released on vinyl, for the first time since its original release. The only album to be released solely under Linda's name, Wide Prairie features Linda on vocals and various instruments on songs she wrote or co-composed and recorded with Wings between 1972 and 1980, the single-only "Seaside Woman"/"B-Side to Seaside" released under the pseudonym of Suzy and the Red Stripes, cover versions of classics by the McGuire Sisters, The Coasters and more, and solo work from the '80s and '90s including her final recording, "The Light Comes from Within" (co-authored by and featuring Paul McCartney, as well as their son James on electric and acoustic guitar).

PAUL McCARTNEY: AMOEBA GIG, PAUL IS LIVE, CHOBA B CCCP, WINGS OVER AMERICA (Vinyl) MPL/Capitol/UMe

Paul McCartney has released four albums capturing performances spanning from his 1975-1976 return to U.S. arenas with Wings to his intimate 2007 set at Amoeba Records in Los Angeles. Amoeba Gig is the first full-length commercial release of Paul's surprise free concert at Hollywood's Amoeba Music on June 27, 2007. To date only four songs have seen wide release as the Amoeba's Secret EP, two of which were nominated for Grammy Awards in 2008: "That Was Me" for Best Male Pop Vocal Performance and "I Saw Her Standing There" for Best Solo Rock Vocal Performance. This 21-song recording documents possibly the most intimate L.A. show Paul has ever played. Wings Over America was last reissued in 2013. with 90 hours of recording distilled into this triple album.

Nanna & Babbononno

A Nostalgic Remembrance



We were always doing something during the summer months when I was a kid. We traveled with Dad when he played the county fairs all over the northeast, we vacationed at several resorts in between, and later, my folks bought the cottage in Winthrop, Maine.

I once asked my mother about summer vacations when she was a kid. Her answer was, "What was a summer vacation?" Don't forget, my parents were hard-working and had a bluecollar mentality. Vacations, in the true sense of the word, were for the rich as far as they were concerned. Family get-togethers at specific locations or in our backyard were what were considered vacations, and that's what we did.

The story Mom remembered took place during the summer when she was a child. Babbononno, Uncle Paul, and Uncle Nick (both pre-teen) played in the Italian Marine Band in Boston. On a particular Sunday, the band was booked to play a concert at Wood Island Park in East Boston.

For those of you younger than I, you might not remember Wood Island Park. It was a local recreation area that was entered off Neptune Road. It had a beach, a couple of ball fields, a refreshment stand, and a bandstand. I don't remember if they had a bathhouse, but I think so.

Well, Babbononno packed up the family, Nanna, and the kids, along with the instruments, food, and drink for everyone, and headed to a trolley that would drop them off at Neptune Road where the entrance of the park was located. There were benches in front of the bandstand, but I don't remember if Mom said that they sat there or spread out a blanket for all to rest on. Nanna would make sure that there was an umbrella to protect herself and my mother from the sun. I think part of the ancestry on Nanna's side must have been due to Viking invaders in Avellino. Nanna and my mother had skin so light that a few minutes in the sun would produce a burn.

At a certain hour, (I think it was 2:00 p.m.) the band would begin to play Italian favorclarinets in the reed section of the band. A side note, one of the musicians, Guy Giraffa, would one-day form the Roma Band in the North End. For generations, they played many, many concerts, especially during the summer months when there was a saint's feast day and festival every weekend. I think that the band still lives on.

During intermission, Nanna would break out the food she had prepared for the afternoon. Knowing her style, there were no sandwiches on white bread. She probably had Italian cold cuts, an assortment of cheeses, a container of meatballs and a couple loaves of bread, a round one for Babbononno and sliced scali for everyone else. Knowing my uncles and mother, they probably would have wanted to go swimming but would be given every excuse in the book from Nanna, as she was extremely afraid of water.

I don't know who won out. My mother tried to adopt Nanna's fear of the ocean but it was to no avail. As I grew up, I grew to love the water and she had to learn how to put up with it.

Wood Island Park served the East Boston community for a few generations, but by the time I was in my teens, it had fallen into disarray. Following WWII, locals headed for Revere Beach for fun in the sun, food, and amusements. The one part of Wood Island Park that was alive in the late '40s and '50s was the parking lot. It was used at night by young people who went parking, or using the term of the day, "watching the submarine races." Periodically the police from Station 7 would drive through at night and kick everyone out, but many of them had compassion for the young folks who were parked at La Montaniele, (la mun-dahn-yell) the nickname given to Wood Island Park.

In the early 1960s, the land was given or sold to Logan Airport. Dump trucks cruised Neptune Road with landfill that slowly allowed Wood Island Park to become part of an ever-growing Logan International Airport. To comply with the wishes of homeowners on Neptune Road, local politician, George ites and American marches. DeLorenzo, became a human Babbononno played the snare barrier trying to stop the trucks, drum and my uncles played but the handwriting was on the

wall, and soon Wood Island Park became part of history.

Whenever I mentioned the long-gone park to my folks or uncles, they all had stories about how wonderful the park was when they were kids. All are gone and I hope there are people left who will keep the memory of Wood Island Park alive.

I'm going to change the subject for the rest of the column due to a memorial I read about in the Globe. Grace Manfredonia passed away in 2012. She and her husband, Ralph, were our landlords, the owners of 74 Eutaw Street when I was a kid. Grace's parents, Angelo and Giuseppina Barranco, owned the house when we first moved in during WWII, and Grace and her husband, Ralph, took it over after the old-timers died off.

Actually, Grace had been friendly with my mother growing up, and Ralph and my father were high school chums, all from the same neighborhood. When they became the landlords, it was like family collecting the rent. Each first of the month, Mom, Dad, and I would go to the Manfredonia house for dinner and Dad would pay the rent.

In 1948, when TV hit Boston, the Manfredonia's were among the first in the neighborhood to buy one, and three of their children, John, Adelaide, and Fred, with me tagging along, would spend hours in their den watching live TV with Grace making hot chocolate each time.

Her late son, John, was born exactly one week before I was, and during our formative years, we were inseparable. When we became of age, we went separate ways, John into the service and I to college. Not long after I was out of school, we moved out of East Boston, but Mom, Dad, Ralph, and Grace kept in touch on a continual basis.

If I may, I would like to extend my most sincerest memorial wishes to all of the remaining children of Grace Manfredonia: Adelaide, Fred, and Josephine.

Adelaide, Fred, and Josephine, your mother was a gracious lady, and growing up, she was my second mother. My love and prayers go out to you all, peace.

Broiled or Baked HADDOCK ALLA SICILIANA Broiled Haddock Sicilian Style

1 pound haddock fillet*

1 medium onion

1 large chopped garlic clove or garlic powder

2 fresh tomatoes

1 tablespoon oregano flakes

1 or 2 tablespoons grated Romano cheese (optional) 2 tablespoons olive, canola,

or vegetable oil Salt and pepper

Spread some oil on bottom of a broiling tray or baking pan. Place haddock fillet skin down on tray or baking pan. Cut tomatoes into 1/4-inch slices and place over haddock fillet. Cut onion in 1/4-inch slices and layer over tomato. Sprinkle oregano, salt and pepper to taste over onion. Spread chopped garlic, or garlic powder, over contents. (Optional) sprinkle grated cheese over contents. Next, sprinkle oil of choice over all. Cover and place at least two inches below broiling coils. Broil for about fifteen minutes. Remove from broiler. If dry, add a small amount of water. Cover and return to broil for about ten minutes. Remove from oven. Baste haddock with the liquids that accumulate in the broiling tray or baking pan. Return uncovered and brown onions and tomato. Check frequently to prevent burning or drying out.

*Cooking time for the haddock fillet depends on the thickness of the fillet.



Back to the Fifties And Tom Yawkey Era

I received a lot of response to my Extra Inning column from last week about Tom Yawkey and Pumpsie Green coming up to the Red Sox in 1959. There was a time in my younger days when I never thought that Tom Yawkey was anything but a good baseball guy. But the more I research him, the less I like him

A few weeks back Dick Flavin who does a good baseball column in The Pilot. Yes, The Pilot! In fact, I think this Catholic newspaper has a sports page. Too bad the *Pilot* doesn't cover church politics as well as Flavin does baseball politics.

Flavin's July 26th column was super. He spoke of Pumpsie Green and his struggles to get to the Majors with the Sox. We all know with hindsight that Green was probably a P.R. move for the Red Sox which was the last Major League team to have a Black player on the field.

The Red Sox were not that great in the '50s when I started being a young fan. Everything I knew about Pumpsie back over 60 years ago was through the eyes of a 10-year-old. As I aged I learned more and more.

The more I learned about Red Sox Manager Pinky Higgins, the less I like him. In 1959, Pumpsie was hitting quite well in spring training but Higgins didn't care. He said at the time, "No (n-word) is going to play for this team as long as I have anything to say about it." He shipped Green back to Triple A in Minneapolis before the season began. The Red Sox started off 1959 just as badly as they played in '58, and Higgins was fired. Shortly after his firing,

Green was back up to the club for good.

Getting back to Red Sox history, the team actually signed a black player back in 1950. The player's name was Lorenzo "Piper" Davis from the Birmingham Black Barons of the Negro League. That also appears to be a P.R. move and Davis never made it to the team. He was a great player for the Negro League, but the Sox had no spot to play him in. He was never gonna get to the big leagues or Fenway Park without a game ticket.

Here's the rub, the Red Sox Double A team was the Birmingham White Barons and he couldn't play there, nor could he play with Triple A Louisville Colonels. They were both segregated baseball teams.

The Red Sox brief flirtation with racial equality ended in May 1950, a few weeks after my second birthday. Jump ahead nine years to Green, who was not a great player, he was better on the field than at bat, but he did become an inspiration to future black players, just as we know that Piper Davis was an inspiration to Green.

As Flavin ended his column, "All of that happened a long, long time ago, and the Red Sox have since seen the errors of their ways. But you can't erase the past."

Because I don't like who Tom Yawkey was overall, doesn't mean he was an evil racist or not. Many out there have their opinions of the man and his legacy. We have grown as a country in many ways, but we do have our past. We can move forward knowing we are now better than we were. Both as Americans and as baseball fans!


Midsummer Reading

Boxing Books that Belong in Every Fans Library

This time of the year it is common to see lists of book recommendations for summer reading. Often these lists are titled along the line of "Books to Bring to the Beach."

That has always made me chuckle as I love going to the beach but not to read. Sitting in the sun with the beautiful ocean in front of me is not conducive to sparking a desire to read. I prefer doing my reading at home where it is quiet and the distractions are few.

The one good thing about these lists is it gives people like me an excuse to recommend favorite books. In this case, the books will be some of my favorite boxing reads. It will be a brief list and is just a small sampling of titles that I think you will enjoy. I could have a much longer selection, but I decided to pick the few that I believe are absolute musts for any serious boxing enthusiast to have in his library.



My first choice is Mike Silver's The Arc of Boxing: The Rise and Decline of the Sweet Science. When I first read it in

2010, I was so impressed I put it at the top of my list for must read boxing books. Mike looks at boxing with the eye of an art critic. He knows the game and he understands the art. His arguments which I find indisputable about how and why boxing has become a lost art are measured well thoughtout, and solid. If you want to know what has happened to boxing over the years, and why today's boxing no longer even resembles what it was in its golden years, you will find the answers here. For instance, he points out the differences between a great scientific boxer and a boxer who may appear to have great skills but is relying on his physical talents instead of boxing IQ.

The best way to describe Glen's well written account of his time is the ring is to call it honest. His description of the gyms around Stockton, California during the early 1980s and his time spent as a sparring partner for lightheavyweight contender Yaqui Lopez is the stuff of novels.

The honesty in the book comes from Glen's openness in telling about the emotional struggle every boxer goes through, but few will admit. There was never a young man that laced on a pair of gloves who didn't somewhere in his head believe he would one day become a world champion. It is in facing the fact that you

can never succeed at something you love and desire so much that makes boxing such a cruel yet valuable parent.

I am not one to toss around the word classic, but I am also not alone in calling *Punching from the Shadows* one. This is an important boxing book as well as an important book about dealing with life.



I will finish by recommending a work of fiction that turned fifty years old this year. Leonard Gardner's Fat City is

one of the great boxing novels of all time. The story about washed up pro Billy Tully and novice Ernie Munger is set in Stockton, California, which makes it a great book to read in conjunction with Glen Sharp's memoir.

It is a dark story but the work is more poetry than prose. In less than 200-pages Leonard Gardner paints a picture in words that will remain vivid in your mind. I read it for the second time a couple of years ago when I was fortunate enough to spend some time with Leonard. He is a fascinating man who knows his boxing. He also knows human nature and is one incredible writer. If you haven't yet read this masterpiece, you are missing out on one of the best works of fiction written by an American author. It was also made into a terrific movie directed by John Huston with the screenplay also written by Leonard Gardner.

There you have four books that I can unreservedly recommend. I'll call them beach reading, but its okay if you sit in a chair at home and enjoy them. There are fewer distractions there.

HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

THE CUP COMES CLOSE — As we all remember the Bruins came so very close to claiming the Stanley Cup back in June, only to be denied in the seventh and deciding game of the Stanley Cup Final by the St. Louis Blues at the Garden.

But following tradition, the players, coaches and front office staff of the winning team each get to spend some time with the Cup, taking it wherever they choose and sharing the moments with family, friends and fans along the way.

That's how the Cup came to Manchester, New Hampshire on the first Monday in August. It was brought there by St. Louis Blues forward Zach Sanford, who was born on the North Shore in Salem but grew up in the Granite State, attending elementary school and high school there.

And he was a big Bruins fans back then before the ways of the hockey world sent him away from New England to display his talents in other regions of America.

"After Game 7 we were down on the ice, the Bruins ice, where he grew up idolizing them," stated Zach's mom Cindy Sanford to *Lawrence Eagle Tribune* writer Sean Whooley.

And it was that night at the Garden, the venue where he had once viewed his beloved B's, when Sanford really nailed the door shut on any hopes that the Bruins might have had to pull out a victory in the seventh and deciding game.

With the Bruins trailing 3-0 with just over four minutes left in Game 7 the former Boston College player found the range for a tally that made it 4-0, thus essentially extinguishing the last flicker of hope the Black and Gold had of scoring late goals to send the contest into overtime.

With 2:10 left in the contest Matt Grzelcyk got the B's on the board to make it 4-1 and thus Sanford's goal became important. It meant the Blues retained a virtually insurmountable three-goal lead.

Without Sanford's goal it would have been 3-1 and the B's might have had a slim thread of a chance to tie in regulation, especially with a sixth skater.

Yes, that would have been a very tough uphill climb. But fans in the region can recall that a team from the Hub did just that 10 years earlier to win the NCAA Division One National Championship.

It was back in 2009, when Boston University trailed Miami of Ohio by two goals with one minute remaining in the national title contest that was played in Washington, D.C. The Terriers then scored a goal with 59 seconds left and another with 17 second left to tie the count at 3-3 before winning the crown with a score some 12 minutes into the overtime session.

So Sanford's goal was a meaningful one in the sense that it eliminated a BU type comeback in the last game of the 2019 Stanley Cup Final that would determine the championship.

And Sanford was rewarded. About a month before he brought hockey's most famous

hardware home to New Hampshire, Sanford signed a twoyear, \$3 million contract with the Blues. He had put together a 20-point regular season (eight goals and 12 assists) while playing in 60 games and then added three assists in the playoffs to go with his goal in the deciding game of the Stanley Cup Final.

The \$3 million contract pales, of course, with those in the NBA. But when one thinks about it, how many 24 year olds in America are making \$1.5 million per year? Very, very few. So Zach has a lot to be thankful for.

It was, of course, the culmination of a process. For while he thought so highly of the Bruins as a youngster he was also writing a hockey tale of his own.

Sanford attended Green Acres Elementary School in Manchester and went on to play three years of hockey at Pinkerton Academy in Derry.

While he was there Pinkerton won the 2011-2012 state championship with a 19-2 record, a season that saw Sanford named New Hampshire High School Player of the Year.

For sure, he was on fire during that campaign, scoring 36 goals and adding 33 assists for a total of 69 points in those 21 contests during his junior season.

That certainly helped his prospects as he was selected 61st overall in the 2013 NHL draft by the Washington Capitals.

He played junior hockey for a couple of seasons and then, before joining the Caps, Sanford went to Boston College where he would play two years for legendary coach Jerry York. During his two seasons at The Heights the Eagles made the NCAA tournament twice.

He was a leading member (39 points in 41 games) of the 2015-2016 team that went 28-8-5 and won the Beanpot Tournament, the Hockey East regular season title and advanced to the 2016 Frozen Four. During his two-years at BC he played in 79 games, scoring 20 goals and adding 43 assists for a total of 63 points. He is the 20th former Boston College player to have his name engraved on the Stanley Cup.

Sanford split his first pro season between the Caps and their American Hockey League affiliate before being traded to the St. Louis Blues in February, 2017.

But injuries would take their toll early during the formative days of the 2017-2018 season as he suffered a dislocated shoulder while playing in a preseason game and later sustained a bruised lung while on a rehab assignment in the AHL. That meant he never played in a regular season NHL contest that year.

Thus, the 2018-2019 campaign was essentially his first full season in the NHL. And what a year it was. He scored his team's final goal in the seventh and deciding game of the Stanley Cup Final, capping a comeback that saw the Blues soar from last place in the 30-team NHL on January 3rd to winning the title on June 12th. He received a new contract and was able to share his joy with those in his home area. It was, in a word, fantastic.
