Stirpe Nostra

ADDIO SPORCACCIONE

To this day, the Isle of Capri boasts of the Villas of Tiberius, but not too much is said about those unfortunate souls who, after enduring long and agonizing tortures, were cast headlong from high cliffs into the sea. This was all done before the eyes of Tiberius while a band of soldiers waited below for the bodies to surface and then broke their bones with boathooks and oars to prevent any breath of life from remaining in them.

Probably the most fiendish and perverted of his tortures is the one that he devised himself. This consisted in tricking some men into filling themselves with enormous quantities of wine and then suddenly ordering that their privates be tied to prevent passage of their urine while being tortured in other ways.

No person accused of even the most minor offense was spared from torment and death. Those who wished to die were forced to live and those who committed suicide were said to have given the emperor the "slip." One man who begged for a speedy death was told by Tiberius, "I have not yet become your friend." An ancient custom considered it to be a sign of irreverence to strangle maidens; therefore, young girls condemned to death were first violated by the executioner and then strangled.

In his physical make-up, Tiberius was quite large and had a strong frame. His stature was above the average with broad shoulders and chest, and he was well proportioned from head to foot. His left hand was so powerful that he could bore through a fresh sound apple with his finger or break the head of a young man with just a flip. He was in excellent health for most of his political life and never needed the aid or advice of a physician. Not unlike other emperors, he was scared shirtless of lightning and even wore a laurel wreath during storms because it was believed that lightning never struck that plant.

Tiberius died on March 16th in the year 37 A.D. in his villa at Lucullus, in the 78^{th} year of his life, after 23 years of reign. Some think that Gaius (Caligula) gave him a slow and wasting poison, while others claim he was smothered with a pillow. According to still another writer, he was conscious of his approaching death and took off his ring as if to give it someone. He put the ring back on his finger and clenched his hand, as he lay motionless for a long time. He called for his attendants and, after receiving no response, he got out of bed. His strength failed as he tried to walk and he fell dead.

At the first news of his death, many people ran about the city shouting "Tiberius to the Tiber," while others prayed to their gods to provide him no everlasting home except among the damned. Added to the memory of his former cruelty was a later senatorial edict that the execution of all condemned should be put off for 10 days after conviction. The punishment of one group of prisoners fell due on

the day when news was received about Tiberius. The unfortunate who were condemned begged the public for protection but, in the absence of Caligula, no one dared act contrary to the law and the execution was carried out. Thus, the cruelty of Tiberius lasted even after his death.



North End Outdoor Dining Update

For the 2022 outdoor dining season, participating North End restaurants agreed to pay a fee to help offset the City's expenses due to the unique impacts outdoor dining has on the neighborhood. To date the City has collected about \$300,000 from businesses participating in the program. Mayor Wu created an outdoor dining committee, I myself being on this committee question these amounts:

- 1. Public Safety (traffic detail and enforcement) \$38,800?
- 2. Public Works (Sweeping, power washing, equipment) \$623,770?
- 3. Boston Transportation Department (signage and per sonnel) \$51,760?
- 4. Spending Total: \$714,330 Percentage of amount spent (as of late July) Public Safety 5.43% Public Works 87.32% Boston Transportation Dept. 7.25%

I totally disagree and think that restaurant owners are being treated unfairly. Not enough has been done for me to agree with this amount. No traffic detail has occurred except in the beginning and only for a few days, you would see officers on Hanover Street, since then you can't find an officer.

Part of Hanover Street became ONE WAY when outside dining began this spring. Delivery trucks were designated a specific parking area, yet they continue to park (and double park) on both sides of the street, backing up traffic. Where are the police officers? How can the City of Boston come up with the above amount?

Sweeping, power washing WHAT? Restaurants owners have been power washing their own sidewalks and where their

tables and chairs are placed for outside dining. There has been nothing extra added to the North End streets and sidewalk sanitation. I witnessed a restaurant owner on Salem Street power washing the sidewalk and clean the side alley because people throw their trash all over the alley. I have yet to see a City truck clean the streets other than the usual twice a week. WHAT POWER WASHING HAS THE CITY DONE? \$623,700, ARE YOU KIDDING ME?

Boston Transportation Dept. Signage our crosswalks haven't been painted since outdoor dining? Look around the North End since outdoor dining began in the spring, nothing has improved RULES HAVE BEEN IN PLACE AND AGAIN NOTHING HAS BEEN DONE TO ENFORCE THESE RULES. IS THE CITY GIVING THE NORTH END being taken advantage of? I have not seen one City employee assigned to overlook outside dining and keep a record. NOT ONE; no RULES APPLY ONLY FOR THOSE THAT THE CITY SEES FIT.

Restaurant owners were told that plants had to be a certain height, and rules have been followed, yet some plants were removed, which I can't understand WHY, when the plants were all the same? Streets signs on the sidewalk make it difficult for people to walk are still out there -- not one sign, but three. Why?

Restaurant owners where told no silverware, glasses, or dishes are to be outside for safety reasons, yet some restaurant owners don't follow the rules and the City does not follow up. One restaurant not only has the dishes, glasses etc., but have their heating elements outdoor to keep the food warm. WHEN DOES IT END? ... WHEN DOES THE CITY DO THEIR JOB? The City has told the residents if you have a problem call 311 and report it, but when you call 311, they tell you to call 911. Nothing is ever done about it, nor do I believe it has been reported. Police officers never come ... NEVER!

As usual, Mayor Wu and the City of Boston have not made outdoor dining enjoyable for the residents that live here. The promises that were made to make it easier for tourists, residents. and elderly to get around have not been kept. The streets are filthy, no additional trash containers; signs occupying the sidewalks; no police details; and no power washing. Has anv rodent spraying been done? The owners of the restaurants paid \$7,500.00, plus a separate amount for resident parking, and the City is throwing out these figures are totally impossible for me to swallow and accept. North End restaurants put up a lot of money to continue outdoor dining. The weather has been HOT ... HOT customers do not want to sit outdoors and that is another inconvenience for the restaurant owners. Are the restaurant owners fed up with the City's agreements that have been unfair? Will outdoor dining finally end?

I have lived here my entire life and will never UNDERSTAND HOW THE CITY OF BOSTON DECIDES WHAT IS RIGHT OR WRONG FOR NORTH END RESIDENTS TO KEEP OUR NEIGHBORHOOD SAFE, THE QUALITY OF LIFE, OR HOW THE RESTAURANT OWNERS CONTINUE TO DO OUTDOOR DINING AND NOT BE TREATED FAIRLY IS BEYOND ME.

Harvest on Vine Summer BBQ



L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Ferragosto: Italy's Day of Rest and Relaxation

There is no use hiding it anymore: autumn is coming. The signs of the changing season pulsate all around me. The evenings fall earlier, a dusky blue mantel of sky covering the Earth, and the air feels crisper as well. The earliest crop of apples has arrived at markets, and I cannot wait to enjoy this succulent fruit in cakes, breads, crisps and as a simple snack. Even Halloween decorations, smiling pumpkins and arched black cats, begin to wink from store shelves amidst all the notebooks and pencils of back-to-school sales. Although autumn is my favorite season, I am determined to hold on to the rest of the summer for as long as I can, until the school bell rings in September. After all, the days are still warm and the sun still bakes the Earth. Indeed, in Italy, summer vacation remains in full swing. The biggest summer holiday in Italy occurs on August 15th, though Italians extend the celebrations for several weeks before or after. For this feast, named Ferragosto, Italians leave the cities en masse to spend time at the beach or mountains. Caught between the heat and idleness of summer and the rhythmic nature of fall, Ferragosto provides Italy with one last joyous blast of the vacation season.

Visiting Italy during August can sometimes resemble walking through the quiet remains of an ancient civilization. Tourists abound, of course, but many Italians have already escaped the scorching heat of cities and towns once August begins, embarking on their Ferragosto vacations until the holiday culminates on August 15th. I remember the slightly eerie sensation of walking through Rome one August while on a trip years ago and noticing the boarded-up restaurants and theaters and shops. Meanwhile, the Italian coastline brims with

colorful beach umbrellas and chic sunbathers, the sands chockablock with impromptu volleyball games and radios blaring the latest hits. Italians even exchange holiday greeting cards emblazoned with pictures of beach picnics and grinning suns. In small Italian villages, such as my father's home outside of Sulmona in Abruzzo, people celebrate Ferragosto with shady al fresco dinners, featuring the seasonal produce of zucchinis, tomatoes, peppers and herbs. This holiday has been important to Italians since ancient times. It hearkens back to the year 18 B.C., when the Emperor Augustus established the Feriae Augustae — Festivals of Augustus — in honor of his reign. Some historians suspect that Augustus's festivals replaced older holidays like the Vinalia rustica, which marked the grape harvest. For all its modern trappings, therefore, Ferragosto remains a seasonal celebration honoring the freshair pleasures of summer and the harvest.

August 15th holds another great significance in Italian culture: it is the feast day of the Assumption, or L'Assunzione. This religious holiday observes the Virgin Mary's physical and spiritual Ascent into Heaven. Italian villages and towns combine Ferragosto and L'Assunzione festivities by holding parades and processions where the statue of the Blessed Virgin Mary is held aloft. In the medieval city of Siena, the famous Palio, or Renaissance horse race, occurs around this time. Around Europe, in fact, the Feast of the Assumption also serves as an important seasonal marker, heralding the start of the harvest. Armenian farmers bring freshly harvested grapes to church on the Sunday closest to the Assumption so that the priest may bless the fruit. In Poland, where the Virgin Mary of the Assumption is also known as the Blessed Mother of the Herbs, people gather herbs and have them blessed in church and later display those herbs around their homes for protection. I honor the harvest qualities of the Assumption by baking cheesy biscuits studded with chivesboth the wheat and the herbs symbolize the bounty of Mother Earth. The pungent aroma and simple texture of these small breads remind me that August means far more than the end of summer; rather, it is a time to be thankful for the gifts of nature and to appreciate the cyclical changing of the seasons much as our ancestors did.

Therefore, August in Italy teaches us to live in the moment. Though we may be worried about the stress of the upcoming cold-weather months, the holiday of Ferragosto encourages us to seize the last few weeks of summer with fanfare and fun, enjoying the cool waters of the ocean or a picnic under the stars, surrounded by family and friends. Meanwhile, the Feast of the Assumption emphasizes the bountiful harvest that characterizes the late summer and fall, as well as the beauty of the changing seasons. Let us allow the lessons of these two holidays to permeate our lives and let us carry the pleasures of August with us always.

P.S. Happy Birthday to my father Rocco Di Censo, who was born the day after Ferragosto. Daddy, I love you always!

Saint Maria de Mattias

by Bennett Molinari and Richard Molinari

Maria was born February 4, 1805 in Vallecorsa, in the Province of Frosinone, Italy, to a religious and well-to-do family that valued education. She was the second of four children of Giovanni de Mattias and Ottavia de Angelis. But even with all of her privilege, she had to teach herself to read and write because women did not receive formal education at the time.

Maria felt a calling at a young age, she believed was a calling from God, and experienced a mystical vision at 16 that ignited her passion for improving the lives of those in her community. She wandered the roads, explaining the love of God to any who would listen.

At age 17, she attended a mission preached by Saint Gaspare

de Bufalo, and saw the obvious changes to people who attended. She wanted to have the same effect, and with the aid of Venerable Giovanni Merlini she founded the Congregation of the Sisters Adorers of the Blood of Christ in Acuto, Italy on March 4, 1834, a woman's congregation for teaching girls. She expanded their work to teaching and catechizing women and boys.

Over the next 32 years, Maria de Mattias established nearly 70 schools, most of them in under-served towns and rural areas. She died in 1866. The Feast Day of Saint Maria de Mattias is February 4th.

Throughout her life, other women joined her work, forming a community that eventually opened missions in Europe, the United States, China, Brazil, Congo, Australia, and other places throughout the world. Maria was canonized in 2003, recognized for her missionary zeal. Her commitment, compassion, and courage continue to inspire those who hear her story.

Few musicians manage to make a worldwide impact with their music. Fewer still manage to pull that trick off twice but Dez Fafara, the leader of DevilDriver, is one of this elite number. Formed in Santa Barbara, CA in 2002 when vocalist & frontman Dez Fafara's previous band Coal Chamber were winding down, the five piece have

since become a constant and dynamic force in the metal world over the best part of the last two decades. Now this deluxe collection of their first five albums entitled Clouds Over California documents their meteoric rise and is available in deluxe splatter LP and expanded CD format. DevilDriver's first, self-titled album DevilDriver (White / Orange / Brown Splatter LP), had established a successful, groove-heavy precedent on its release in 2003 — but when the Californian quintet got together to compose material for the follow-up album two years later, their music had evolved to an unexpected degree, the result was The Fury Of Our Makers Hand (Blue / Orange Splatter 2LP). 2007s The Last Kind Words (Yellow / Beige / Green splatter 2LP) was recorded as the, then DevilDriver line-up reached the apogee of its powers, ranging from mercilessly fast extreme metal, to subtler, slower territory and all points between. When Pray For Villains (White / Red / Black splatter 2LP) was recorded and released in 2009 the album was a deliberate attempt by DevilDriver to step back a little, inject some textures into the songs and allow the music to breathe, while still staying true to their sound. A Nostalgic Remembrance



Before Dad bought a summer cottage in Winthrop, Maine, he was on the road playing for county fairs throughout the northeast. An old buddy of his, Chet Nelson traveled the northeastern states during the winter months and networked with the people who organized and produced county fairs. Most of them were Masons as was Chet, and they took care of their own when it came to business.

Back in the early thirties, Dad and Chet traveled the country in Chet's trailer and supplied the music for Lowell Thomas. Thomas was a writer, actor, broadcaster and explorer who traveled the world, filmed his travels and sold his films to the Hollywood studios as short subjects. At the same time, he put tent shows together and traveled the country. Chet was the band leader and Dad was second in command, playing bass and tuba in the show's band as they traveled state to state.

The time was the '40s and Thomas' tent shows were a thing of the past. Chet Nelson was capitalizing on the need for entertainment at county fairs. He and Dad put together an eight to ten piece band (depending on the fair) and played for the acts that were hired to perform at night and play Dixieland music between sulky races during the day.

Most county fairs were a combination of amusement rides, games of chance, 4H displays, midway restaurants, novelty stands with toys, trinkets and ornaments for sale.

Each fairground had a track for horse racing, usually sulky racing which took place during the day. Between races, Chet, Dad and the band played like they all came from New Orleans ... Dixieland at its best. Some of the fairs had a show of police or fire equipment which they demonstrated on the track. A few had dare devil auto shows and they were fun to watch, especially for a kid who was too young to drive (me) but loved cars. Actually, we here in Massachusetts have the oldest of these county fairs in the country. The Topsfield Fair began in 1818 and is still going strong, today.

Most of Chet Nelson's contacts were in New York, with a few in New Jersey and Pennsylvania, and a couple in Ohio, Indiana and Michigan. When it was time to head to a county fair, Dad would pack up his car with his tuba, clothes for the shows and casual wear for his down time. He always took a small charcoal stove an ice chest that could hold cold drinks, burgers, hot dogs and steaks. Mom always made sure that there was a coffee pot to accompany Dad's gas stove which operated on pressurized gasoline. Mom would pack her stuff, my clothes, and anything else she deemed necessary for a family living away from home. If Nanna and Babbononno were along, Mom would help them pack for the trip. Babbononno loved coming along especially when there were acts of entertainment that were from the old country. He could get the latest info on his country of origin, the Italy he would never see again.

We would check into a motel or guest house that Chet Nelson booked in advance for his band members and their families. The first fair was usually the Boonville Fair in Oneida County in upstate New York. The next three were also in the Empire State: Afton, Norwich and Schaghticoke. I don't remember the names of the fairs in the other states but these I remember as if they took place just recently.

The first time Dad played the Boonville Fair, I was on stage with him as the band was setting up. A guy with a cigar stub in his mouth yelled in my direction, "Hey kid, you want to make some money?" His name was Louie and he was the scenery man. After I said, "Sure," he proceeded to teach me how to put up and take down scenery used for the acts of entertainment. He offered me \$35.00 for the week, a fortune to a young kid like me back in the late '40s. From that point on, every fair that Louie worked, I worked, too.

Babbononno had made friends with a circus act called Johnnie Laddie and his Wonder Dogs. Johnnie and his wife were from Foggia, the city that Babbononno was born in and hadn't seen since 1896. Between shows, they would hang out together in the entertainers' tent behind the stage and converse in their own dialect.

Many of the acts of entertainment were from vaudeville in the old days. Most of the rest were from circuses in Europe and a few had worked for Ringling Brothers, especially the high wire acts and the trapeze artists. So, I learned how to manipulate scenery and the correct staging necessary for a complete show.

If the night shows were ever rained out, Dad and Mom would host a barbecue in the entertainers' tent, and after stuffing themselves with enough food and beer, the band would play for the entertainers themselves.

I remember one act in particular, two men that called themselves The Bryants. They did a pantomime act with comical masks and they were funny. One afternoon, both were sitting behind the tent soaking up the sunshine. I noticed something funny; they both had numbers tattooed on their left arms. I later asked Dad the significance and he told me the story of the Nazi concentration camps that existed during WWII, and what the Nazis did to Jewish people, and added in, "Those two guys are survivors.'

I mentioned Schaghticoke earlier. When we arrived at the fair ground, I discovered that Louie, the scenery man, wasn't there. Someone from New York City was in charge of the scenery and seeing I was just a kid and didn't belong to the union, I was out of a job.

Chet Nelson spoke to the front office and they found me a job. I

was to work for a novelty salesman. A man named, Norman, who looked like W.C. Fields, ran the concession. Per chance you played games of chance on the midway and didn't win anything, a looser could purchase a stuffed animal or a Kewpie doll and tell the folks at home that they won it.

Some of the best of times we had were just after the closing of a fair. All of the entertainers would congregate in the tent for a final get together and then say goodbye.

Often, these late night finales would last through the night into the dawn hours before everyone would leave. I remember one final night when Babbononno and Johnnie Laddie said goodbye to each other. It took them over two hours of clinking wine glasses and hugging each other with goodbyes in two languages. Here it is almost 75 years later and both my folk's and grandparent's generations are gone, but those were happy days and I remember them as if they just happened.

Spaghetti alla Nerano is a simple but well-known pasta and zucchini dish. It is said to have originated in the early 1950's from a woman named Maria Grazia who owned a trattoria bearing her name, in the village of Nerrano on the Amalfi Coast of Italy. This much-loved dish was created by combining thin slices of zucchini fried in olive oil (some claim after cooking, these must be refrigerated overnight) with cooked spaghetti, aged provola cheese and butter, along with herbs and spices. As easy as it sounds, many restaurants and home cooks have tried to recreate Grazia's Spaghetti alla Nerano and most claim it has never been as delicious as that infamous dish in Nerano.

In Italy, Italians cook with only the freshest seasonal ingredients they can find. Accordingly, a pasta and zucchini dish was one that my Nonna made in the summer using the zucchini she grew in her garden. She made many dishes from this vegetable and "Spaghetti alla Nerano" was just one that I loved. Using freshly picked zucchini and basil, as well as a good quality cheese is all this dish takes to come out amazing. This is a perfect summertime first course that I hope you enjoy as much as my family always did!

SPAGHETTI alla NERANO Spaghetti with Zucchini

2 pounds small zucchini, cut into thin slices ½ cup olive oil, more if needed 1 pound dry or fresh spaghetti

2-3 garlic cloves, chopped 4 to 6 tablespoons butter

1 to 1 ½ cups freshly grated parmesan cheese or caciocavallo, more if desired (the original recipe calls for Provolone del Monaco, which



is hard to find outside of Italy) Freshly ground black pepper Salt Fresh basil (optional)

In a large sauté pan over medium heat, add enough olive oil to generously coat the bottom of the pan. In batches, add zucchini in single layers and sauté until lightly golden on each side. Once cooked, place zucchini on a paper-towel lined plate or tray to absorb the excess oil, and while hot, generously sprinkle with half of the grated cheese. Repeat until all the zucchinis are cooked, adding oil to pan as needed. Set aside (the original recipe calls for refrigerating overnight. I have found either way works fine)

In a large stockpot, bring 6 quarts of salted water to a boil. Cook spaghetti until al dente, reserving 2 to 3 cups of the pasta water.

While spaghetti is cooking, place 4 tablespoons of butter in a large sauté pan and over low-medium heat, cook garlic until softened. Remove the garlic and discard. Keeping garlic infused butter in pan, over medium-low heat, add cooked zucchini and warm cooked spaghetti, toss together and immediately add the remaining grated cheese, fresh ground black pepper and a small ladle of pasta water. Gently mix, adding more pasta water if needed, until well blended and creamy. Serve immediately with additional grated cheese and basil, if desired.







HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB by Richard Preiss

The first time fans will get a peek at an early version of the 2022-2023 Boston Celtic will come less than two months from now on Sunday, October 2nd when the Green and White take the parquet floor in the TD Garden to meet the Charlotte Hornets.

We don't know what kind of a crowd will be on hand since the contest is set for 1:00 p.m. on an NFL Sunday when there are numerous grid games on television.

However, the earlier time was probably chosen so there would not be a direct conflict with the New England Patriots-Green Bay Packers game, which is set for a 4:25 p.m. kickoff in Wisconsin. Nor will it conflict with the game between the Tom Brady-led Tampa Bay Buccaneers and the Kansas City Chiefs. The gridiron matchup — which will carry a lot of local interest because of Brady — is set for an 8:25 p.m. start that night.

The Red Sox are slated to be on the road that day, facing the Toronto Blue Jays. That game is slated for a 1:35 start, so if you go to the Garden you won't be watching the Sox on the television. But maybe on your cell phone's small screen, perhaps.

Three nights later on October 5th the C's will tip off at the Garden against the Toronto Raptors, in a matchup set for 7:30 p.m. That is the regular start time for a Celtics home game. But in this instance it also manages to avoid a direct conflict with the Red Sox—who will be closing out the regular season with a contest against the Tampa Bay Rays at Fenway Park beginning at 4:10 p.m.

After those two home preseason games, the Celtics hit the road for the second half of the exhibition schedule. They will play at Charlotte on Friday, October 7th at 7:30 p.m., and then return to the Hub for a week of training camp before going north across the border to meet the Raptors in the final preseason contest.

But in a twist the teams will not meet in Toronto. Instead, the game will be played in Montreal. And it goes right to the heart of hockey since the teams will tip off in the Belle Centre — the home of the Montreal Canadiens.

This will be the first appearance of the Raptors in Montreal since 2018. They have played there several times over the past dozen years but this will be the first time since they won the NBA Championship back in 2019.

The neutral site game recalls an earlier era when more NBA and NHL teams barnstormed — playing preseason games in cities that did not have franchises. The broadcast requirements for up-to-date electronics have basically ended the practice for smaller venues but it continues on a limited basis nearly every year.

DONATO GETS A DEAL — It took a good chunk of the summer but former Bruin Ryan Donato recently signed a one-year contract that enables him to return to the Seattle Kraken for the coming season.

The Scituate native had indicated earlier in the year that he wanted to return to Seattle, where he will live forever in franchise history as the player who scored the first goal for the NHL's 32nd franchise last fall during the season opener against the Vegas Golden Knights.

He went on to finish the campaign with a career-high 16 goals to go with 15 assists across 74 regular season games. The reward is an upgrade in salary to \$1.2 million for the 2022-2023 season — about \$100,000 a month for the length of the contract.

"Ryan elevated his game last season and we are happy to have him return to the Kraken," stated Seattle general manager Ron Francis in a press release. "He completed a career year and will hopefully eclipse that in 2022-2023."

Donato, who played for his head coach father Ted (also a former Bruin) at Harvard, said he is diligent about staying in shape throughout the summer. "I don't take much time off," he explained. I build a base throughout the year. I kind of lose it if I don't stay strong. I will get out on the ice. I might take 10 days to two weeks off at the most."

During his college days, Donato played three years for the Crimson, scoring 60 goals and adding 44 assists across 97 games in an era that saw Harvard advance to the 2017 Frozen Four.

In addition, during his final season at Harvard, he was also a member of the 2018 U.S. Olympic Hockey Team that competed in South Korea, scoring a team high five goals in five games.

Shortly after his return, he made his debut in a Bruins uniform late in the regular season. He scored goals in his first two games with the Bruins, much to the approval of the Garden crowd. He finished with nine points in a dozen games and also appeared in three postseason playoff games.

Sometimes dreams begin in one place and continue in other locations

Such would be the case for Donato, who would play for three teams during the 2018-2019 season. He started with Boston, got sent down to Providence and eventually was traded to the Minnesota Wild for Charlie Coyle. He played in 56 games for the Wild, scoring 10 goals and adding 15 assists.

The silver lining came down the road a bit. When Donato played at Providence, the head coach was Jay Leach, now an assistant with Seattle.

Donato found the range for 14 goals and nine assists for Minnesota in 62 games during the 2019-2020 season. He then signed a free agent contract with San Jose for the 2020-2021 campaign where he had 20 points in 50 games for the Sharks.

So, it is a second season in Seattle for Donato. The Kraken will play only one game in Boston—on February 23rd. The Bruins will play in Seattle on January 12th.
