

THE TRUTH ABOUT THOSE SABINE GALS

The date given as the beginning of Rome is 753. Of course, there are few people who are unfamiliar with the story of Romulus and Remus. In their adult years, these twins had a great desire to found a city in the area where they were reared. Romulus took the Palatine and Remus took the Aventine. Each built walls around his domain. The most common story to come down to us from antiquity is that Remus leaped over the Palatine wall in mockery of his brother, whereupon Romulus, in great anger, slew him. At that time, Romulus is supposed to have said, "So perish whoever else shall leap over my wall." Romulus acquired sole power and founded the city, which bears his name.

After attending to the worship of the gods, Romulus called all of his people together and gave them the rules of law, since there was nothing else but law that could unite them. The city was expanding because they built their walls and defenses to suit the terrain rather than the population. They were strong and could wage war on any of their neighboring states, but the scarcity of women was their greatest problem because it posed the threat of being wiped out in a single generation and bring an end to the greatness of this young nation. Romulus sent envoys to the neighbors to make friendly advances and to provide for intermarriages, but they were rejected and returned without success.

Romulus concealed his resentment and started preparations for their national festival and games honoring Neptune, the mythical god of the sea.

The neighbors were invited, and many who lived nearby came to see the festival and this new city. The visitors included people from Caenina, Crustumium, Antemnae, and the Sabine country. Homes and hearts were opened to the visitors and they marveled at the rapid growth of the Roman nation. The start of the games occupied the attention of the guests and they didn't notice the assembling Romans in the background. At a given signal, the young males darted through the spectators to seize and carry off the maidens. Some of exceptional beauty were marked out in advance for the Senators, and these were taken to pre-designated houses. The games broke up in panic and the parents of the girls fled in great sorrow. They charged the Romans with violating the very essence of hospitality. The stolen maidens were no less indignant, and Romulus visited them to explain that it was the pride of the parents in refusing intermarriages that caused this deed. During the ensuing wars, the aggrieved nations were quickly defeated by the Romans and it was the body of the dead king of Caenina that was mounted on a frame, carried up to the Capitol Hill and deposited beside a sacred oak. Romulus then marked out the limits of a temple to Jupiter. After suitable offerings, this became the first temple that was consecrated in Rome.

History makes no further mention of these Sabine girls, but alludes to a generation of very happy Romans. What else can be said except "Figlio maschile e cento anni."

"The affable family man made up for a lack of education with sheer hard work. His hands



and clothing were always covered in grease," Sandra said.

Starting at the Cellucci home in Waltham, Danny built out the handful of businesses that evolved into Yolanda's wildly successful bridal store.

He could also execute whatever a fashion show or special event demanded, no matter how far-fetched.

As time passed, his own company grew. He sold his

successful mechanical contracting business only a few years ago.

Yolanda and Danny's tireless work ethic did not stop them from enjoying their success and rare true love. They celebrated 65 years of marriage in May.

"They had so much fun together," Sandra said. Her dad loved to dance and taught his three grandchildren the words to all his favorite songs by Sinatra, Dean Martin and Bobby Darin.

In 2018, tragedy struck when the couple lost their younger daughter Linda at 57 to cancer."

As Danny's health declined, their commitment to each other never wavered. "My mom sat by his bed every day for 13 hours a day for the last six weeks," Sandra said.


Robert E. "Buddy" Spagnuolo of the North End of Boston passed away peacefully on August 30, 2021.

L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Sweet, Sumptuous September

Lately, I have been paying special attention to the trees in my backyard. If I look at the leaves closely enough, I can detect the slightly perceptible hues of fall — crisp reds and golden yellows tickling the borders of still-green fronds. Small breezes lift a few orange leaves and blow them gently to the ground as they swirl around like tops. These sights, both the delicate colors and the falling of the leaves, are reminders that autumn is here, the season of cooler weather and harvest and the rhythms of nature. The month of September starts this wonderful season, bringing with it the smell of juicy apples and the purring motors of big yellow school buses. The beginning of September is always a very busy time for me, as it coincides with the commencement of the school year and all of the preparations that that entails. Nevertheless, when I stop to pause and really think about September, I feel a rise of excitement bubbling inside me. This is a month chock full of rustic holidays and old-country proverbs that highlight September's prominence as a seasonal turning point.

The first September holiday to occur in America is Labor

Day, falling on September 6th this year. A festival honoring the contributions of working people, Labor Day also signifies the unofficial end of summer, as many schools return to their sessions after this long weekend. As such, Labor Day is often celebrated with a picnic or barbecue, and this year I will add to the food tradition by baking a sparkling apple cider pound cake or an applecream cheese crisp to honor the seasonal flavors of this month. Over in Italy, September heralds a flurry of feasts and activities that will last until the holiday season in the winter. It begins in a regal fashion, with Venice's Regatta Storica occurring on the first Sunday of the month. In this renowned boat race, a parade of elegant gondolas introduces an intense competition where skilled rowers in various different categories vie for first place. This event has a royal pedigree, as it is modeled after the welcome procession given to the queen of Cyprus, Caterina Cornaro, when she returned to Venice in 1489. Later in the month, the people in Naples celebrate the feast day of Saint Gennaro on September 19th, when spectators wait to see the mysterious and then hold an eight-day party as stalls selling trinkets and candy line the streets. This holiday has become so popular that many Italian-American communities hold their own Festa di San Gennaro. Autumn intensifies around the fall equinox, arriving on the 22nd of the month, after which the balance between daylight and night tips towards the edge of darkness. Finally, the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel, or San Michele l'Arcangelo, closes out the month on September 29th. Also known as Michaelmas, this ancient feast features the autumnal themes of balance — the scales of St. Michael echo the equal hours of day and night during the equinox — and harvest, as ingredients like carrots and ginger are traditional on this day. For our Italian ancestors of yore, September meant collecting the harvest, enjoying the bounty of the Earth, and

preparing food for the winter. In this deeply agricultural society, proverbs reminded farmers to pay attention to the weather and the crops in order to ensure a successful harvest. Rain in September proved a mixed blessing. One proverb bluntly states that "La pioggia di settembre è veleno per l'uva," meaning that September rain is like poison for grapes. However, another proverb happily declares "A settembre pioggia e luna, è dei funghi la fortuna," advising farmers that rain and moonlight made favorable conditions for collecting mushrooms, such as the delectable Italian truffles. Other dictums reflect the changing weather of the month, as summer turns to autumn. A delightful little ditty proclaims: "Aria settembrina fresco la sera e fresco la mattina." According to this proverb, September air is cool during both the evenings and the mornings. This axiom reminds me of the autumnal mist I often see rising above fields like lace on crisp mornings, or dark evenings huddled under a blanket and drinking a cup of apple cider. Italian truisms even mention the autumn equinox. "Di Settembre *la notte col dì contende"* roughly translates that night competes with day during September. a reminder of the long winter evenings to come.

From holidays to proverbs, September is a month brimming with great significance as a seasonal milestone. Whether you enjoy the changing foliage or admire the taste of a fresh apple, be sure to pause and be grateful for all that the autumn has to offer. For it is autumn that teaches us humility before the gifts of the Earth and an appreciation for the cycle of the year. Therefore, no matter how you desire to honor September, let us toast to a month full of bountiful blessings and new beginnings!


The Walk to the Feast (continued)





Ingrid married a nobleman referred to as Sir Sigge, who likely died in 1271. After being widowed, Ingrid and her sister Kristina became a part of a group of devout women around the Dominican friar Petrus de Dacia in Skänninge. In one of his letters, Petrus de Dacia has left a description of the ascetic life style and mystic revelations of one of his «spiritual daughters» in this group of women, which likely refers to Ingrid.

In 1272, this group of women formed an informal convent called Saint Martin's in Skanninge dedicated on August 15, 1281. Ingrid made pilgrimages to Santiago de Compostela, Jerusalem and Rome. After the death of her sister, Ingrid applied for formal recognition of her convent. This was granted in 1281, a year before she passed away. It was destroyed during the Reformation.

The canonization process for Ingrid began, but due to the Reformation, she was never formally canonized. She is regarded as a saint by many and has her feast day listed on the liturgical calendar as September $2^{\rm nd}$.



With her signature tease and straight up snarl on full

Nanna & Babbononno

A Nostalgic Remembrance



Labor Day weekend was the climax for the county fairs in much of the country back in the day. There was one fair that ended the season for Dad, the Schaghticoke Fair in Rensselaer County, New York. After the Labor Day weekend, he would head back to his day job with the Boston Public Schools, and playing with several bands in Boston, and I would head back to school.

It was September of 1950, and Dad packed his '49 Chevy with his instruments, stage clothing, everything Mom and I would need, and then picked up Nanna and Babbononno to give them one last hurrah before fall set in. There would be a dog act at the fair presented by Johnny Laddie, who along with his wife, came from Foggia, the town in Italy where Babbononno came from. The Laddies had met Nanna and Babbononno when we were all at another fair earlier that summer and my grandparents had a great time. So, Dad insisted that they accompany us.

I had found myself a job at several fairs. A man named Louie, from South Boston was the scenery man for the stage shows at most of those fairs and hired me as his assistant for \$35.00 a week, not bad for a 12-year-old kid in 1950. Each fairground had a grandstand aside a racetrack, and a stage across from the middle of it. During the day, between sulky races, Dad and the band would serenade the racing enthusiasts with Dixieland music. At night, the fair presented several acts of entertainment and Dad and the band would play the music behind them for the crowd. Louie was not at Schaghticoke, and I was out of luck.

Chet Nelson, the bandleader, told Dad that he would speak to the managers of the fair and try to find something for me to do. The King Reid Company handled the fairway rides, games of chance and eateries, and I was hired by them to assist a novelty sales-man. If folks didn't win any prizes at the games of chance on the fairway, they could buy novelties from us and tell their friends that they won them.

Each morning, Norman, the novelty salesman, and I would set up the stand. You name it and we sold it: Kewpie dolls, bamboo canes, ceramic animals, stuffed animals — especially, teddy bears, balloons, funny hats, and all kinds of kids' toys. Seeing that this was the Labor Day weekend and most of the customers were local farmers, we did a land office business. I was offered \$10.00 dollars a day

and was satisfied. I even got an hour off for lunch, but didn't eat on the fairway. A tent had been set up behind the stage at the track, which was a combination of dressing rooms for the entertainment and a commissary where we could eat "real food."

Nanna and Mrs. Laddie decided to cook Italian food for my family and theirs, and their offerings were much better than the greasy burgers found at the fairway food stands. On the first day, I brought a doggy bag back for my boss, Norman. When he saw the food his comment was, "You Aye-rabs really know how to eat." I tried to explain but to no avail, so for the length of my employment, I was an Aye-rab. Before I go on, let me describe my boss, Norman. He was built like W.C. Fields, had a red face and a bulbous nose that was even redder than his complexion with many purple lines that caused his face and nose to look like a 3D road map. He got that way from 100 proof liquid, not the summer sunshine. He was my boss and I had no alternative other than quit my job.

Mom, Nanna, and Babbononno dropped by several times to make sure I was OK. Dad came by only once considering his schedule, and when Norman saw him, asked him if he ever rode a camel. I didn't know if Dad was going to laugh or hit him. He chose to laugh it off.

I was interested in a stand that was set up near us. It was about 10 foot square with a railing all the way around. In the middle were tables with all kinds of glassware, dinner plates, cups, saucers, and a few water pitchers. Customers would pitch coins at the glassware, nickels, dimes, and quarters. If the coins landed in or on anything, you were a winner. Most of the time, the coins slid off landing on the tables. The three brothers who ran the stand were new to America having recently emigrated from Greece. By the end of the fair weekend, the one brother who spoke English told me that they had made \$10,000. Back then, that was a lot of money.

As each night wore on, Norman would disappear for a few minutes at a time and return smelling like a still each time. I didn't know what he drank, but you could smell him before you saw him. As a result, I handled most of the customers. Norman didn't trust me and had me turn in each amount I collected immediately after each sale. I was a kid and had to deal with it.

On the second night, after we closed the souvenir stand, I headed to the tent behind the stage, where the band and the entertainers would hang out. There were two men who did a pantomime act. They called themselves the Bryants and were funny and entertaining. When Mrs. Laddie and Nanna served them some Italian delicacies that they had prepared, the Bryants took off their jackets and I noticed that each had numbers tattooed on their arms. Innocently, I asked them what they represented. I then got an earful and an awakening.

It seems that they were two Jewish entertainers caught up in Nazi Germany in the late 1930s. They were imprisoned in a concentration camp and left to rot or die. Fortunately, the camp they were in was liberated by American troops and they were among the few survivors. After the war, they made it to America and resumed their prewar pantomime act.

Labor Day was the last hurrah and the farmers went all out to spend the money they had been saving for the annual fair. The fairway was packed with men, women, and kids all trying their skills at throwing balls at metal bottles, throwing darts at balloons, shooting at targets with rifles and pistols, and engaging in whatever games of chance were presented to them. Rides galore had waiting lines and remained open until the crowd began to thin out. The sad part of the long weekend was saying goodbye to everyone, the musicians, the entertainers, and the workers we had become friendly with. Most of those fairs are long gone, but the memories are still with me. What a way to go.

I don't think I've ever met anyone that didn't love Ricotta Cookies. For that reason, I always include them anytime I make cookie trays! These soft, sweet pillowy delights just melt in your mouth and while they are ever so delicious, recipes for them tend to vary in texture as well as in flavor. Most call for the use of butter, while some of the older versions you'll find, use margarine. Flavors also differ and include vanilla, lemon, orange and almond. Often, these are even interchanged, and one flavor will be used for the cookie while another for the icing.

Years back, while sifting through my Nonna's recipes, I found a few she had handwritten on the back of an envelope. They had "excellent" written in the upper left corner (something she did anytime she liked a recipe). One of these recipes called for "oleo" (margarine) and was vanilla flavored, the other was lemon flavored and used butter. While both are equally delicious, these "Lemon Ricotta Cookies" are the most sought after. These lemony soft ricotta pillows are wonderful to include in a cookie tray or just perfect when served on their own. My Nonna was right; this really is an "excellent" recipe!

LEMON RICOTTA COOKIES

Biscotti Ricotta al Limone



Cookies:

- 1 stick unsalted butter, room temperature
- 1 egg
- 1 egg 1 cup sugar
- ½ pound ricotta (Impastata or well drained)

Icing/Glaze:

2 cups confectionary sugar 8 teaspoons fresh lemon juice grated rind of 1 organic lemon 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice 1 teaspoon vanilla

2 cups all-purpose flour

½ teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon baking soda ½ teaspoon salt

Preheat oven to 350°. In a mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar. Add egg, beat together then mix in ricotta, lemon rind and juice, and vanilla. In a separate bowl sift flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt together. Gradually mix into wet mixture. Using a small or medium cookie scoop or teaspoon, drop cookies onto prepared baking sheet. Bake at 350° for about 14 minutes or just until golden on bottom. Cool on wire rack.

For icing, mix confectionary sugar with lemon juice until a thin glaze. Ice cookies and sprinkle with colored sugar, nonpareils or just keep them plain.

Talking about systemic racism as the blame for all bad things happening to black Americans is, says McWhorter,



The Streetcar Series that Almost Was

Over the 53 seasons in which the Boston Braves and Red Sox played together in the city, only once was there close to being a cross-town streetcar World Series, back in 1948.

The Braves had dominated the late 1800s, winning 11 pennants in their first 29 seasons. The Red Sox had won 5 World Series and another pennant in their first 18 years starting in 1900, along with a solo world championship for the Braves in 1914. Besides those, both clubs had only one pennant between them, in 1946. The Sox had taken the St Louis Cardinals to 7 games before Enos Slaughter of the Redbirds made his mad dash home from first on a single in the bottom of 8th. Shortstop Johnny Pesky held the ball for a split second too long on a relay throw, allowing Slaughter to score the eventual winning run.

In 1948 the Braves had won the National League pennant in unlikely fashion, winning 91 games in a decidedly mediocre year for the league. The offensive standouts for the team included outfielder Jeff Heath, who was acquired from the St Louis Browns, and Tommy Holmes. Both hit over .300 with Heath also clobbering 20 homers. Three infielders also had

excellent seasons. Rookie shortstop Alvin Dark and second baseman Eddie Stanky hit .320 and .322 respectively, while reigning NL MVP third baseman Bob Elliot also smashed 23 dingers for the club.

The real strength of the team was its two ace starters, young Warren Spahn and Johnny Sain. Spahn was the only Brave who started in Boston to make the Hall of Fame in the 20th century. Pitching in the massive pitcher friendly Braves Field, they combined for 39 wins and inspired the rally cry: "Spahn and Sain and pray for rain", to denote the patchwork condition of the rest of the pitching staff. Manager Billy Southworth made the most of his ragtag group of veterans and rookies, plugging in players when he knew their strengths would be utilized and their weaknesses downplayed.

The Red Sox, meanwhile, had acquired two top pitchers in Jack Kramer and Ellis Kinder, and all-star hitting shortstop Vern Stephens from the same cash-strapped St Louis Browns before the 1948 season. Adding those three to a team with Ted Williams and ace Mel Parnell made the Sox a formidable choice for the pennant. They also added World Series winning manager Joe McCarthy, plucked from their arch-nemesis, the New York Yankees.

Thus the American League race went down to the wire, with the Yankees, Sox and Cleveland Indians being within 2 games of each other by the end. Boston would beat their rivals, winning the last two games in Fenway Park against them knocking them out of the race. The Indians would lose the

last game of the regular season, with ace Bob Feller losing to Hal Newhouser and the Detroit Tigers to force a one game playoff at Fenway Park to decide the

McCarthy then made a major blunder, for instead of starting southpaw Parnell in the do-ordie match, went with veteran Denny Galehouse against Tribe knuckleballer Gene Bearden. This was done supposedly because the wind was blowing out to the short leftfield on the day of the game.

Galehouse, who had only pitched twice in the previous two weeks, gave up a homer early to player manager and league MVP Lou Boudreau of the Indians, and was out by the fourth inning. Bearden on the other hand pitched the game of his life, going the distance and giving up only one earned run on one day's rest, as the Indians won 8-3 to clinch the pennant. The Red Sox players were floored by the decision to start the so-so Galehouse, who was mostly a relief pitcher, and this would hint at more heartache to come in the next season, 1949.

The Braves were dealt a serious blow with 4 games left in the season, with Jeff Heath breaking his leg while sliding into home plate. He would not be available for the postseason. In game one of the World Series, Sain led the team to victory anyway, winning a 1-0 thriller over Bob Feller of the Indians. But the Braves could not overcome the loss of Heath. The stellar pitching of Bob Lemon and Bearden, as well as the timely hitting of Jim Hegan, Larry Doby, Lou Boudreau, and Joe Gordon helped Cleveland win 4 out of the last 5 games. The Indians were World Champions, and have not won since, only coming close in 2015.

In 1949, the Braves would have a quick come down, only winning 75 games. The Red Sox would lose out on the Pennant once again on the last day of the season, this time to the Yankees, after only having to win one of the last two games in Yankee Stadium.

Braves Field attendance would continue to dwindle, and Braves owner Lou Perini was tired of playing second fiddle to the Red Stockings. The Braves would move to Milwaukee after the 1952 season, and were welcomed with massive crowds in Brewtown, leaving Beantown with one lone baseball team.

There have been 14 times when teams from New York have faced off against each other in a Subway Series for the World Championship, the most recent being in 2000 when the Yankees beat the Mets in 6 games. Yet it could have been one hell of a World Series between two bitter intercity rivals in the Olde Boston Town in '48, had things turned out slightly different.

However, 1948 wasn't all bad for Boston. After all, Post-Gazette columnist Sal Giarratani was born that year.



ten pounds. Ray had avenged that loss. Robinson had victories over Sammy Angott, Fritzie Zivic, Marty Servo, and Maxie Shapiro. Even with those wins behind him, the Armstrong fight was seen as a real test for him.

Fans were curious if Robinson could overcome the onslaught of Homicide Hank, and a crowd of 15,371 showed up to see what would happen.

The fight itself turned out to be a bit of a disappointment as Ray won every round.



On August 27, 1943, former three-division champion Henry Armstrong took on the future welterweight and middleweight champion Sugar Ray Robinson at Madison Square Garden. The bout was scheduled for ten rounds.

When the two met, Henry had 157 fights under his belt. He had won the featherweight, welterweight, and lightweight titles. He held these undisputed titles simultaneously, being the only man to do so. He also came within a whisker of winning the middleweight title when he fought champion Cerferino Garcia to a draw. He did this all at a time when there were only eight weight divisions in boxing. Add to that the level of competition at the time and it becomes truly astounding to think that

Armstrong had faded more than was thought while Robinson was fast turning into the greatest fighter pound for pound of all time

It's is widely believed Ray could have stopped Armstrong but chose not to out of respect for the former champ whom he admired. And while it is sad to see a great champion in the last stages of his career, this was not as painful as what would

happen years later when Joe Louis would be seen knocked unconscious by an up and coming Rocky Marciano.

Henry Armstrong announced his retirement immediately after losing to Robinson, but he was back in the ring just five months later. Henry would continue fighting for another two years before calling it quits for good. He had 22 more fights winning 17 while losing only 3 and fighting 2 draws.

In retirement Henry became an ordained minister and devoted his life to working with underprivileged children. He passed away in 1988 at the age of 78. During his career he defeated 16 world champions, and had a record of 22-3-1 in word title fights. His record stands at 22-7-1 against current, former, and future world champions. His overall record is an unbelievable 180 total fights with 149 wins, 21 losses, and 10 draws. He scored an astounding 99 kayos.


While a lot of boxing aficionados are familiar with Armstrong



he could have accomplished such a feat.

At the time of the Robinson fight Armstrong's title fighting days were behind him. He was still a force to be reckoned with, but he was in decline. He had been fighting since 1931.


The bout was a classic matchup of fading former champ versus the rising star. Robinson had established himself as a force to be contended with. He entered the ring with a record of 44 wins and just 1 loss. That loss came at the hands of middleweight Jake LaMotta who outweighed Ray by





and most agree he deserves recognition as a great fighter, it is sad his name is not mentioned more often as possible the greatest pound for pound fighter who ever lived. He is certainly a contender for that honor.

As for Sugar Ray Robinson, he would go on to have a spectacular career and being widely acknowledged as the greatest fighter of all time. It's too bad these two greats hadn't met in their primes.



RAJON RONDO: READY FOR ANOTHER ROUSING YEAR—For close to nine seasons he was ours, a somewhat overlooked player on the parquet in the era of Big Three stars Kevin Garnett, Paul Pierce and Ray Allen.

Part of that might be because of his physical stature. NBA players tend to be tall but in a group of men who always seemed outsized to citizens of average height, there was a natural common man aspect to him. When you asked Rajon Rondo a question you could look him in the eye straight ahead, rather than having to gaze upward a bit. That was because he was 6-1 — rather diminutive when standing near his fellow teammates.

He was, in retrospect, a representative of the general public, so to speak, in a galaxy of greatness.

But no mistake about it, Rajon Rondo belonged on an NBA court. And his accomplishments were vital.

It's just that his contributions were overshadowed by the scoring and rebounding done by others. You see, Rondo was the engine that ran the team on the floor, bringing the ball up and setting the play that the team would run into motion.

Ray Allen from the corner, Paul Pierce from the outside, Kevin Garnett off the glass. Dominating video highlights and headlines in the sports pages. But the one who passed them the ball often was relegated to the regions of lesser recognition.

And that's because he specialized in assists, dishing off the ball to the ones who would then go on to make the scoring plays. Few fans can recall who passed the ball to the player who made the memorable basket. During the years that he was with the Celtics that player quite often was Rajon Rondo.

And now as the NBA teams convene later in September for the start of training camp it is Rondo who is the sole survivor of those outstanding Celtic squads, the only one from the 2008 NBA championship team that is still suiting up and reporting for duty.

There are 30 teams in the NBA and Rondo has been affiliated with nine of them, sometimes for multiple seasons and sometimes for shorter stretches.

The stop for the 2021-2022 season is the Los Angeles Lakers, following a contract buyout with Memphis, with whom he had spent just all of 15 days this summer, after being sent by the Los Angeles Clippers to the Grizzlies in a trade in the middle of August. Between the buyout and his one-year, \$2.6 million contract with the Lakers, he will make \$7.6 million for the upcoming season.

That is small money in today's NBA where multi-year contracts can sometimes exceed \$100 million.

The move will serve as Rondo's reuniting with the Lakers, the Louisville native having played for them for two seasons (2018-2019 and 2019-2020). The 2020 playoff team will live forever in NBA history since the Lakers captured the title in the Orlando bubble during the first year of the COVID-19 pandemic.

This year's L.A. Lakers team will seem like a departure from normality in a league that often features younger stars. When the Lakers first gather at training camp, as things stand now, Rondo will be joining a squad that features a collection of all-star veterans including LeBron James, Russell Westbrook, Dwight Howard, Carmelo Anthony and Marc Gasol.

There's no question that Rondo had his best years while with the Celtics. For the better part of seven season he averaged double figures in scoring per game in regular season matchups. He did the same in five consecutive playoff years as well.

He missed the first half of the 2012-2013 season with a torn ACL and later was traded to Dallas in December, 2014. Two weeks later (January 2, 2015) he returned to score 29 points as the Mavericks beat the Celtics at the Garden.

After leaving the Hub, he essentially bounced around the league, spending half a season with Dallas, followed by solo seasons with Sacramento, Chicago and New Orleans. He then played two years with the Lakers and split the 2020-2021 season between Atlanta and the L.A. Clippers.

So it is a new year and a former team that awaits Rajon Rondo in his 16th season. The Lakers and the Phoenix Suns appear to be the preseason favorites to duel for the Western Conference title, a prognostication that obviously means that one of the two would advance to the 2022 NBA Finals. Of course, additional teams will have a significant say as to whether that prediction comes to fruition.

Rondo has put himself in a position to once again pursue a path of success. Whether or not the coming season will be a Sweet 16 for him only time will tell.

IT'S A BIG DEAL — Yes, it sure is, the contract extension that star forward Kevin Durant recently signed with the Brooklyn Nets.

The new deal is a four-year pact worth a total of \$198 million that will keep Kevin with the team through the end of the 2025-2026 season.

He can't start receiving payouts from the deal right away. First, he must play out the final year of his existing contract with Brooklyn. That's the one that will pay him \$42 million for the 2021-2022 fiscal year (July 1-June 30).

Then next July 1st (really New Year's Day in the NBA) he'll start on the new contract, one that begins with an annual payout of \$44 million for 2022-2023 and features annual increases. The figures for the final year (2025-2026) come to \$54.7 million.

Just to give you an idea of what a vast amount such as that is really like. In the final year of his contract, Durant will earn over a million dollars a week (\$1,051, 923). That works out to \$150,274

So, as an example, if Kevin went to bed at midnight and got up at 8 in the morning he would already have earned just over \$50,000 while he was sleeping. And that's for each and every day, year round. As far as we could tell, there aren't any incentives (thankfully). Basketball is a great sport. But is any player worth that amount of money? We don't think so.
